# **Reserve Policy**

October 27, 2021

#### **Purpose**

A key element prudent finical planning is to ensure that sufficient funding is available for current operating, capital, and debt service needs. Additionally, fiscal responsibility requires anticipating the likelihood of, and preparing for, unforeseen events. Casitas Municipal Water District ("District" or "CMWD") will strive to have sufficient funding available to meet its existing operating, capital, and debt service obligations in a manner consistent with its Operating Budget and Capital Spending Plan. The District has established reserves for operational stability and for future capital needs in order to minimize significant rate fluctuations due to unforeseen and unexpected cash flow requirements. Reserves may be designated for specific purposes with minimum balances consistent with statutory obligations. The Reserve Policy is intended to ensure that the District has sufficient funds to meet current and future needs.

#### **General Provisions**

The District maintains the reserves in separate designated accounts within its accounting system in a manner that ensures financial soundness and provides transparency. Maintaining reserves at appropriate levels is a prudent, ongoing business process that consist of regular assessment and application of various funding alternatives. Either alone or in combination with each other these alternatives may include rates, loans and grants, debt financing, investment of funds, and levels of capital expenditures.

The Board of Directors along with the General Manager will be responsible for managing the reserves. The Board must authorize all the expenditures for the reserve funds and approve any reallocation of funds or any transfers among the reserves. The balance of the reserves will be reviewed annually to evaluate the goals and propose of each reserve and make adjustments as necessary.

#### **Definitions**

Restricted Reserves: Restrictions on the use of these funds are imposed by an outside source such as creditors, grantors, contributors, laws or regulations governing use.

Unrestricted Reserves: These funds have no externally imposed use restrictions. The use of unrestricted funds is at the discretion of the Board. Unrestricted funds are designated for a specific purpose, which is determined by the board. The Board has authority to redirect the use of these funds as needs change.

#### **District Specific Reserves**

The District maintains the following reserves:

#### Restricted

#### Bond/Debt Service Reserves:

- 1. Safe Drinking Water Reserve
  - Purpose and use of reserves- Established as a condition of each bond issue. The funds
    are legally protected by bond covenants and can only be used in the event of default by
    the District or to pay down principal and interest. May be used by the Trustee if the
    amounts in the bond fund are insufficient
  - Target Level- The bond reserve requirement is established at the time of a bond issue and can be recalculated as the bonds are paid down.

#### **Unspent Bond Proceeds:**

- 1. CFD 2013-1 Improvement Fund
  - Purpose- Established as a condition of each bond issue. The funds are restricted for use designated in the bond's Official Statement.
  - Use of reserves- May be used as designated in the official statement which include costs incurred to plan, design, engineer, finance, supervise, construct, and install, inspect, and obtain necessary permits for the purchase, construction, improvement, or rehabilitation to property or facilities with in the CFD boundaries

#### Capital Reserves:

- 1. Capital Facilities Reserve
  - Purpose and use of reserves- Funds are used to fund capital projects or the rehabilitation, enhancement or replacement of capital assets as they reach the end of their useful life. Staff recommends capital projects during the annual budget process and as these projects are approved, funds are appropriated from reserve funds or available revenues.
  - Target Level- No specific target level. The District may set aside capital moneys for replacement funds on a project-by-project basis.

#### Unrestricted

#### Operating Reserves:

- 1. Cash Flow Reserve
  - Purpose and use of reserves- This reserve may be routinely utilized by staff to cover temporary cash flow deficiencies caused by timing differences between revenue and expenses, unexpected decreases in revenues and increase in expenses, and to fund improvement capital projects.
  - Target Level –Funding for this reserve fluctuates based on the revenue received from water sales.
- 2. Other Post-Employment Benefits (OPEB)
  - Purpose and use of reserves- Non-pension benefits provided to employees after employment ends and includes health insurance coverage for retirees and their families. The District currently funds OPEB on a pay-as-you-go basis, paying an amount annually equal to the benefits distributed or claimed that year. If necessary funds can be used to pay down the District's obligations.
  - Target Level- No specific target level.

