Minutes of the Casitas Municipal Water District Board Meeting Held June 27, 2012

A meeting of the Board of Directors was held June 27, 2012 at Casitas' Office, Oak View, California. Directors Baggerly, Word, Hicks, Bergen and Kaiser were present. Also present were Steve Wickstrum, General Manager, Rebekah Vieira, Clerk of the Board, and Attorney, John Mathews. There were two staff members and 13 members of the public in attendance. President Baggerly led the group in the flag salute.

1. Public Comments

Bob Daddi a local insurance agent and Director of Ojai Flow addressed the board and mentioned an e-mail he received at 2:10 today. The sender had just called Casitas after receiving a large bill. Chelbi told them to contact Ojai Flow. I get these 3 – 5 times a day. How about an update? We have received data from the PUC and we got crushed as consumers. 21.7 percent was asked for. Our rate increase will be 400% higher than the rate increase you are proposing. President Baggerly informed Mr. Daddi that we would call him back when we discuss the rate issue and that we needed to call on Jim Finch as he asked to be heard early.

Jim Finch apologized for going out of order. I commend the board on holding the costs to where they have been. I support you entirely for this increase. You have done a good job in this. I am not wild with the next one as it is predictive. I hope you keep up the cost consciousness of it. Water is the lifeblood of Ag. We have to have reasonable water. Thank you.

2. General Manager comments.

Director Hicks expressed his appreciation on his visit to the Water Adventure and gave compliments to Aaron and Carol and all the staff. The water is crystal clear. The park was loaded with people and the water was clear. It is well run and the kids were real professional. They are doing a good job.

4. Consent Agenda

ADOPTED

a. Minutes of the June 13, 2012 Board Meeting.

On the motion of Director Word, seconded by Director Bergen and passed, the Consent Agenda was adopted.

5. Bills APPROVED

Director Kaiser questioned the multiple UPS systems that were purchased wanted to make sure there was not a duplication of billing. Mr. Wickstrum explained that we have been replacing quite a few power supplies and it is not duplication.

Director Hicks questioned #00202 for \$8,426 for a leak. Mr. Wickstrum explained this was a leak on the Matilija conduit on Grand Avenue. It is an old abandoned service lateral from 1949 and corrosion occurred. We worked with a contractor on a Saturday to find it. This summer we are replacing some of the valves.

On the motion of Director Hicks, seconded by Director Kaiser and passed, the bills were approved.

On the motion of Director Hicks, seconded by Director Bergen and passed, the Committee/Manager Reports were approved for filing.

7. Public Hearing for the adoption of rate changes per Proposition 218.

Written protests must be received by Casitas prior to the close of the public hearing. Adoption of the following resolution cannot occur if there is a majority protest against the rate increases.

The President of the Board may restrict the length of time to three minutes to address the Board.

a. Public Hearing

President Baggerly stated this is the time and place for a public hearing to consider input regarding the Proposition 218 hearing on revision of water rates. He asked the Clerk of the Board to inform the board of the total number of people who called or submitted communications regarding the hearing. The clerk explained that 84 protest ballots were received.

President Baggerly opened the public hearing at 3:09 p.m.

Dale Wharton resident of Oak View stated he was caught off guard by this as he has been on vacation. What I understand from other information, I believe that we are solvent as it is. I don't see the reason why we need this increase. I don't think the increase is necessary. The water company is doing well. There is not a reason for it at this time.

President Baggerly explained that we have not had an increase since 2008. I think everyone can understand that costs are not what they were in 2008. On top of that we have a new negotiated agreement with our union. There is an outstanding \$3 million dollar bill with the Bureau of Reclamation for seismic dam retrofit that took place ten years ago. We came up with a 3 % increase on commodity and 6% on service charge to pay these bills. The service charges are designed to pay for our fixed costs. Commodity charges help pay for operations and maintenance and other things in the general fund.

Director Bergen added the fixed cost is for infrastructure such as the dam and pipes. Meter charges are to run that part of the system. 6% increase on meter is to pay that \$3 million dollars owed to the Bureau of Reclamation. Water charges are more in terms of inflation and making the water side of things balance. We split it in two years to make it easier on people. The alternative is to have 6% now. The Bureau has just now given up the proper accounting for us to pay the bill.