#### **Emergency Reserves:**

#### 1. Storm Damage

- Purpose and use of reserves- This reserve may be used to cover temporary cash flow deficiencies related to maintenance and repair activities at the Robles facility.
- Target Level- No specific target level.

#### 2. Variation in Water Sales

- Purpose and use of reserves- This reserve may be utilized to cover temporary cash flow deficiencies caused by reduction in water sales.
- Target Level- No specific target level.

#### Capital Reserves:

#### 1. Capital Improvements

- Purpose and use of reserves- Funds are used to make improvements to existing
  infrastructure. Staff recommends improvement projects during the annual budget
  process and as these projects are approved, funds are appropriated from reserve funds
  or available revenues.
- Target Level- No specific target level. The District may set aside capital moneys for replacement funds on a project-by-project basis.

#### 2. Alternate Water Supply Study

- Purpose and use of reserves- This reserve may be used for costs associated with alternate water supply development and acquisition.
- Target Level- No specific target level.

#### 3. Conservation Penalty

- Purpose and use of reserves- Established to accumulate funds received from customers for penalties associated with consumption. This reserve may be utilized to cover costs associated with conservation activities and water supply development and acquisition.
- Target Level- Funding for this reserve fluctuates based on the revenue received from conservation penalties.



# Reserve Fund Policy August 5, 2009

#### 1. PURPOSE

Prudent financial planning and fiscal responsibility includes anticipating and preparing for future funding requirements as well as unforeseen and unexpected emergencies disasters, and other events. Casitas Municipal Water District (District) has established reserve funds for its long term organizational and operational stability and the reserve funds enable the District to minimize significant rate fluctuations due to unforeseen and unexpected cash flow requirements. This Reserve Fund Policy is to ensure that the District accumulates, manages, maintains and uses certain financial resources only for specified purposes.

# 2. TYPES OF RESERVE RUNDS

The District maintains two types of reserve funds:

- a. <u>Restricted Reserves</u>. Restricted reserves are reserves that are restricted by an outside source, such as by statute, court order, or contact.
- b. <u>Designated Reserves</u>. Designated reserves are reserves that are established and set aside to be used only for a specific, designated purpose.

#### 3. SPECIFIC RESERVE FUNDS

The District maintains the following reserve funds:

- a. <u>Debt Service Reserve</u>. The Debt Service Reserve is a restricted reserve that is governed by legal bond covenants and is to be used if the District is unable to meet the required debt service obligation. The bond covenants require that Debt Service Reserve be maintained at a level sufficient to fund the maximum annual debt service payments.
  - i. Mira Monte Fund Restricted Fund
  - ii. Debit Service Fund Restricted Fund
  - iii. Safe Drinking Water Fund Restricted Fund
- b. <u>Emergency Reserve</u>. The Emergency Reserve is to be used only to cover cash flow shortages caused by an unexpected event, such as a natural disaster, water shortage situation, or other unforeseen expense.
  - i. Storm Damage Fund Un-restricted, Designated Fund
  - ii. Variation in Water Sales Fund Un-restricted, Designated Fund

- c. <u>Operating Reserve</u>. The Operating Reserve is a designated reserve to be used only to cover cash flow shortages caused by a short-term, unexpected disruption of anticipated revenue or when expenses become due before the anticipated revenue to pay expenses received.
  - i. Cash Flow Fund Un-restricted, Designated Fund
- d. <u>Capital Reserve</u>. The Capital Reserve is a designated reserve to be used to fund the capital improvement program and for unforeseen capital projects that are necessary to meet regulatory requirements, system reliability, and future needs.
  - i. Capital Facilities Fund Restricted Fund
  - ii. Flexible Storage Fund Un-restricted, Designated Fund
  - iii. Capital Improvement Fund Un-restricted, Designated Fund

# 4. MANAGEMENT OF RESERVE FUNDS

The Board of Directors and General Manager will be responsible for managing the reserve funds. The Board must authorize all expenditures for the District's reserve funds. The Board will review annually the balance of the reserve funds, work collaboratively with the General Manager and Accounting Manager to designate unrestricted reserves and evaluate the goals and purposes of each reserve fund.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

 Award the contract for the Heidelberger Tank Retaining Wall (Specification No. IFB178) submitted through the Sourcewell ezIQC process to MDJ Management in the amount of \$68,059.30.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The District acquired the Heidelberger Tank from Golden State Water Company in July 2017. The Ojai Water System Master Plan targeted the Heidelberger Tank site for erosion control measures which will be addressed by this proposed work. This facility has actively eroding slopes from the hillside above onto the site; the tank requires protection to prevent damage and operational issues. The proposed work provides erosion protection and allows debris diversion measures.

Casitas is a member of Sourcewell, a public agency dedicated to serving education and government entities with solutions which are more efficiently delivered cooperatively than by an entity individually. This includes, but is not limited to, the bidding of public construction contracts and purchasing.

Casitas, through Sourcewell, advertised and noticed a bid for an indefinite quantity construction (IQC) for the project. The work tasks in the IQC agreement are bid at unit costs. This contract is administered by the Gordian Group (Gordian) on behalf of Sourcewell. Gordian created ezIQC to make its industry-leading Job Order Contracting (JOC) Solutions easily available through cooperative purchasing. JOC is an indefinite delivery/indefinite quantity procurement process that helps facility and infrastructure owners complete a large number of repair, renovation and straightforward new construction projects with a single, competitively-bid contract. Unlike traditional bidding where each project is identified, designed and then put out to bid, ezIQC establishes competitively-bid prices up front and eliminates the need to bid each project separately. The ezIQC process will expedite the completion of the building improvements by reducing the time necessary to bid the project. The ezIQC process also saves Casitas money by reducing the staff time necessary during the bidding process.

The bidding process used by Sourcewell for the IQC agreement meets the requirements of Public Contract Code Section 20642. California Public Contract Code Section 20644 allows the Board to approve this type of procurement.

MDJ Management, a licensed Class B contractor, submitted the lowest pricing for this project through Gordian's ezIQC program.

#### **BUDGET IMPACT:**

The fiscal year (FY) 2021-22 budget includes \$150,000 from CFD 2013-1 for the Heidelberger Tank and Pump Plant Retaining Walls.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

 Determine all bidders on pipeline projects undertaken by the District in 2022 must be pre-qualified prior to submitting bids.

#### **BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:**

In 1999 the California State Legislature passed Assembly Bill 574 authorizing cities, counties, and special districts the ability to pre-qualify construction contractors for specific projects or for a specific duration. Public Contracts Code Section 21101 codifies the requirements for contractor prequalification and the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) prepared model forms for use by public agencies in the solicitation of pre-qualified contractors.

The District pre-qualified nine pipeline contractors in 2019, 2020, and 2021 and has awarded several projects in the Casitas and Ojai Water Systems. The District has several pipeline projects in design and expects to release these for bidding in the first quarter of 2022. Pre-qualification gives the District and the public a high level of confidence in the quality of work and its successful completion.

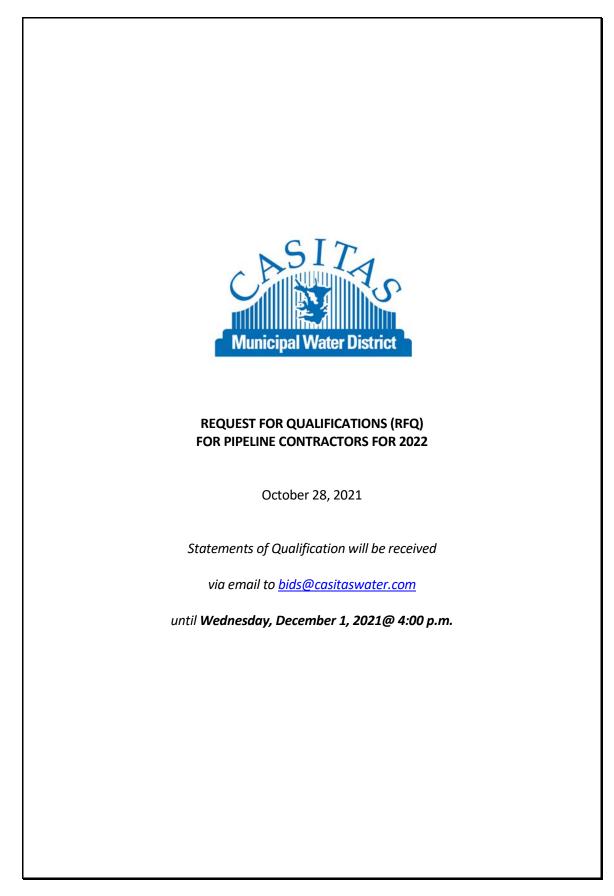

## ANNOUNCEMENT OF PRE-QUALIFICATION PROCEDURES AND OPEN DATE FOR ANNUAL PRE-QUALIFICATION

Notice is hereby given that on **October 27, 2021**, Casitas Municipal Water District (Casitas or District) determined all bidders on public works pipeline projects to be undertaken by the District in calendar year 2022 must be pre-qualified prior to submitting bids. All Licensed Contractors who intend to submit bids for pipeline construction projects must fully complete the pre-qualification questionnaire, provide all materials requested herein, and be approved by the District to be on the final Bidders list. No bid will be accepted from a Contractor who has failed to comply with these requirements. If two or more business entities submit a bid on a project as a Joint Venture, or expect to submit a bid as part of a Joint Venture, each entity within the Joint Venture must be separately qualified to bid.

An optional pre-qualification meeting will be held via Google Meet on **Thursday, November 4, 2021 at 10:00 a.m.** To request web link and/or call-in information, send a request to Julia Aranda, PE, Engineering Manager, at jaranda@casitaswater.com. Questions regarding this RFQ must be submitted in writing no later than **Friday, November 12, 2021 at 4:00 p.m.** 

Contractors who submit a complete pre-qualification package will be notified by email of their qualification status, such notice to be sent no later than sixty business days after submission of the information.

Answers to questions contained in the attached questionnaire, information about current bonding capacity on an aggregate and per project limit, notarized statement from surety, and the most recent reviewed or audited financial statements, with accompanying notes and supplemental information, are required. Casitas will use these documents as the basis of rating Contractors in respect to the size and scope of contracts upon which each Contractor is qualified to bid. Casitas reserves the right to check other sources available. Casitas' decision will be based on objective evaluation criteria.

Pre-qualification approval will remain valid for one (1) calendar year from the date of notice of qualification, except that Casitas reserves the right during that calendar year to adjust, increase, limit, suspend or rescind the pre-qualification ratings based on subsequently learned information and after giving notice of the proposed action to the Contractor and an opportunity for a hearing consistent with the hearing procedures described below for appealing a pre-qualification determination.

While it is the intent of the pre-qualification questionnaire and documents required therewith to assist Casitas in determining bidder responsibility prior to the submission of bids and to aid Casitas in selecting the lowest responsible bidder, neither the fact of pre-qualification, nor any pre-qualification rating, will preclude Casitas from a post-bid consideration and determination on a specific project of whether a bidder has the quality, fitness, capacity, and experience to satisfactorily perform the proposed work, and has demonstrated the requisite trustworthiness. Contractors are encouraged to submit pre-qualification packages no later than **Wednesday**, **December 1**, **2021**, so they may be notified of pre-qualification status well in advance of upcoming projects.

The pre-qualification packages (questionnaire answers and financial statements) submitted by Contractors are <u>not</u> public records and are not open to public inspection. All information provided will be kept confidential to the extent permitted by law, although the contents may be disclosed to third parties for the

purpose of verification, investigation of substantial allegations, and in the process of an appeal hearing. State law requires the names of contractors applying for pre-qualification status shall be public records subject to disclosure, and the first page of the questionnaire will be used for that purpose.

Each questionnaire must be signed under penalty of perjury in the manner designated at the end of the form, by an individual who has the legal authority to bind the Contractor on whose behalf that person is signing. If any information provided by a Contractor becomes inaccurate, the Contractor must immediately notify Casitas and provide updated accurate information in writing, under penalty of perjury.

Casitas reserves the right to waive minor irregularities and omissions in the information contained in the pre-qualification application submitted, to make all final determinations, and to determine at any time the pre-qualification procedures will not be applied to a future public works project.

A Contractor who has submitted a completed application form, and who receives a rating of "not qualified" from Casitas may appeal that determination. There is no appeal from a finding that a Contractor is not prequalified because of a failure to submit required information, but re-application during one of the designated time periods is permitted. A Contractor may appeal Casitas' decision with respect to its request for pre-qualification, and request a hearing, by giving notice to Casitas no later than ten business days after receipt of notice of its qualification status. Unless a Contractor files a timely appeal, the Contractor waives any and all rights to challenge the qualification decision of Casitas, whether by administrative process, judicial process or any other legal process or proceeding.

If the Contractor gives the required notice of appeal and requests a hearing, the hearing shall be conducted so that it is concluded no later than ten business days after Casitas' receipt of its Notice of Appeal. The hearing so provided shall be an informal process conducted by a panel to whom the Board of Directors of Casitas has delegated responsibility to hear such appeals (the "Appeals Panel"). At or prior to the hearing, the Contractor will be advised of the basis for Casitas' pre-qualification determination. The Contractor will be given the opportunity to present information and present reasons in opposition to the pre-qualification determination. At the conclusion of the hearing or no later than one day after completion of the hearing, the Appeals Panel will render its decision. The date for submission and opening of bids for a specific project will not be delayed or postponed to allow for completion of an appeal process.

A Contractor may be found not pre-qualified for bidding on a specific public works contract to be let by Casitas, or on all contracts to be let by Casitas until the Contractor meets Casitas' requirements. In addition, a Contractor may be found not pre-qualified for either: (1) Omission of requested information or (2) Falsification of information.



To contractors who are using subcontractors, please be advised Casitas **may** require, as to the qualification of subcontractors in the following crafts or trades, following acceptance of your bid, but before the award is made:

- Hot-tapping
- Pipe bursting
- Horizontal directional drilling
- Bore-and-jack construction
- Asphalt paving
- Traffic control



#### 1. INTRODUCTION

Casitas Municipal Water District (Casitas or District) is requesting Statements of Qualifications (SOQ) from construction contractors to perform pipeline construction for calendar year 2022.

Casitas is a Municipal Water District established in 1952, providing potable water to Western Ventura County including approximately 6,000 agricultural, commercial, and residential customers. The District boundaries (Exhibit A) encompass the City of Ojai, Upper Ojai, the Ventura River Valley area, the City of Ventura (west of Mills Road), and the beach communities of Solimar, La Conchita, and Rincon.

Casitas operates the Robles Diversion Facility, Robles Canal, Lake Casitas, Casitas Dam (owned by the US Bureau of Reclamation), Lake Casitas Recreation Area, Casitas Water Treatment Plant, as well as 14 steel tanks totaling 30 million gallons of storage, nine pump stations, and approximately 160 miles of pipelines.

Casitas acquired the Ojai Water System in 2017, which obtains its water supplies from local wells in the Ojai Valley Basin and from Casitas, and serves approximately 2,800 customers. The Ojai Water System includes 32 miles of pipelines, five tanks totaling 1.544 million gallons of storage, five booster pump stations, five active groundwater wells, and an iron and manganese treatment facility.

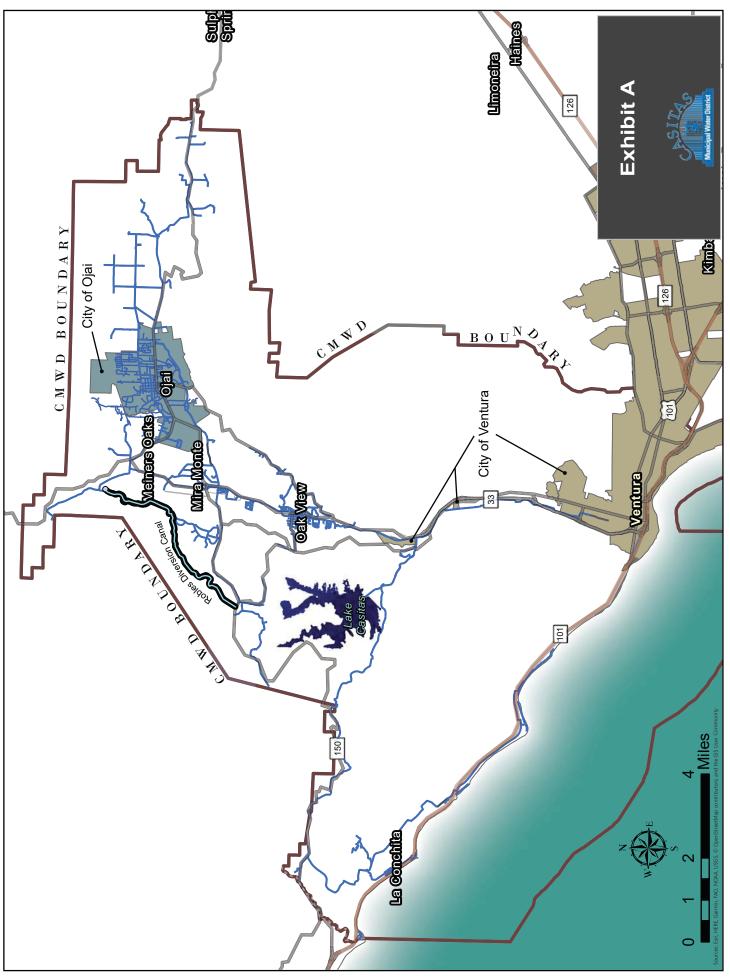
The District intends to pre-qualify Contractors, with subcontractor support as needed, to support the implementation of pipeline construction projects in the Casitas Water System and the Ojai Water System. Pipelines may be installed using open-cut trenching, pipe bursting, horizontal directional drilling, and/or bore-and-jack construction methods. Encroachment permits and paving standards may be required from the City of Ojai, County of Ventura, and/or Caltrans.

An optional pre-qualification meeting will be held via conference call on **Thursday, November 4, 2021 at 10:00 a.m.** To request conference call information, send a request to Julia Aranda, PE, Engineering Manager, at jaranda@casitaswater.com. Questions regarding this RFQ must be submitted in writing no later than **Friday, November 12, 2021 at 4:00 p.m.** 

Prequalification packages will be accepted until **Wednesday**, **December 1**, **2021 at 4:00 p.m**. *via email to bids@casitaswater.com*. No prequalification packages will be accepted after this date and time. It is the Contractor's responsibility to ensure the prequalification package are received prior to the deadline.

There will be no formal opening of the received prequalification packages. This solicitation does not commit the District to award any work nor to pay any costs incurred from the preparation of prequalification packages. Firms responding to this RFQ are solely responsible for all costs and expenses incurred during the prequalification process.

The District may have need for emergency services for Pipeline Contractors to respond to leaks and breaks on short notice. Please provide your rate schedule for labor and equipment for 2022. The rate schedule shall be used for time and materials work performed on an emergency basis. Contractors must be able to respond within two hours for emergency work.





## PREQUALIFICATION QUESTIONNAIRE INSTRUCTIONS

Accurately and completely fill in and answer all questions in the Contact Information Sheet, Parts I, II, and III. Inaccurate and incomplete responses may be grounds for disqualification.

Contractors must receive a passing score in each of the three categories to be considered prequalified.

For Part III, the District will interview two project owners, randomly selected from information provided in Part III. During these interviews, the project owners will be asked a series of questions regarding the management of the project, adherence to schedule, claims by the Contractor, claims against the Contractor, and the quality of the work.

Scoring of each question is based upon criteria established in advance. After this package is approved for distribution, the District cannot influence how questions are scored.

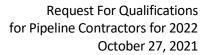

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

#### **BACKGROUND:**

In March 2021, the Board of Directors awarded design of the Santa Barbara Counties Intertie Project (Intertie), which includes approximately 8,200 fee of 16-inch pipeline and two booster pump stations to connect the Carpinteria Valley Water District (CVWD) and Casitas systems. The Board received a presentation of the estimated project costs at their regular meeting on March 24, 2021.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

In order to receive water at the Intertie, the water must be conveyed through a network of existing infrastructure that is owned or managed by various agencies, including:

- California Department of Water Resources
- Central Coast Water Authority
- United State Bureau of Reclamation/Cachuma Operation and Maintenance Board
- Carpinteria Valley Water District
- City of Santa Barbara
- County of Santa Barbara

Staff has prepared the attached proposed draft term sheet to outline a proposed structure of agreements for delivery of water. The draft proposal works within the structure of existing agreements among the water agencies in Santa Barbara County, and attempts to streamline the process by minimizing the number of new agreements required. Staff has reviewed the proposed draft term sheet with the Finance Committee and it was recommended that it be passed on to the Board for Directors for discussion.

Staff will also provide an update on meetings and discussions with the Central Coast Water Authority and Cachuma Project Member Units.

### Proposed Term Sheet for Delivery of State Water via CCWA/CVWD to Casitas MWD System

#### Background:

Casitas Municipal Water District (Casitas) holds agreements for up to 5,000 AFY (Table A) from the State Water Project. Casitas is designing a 16-inch, 1.3 mile pipeline that would connect to Carpinteria Valley Water District and provide local infrastructure necessary for delivery of imported water. The imported water would be routed into Casitas' service area for delivery throughout the entirety of Casitas' system. The connection will provide bi-directional flows and will serve as a regional emergency connection.

#### Proposal:

Casitas is proposing the following preliminary terms for delivery of State Water.

- Casitas will use excess capacity in the water treatment and delivery system managed by water agencies in Santa Barbara County (CCWA facilities, USBR facilities, City of Santa Barbara facilities, and Carpinteria Valley Water District facilities). Water agencies in Santa Barbara County will continue to have first priority use of capacity as per their current arrangement.
- The amount of water to be delivered will be evaluated each year based on DWR allocations, available capacity in the system, need for delivery, and funding.
- Casitas and CCWA will request authorization from DWR for a multi-year transfer of Casitas' Table
   A water to CCWA under the approved State Water Contract Water Management Amendments.
  - o \_\_\_% of the water will be distributed to CCWA for use by water purveyors in Santa Barbara County.
  - \_\_% remaining will be distributed to Carpinteria Valley Water District for sole purposes of delivery to Casitas.
- Casitas will pay CCWA:
  - Variable Costs: All DWR and CCWA variable costs incurred to deliver water to the terminus of CCWA's authorized deliveries, including costs associated with CCWA's Warren Act Contract for conveying water through the Cachuma Project.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Provide direction to staff as appropriate.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Casitas MWD last made an adjustment to its Division Boundaries in 2012, subsequent to the 2010 Federal Census.

2020 Federal Census data became available on September 30, 2021 and several local public agencies are in the process of review of the political boundaries of their respective elected officials.

#### **DISCUSSSION:**

Through the GIS Department and use of the recently-released 2020 Federal Census data, Casitas Staff has been able to ascertain a rough estimate of the populations of each of the five Elective Divisions of Casitas' Board of Directors:

District 1: 12,289 District 2: 11,802 District 3: 12,462 District 4: 13,587 District 5: 11,677

It's possible with further refinement and study that Casitas' Staff could provide the necessary information for the Board to make a decision on redistricting (as was done in 2012) but other data analysis and current legal requirements of the process could be outside staff's capabilities.

PSM Martinez said he would confirm there is language regarding potential onshore use (in the even the barge is no longer functioning on water) to allow the maximum use of the solar investment.

Director Kaiser requested clearance from Casitas water quality staff.

Director Kaiser and Director Brennan recommended the item be moved to the Board agenda.

#### 4. Review of the August 2021 Recreation Report

PSM Martinez reviewed the report with the Committee, noting the decrease in visitors compared with last year the new rock sign at the event area, new lighting installations, rehabilitation of the Lazy River in preparation for next year, postponement of the Nest Fest event, and slight decrease in revenue compared with last year. PSM Martinez also noted that full hookup sites continue to be sold out on weekends, but tent camping sites have openings.

Director Hajas thought it best to leave the leave-behind portion of the term sheet blank for now until the costs are better known to the Board of Directors. He also indicated that a term longer than ten years should be applied to the agreement.

The Committee asked that the term sheet be forwarded to the Board of Directors absent the percentage of 'leave-behind' water for their consideration.

#### 7. Review of the Financial Statements for June, July, and August 2021

CFO Brown made comments regarding the statements including revenues, expenses, and the budgeted costs of the Human Resources Department that was created this year.

Director Hajas asked questions/made comments regarding the net loss or gain and asked that a profit/loss statement for operations be included in future reports (less capital costs).

#### 8. Review of the Consumption Report for June, July, and August 2021.

GM Flood covered the report with the Committee.

Director Hajas noted that current demands are well below the recently-defined Planned Demand for Lake Casitas.

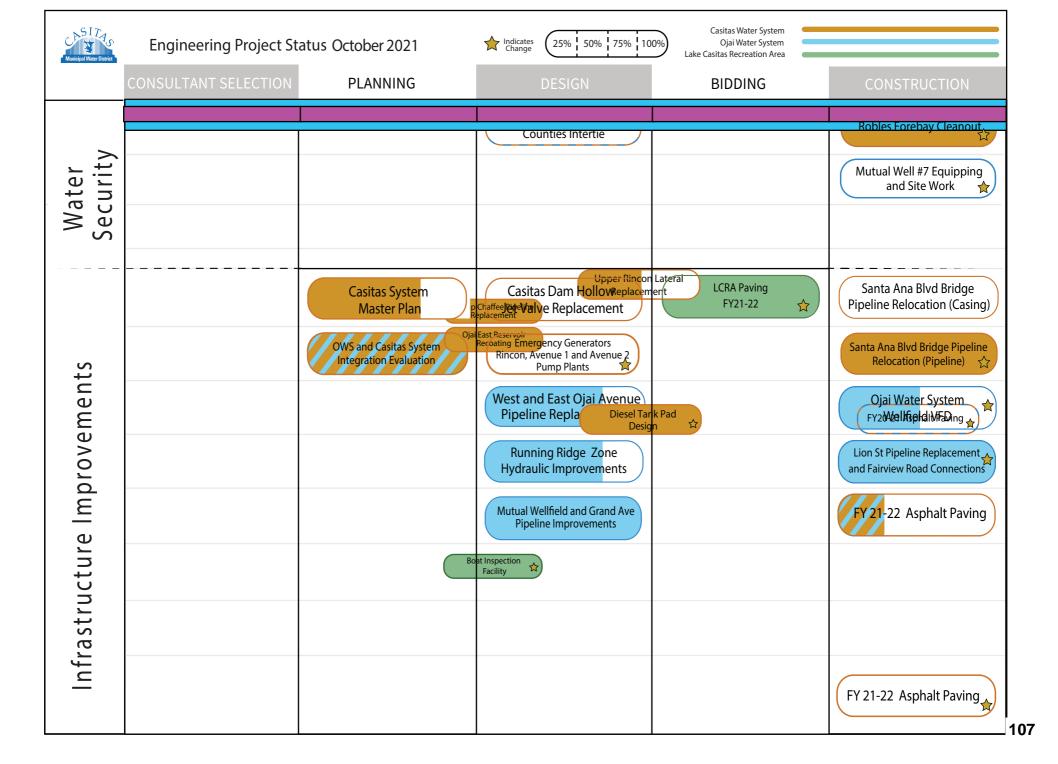