Mr. Wharton said I think you should have been more aware. I know the board spent a lot of money to go to conventions. I think savings could be made where you are sitting. Particularly the last gentlemen and a going away present for him. I can't give you a name. Director Kaiser added you might be confusing water districts. Mr. Wharton added I want to voice that I don't want to accept an increase like this.

President Baggerly added raising rates is not something we like to do. We do it because we have bills to pay. It has to be paid. We have very competitive water rates in the state of California. Mr. Wharton added I believe you sent some board members to a conference. President Baggerly explained it is the Association of California Water Agencies that has been in existence for over 100 years and almost all water districts are members. They provide a continuing education program on water. We learn things at these conferences that we would not normally learn on our own. What we bring back has produced cost savings.

Director Word added many of these issues are discussed during the Finance Committee and you are welcome to attend. They are workshop sessions. We talked about the bills and the \$8,000 to repair a line on Matilija Conduit. We have to plan out some replacements on an aging infrastructure. We try to plan things out each year. We have been able to hold off rate increases for four years.

Mr. Wharton then asked can't we hold the meetings later in the evening? Director Hicks replied I have been on the board 21 years. We have tried it both ways. It makes zero difference on the attendance.

Tony Kack, resident of Oak View asked do you know the average pumping cost per acre foot. Do you know what the pump efficiencies are? Mr. Wickstrum replied yes we do. I can't tell you what it is as we have nine or ten

pump plants. We have those documented very well. Mr. Kack asked do you have and vfd's? Mr. Wickstrum explained we have one installed at Rincon. It does not make sense in all cases. Mr. Kack added I think Edison gives rebates on that. I am wondering what cost cutting measure you accomplished before you decided this. Mr. Wickstrum explained cost cutting is done regularly. We pump during the late night into the morning to get a better rate for that. We have had a long implementation to keep your water rates low. Mr. Kack asked did you do a rate study. Mr. Wickstrum responded it was done in 2008 and it recommended three to five years of further rate increases each year after that. We did not want to do that and we decided not to do that until this year when we saw a deficit we need to take care of. Mr. Kack asked how much did the consultant cost to get the rate study. Is it possible to do that in house? Director Hicks explained we like to have an impartial third party do that. President Baggerly asked if he has comments on the rate increase. Mr. Kack suggested spend less over here so you can meet expenses over there. President Baggerly said we have done that for four years. That is our point. President Baggerly asked if you put in a protest letter. If not you can give us a piece of paper with your name, signature and APN number on it so it can be counted. Mr. Kack added I understand the recreation area finances are separate and they are operating at a loss. President Baggerly explained the figures that are in the annual audit show there are brackets around the numbers for recreation. The reason it looks like a loss is the administrative overhead causes it to look like a loss. Those are charged to recreation from the water district.

Bob Daddi stated if our increase was 3% I wouldn't be here. Keeping up with inflation is something that does not work. I commend you on going four years without a rate increase. I would rather have 2 – 3 percent forever instead of 21 percent that we have as your neighbors. People are getting huge increases, not people with farms, people with small lots getting \$300 bills every couple of months. You are about a third of what we pay in Ojai. I suggest you switch from the current to the future and get ahead of the curve. President Baggerly added we try to cut it as close as we can so it is not hurtful.

Dwayne Boccalli spoke against raising rates. It makes it hard on farmers that only use Casitas water. It is difficult even with a small rate increase. You sent the forms for people to protest. I realize the way it is worded you count every meter in the district and only the people that sent the protest in. That is not the way elections work. Don't count 10,000 people and those that don't count don't vote. President Baggerly explained this is mandated by state law. Mr. Bocalli added when they did the huge increase before, I have had people tell me they didn't need to do that. Have the nerve to stand up against that law. Government agencies have gone wrong. You are here to take care of us. Casitas was created for the water users. Representatives from Casitas came to me and suggested that I plant trees and use your water. In my senior years all the rules are changed. Don't feel you need to do that and not raise the rates. Don't think it is fair to charge us equal with household user. I have a bunch of meters. I have a place in Ventura and rates are high there and they don't

compare to what the ranch needs. If you want to see green take care of us. We need help.

Joel Anderson from the Ojai View stated I submitted a request for information on June 6th and have not got a response on this. I would like to know the following:

- 1. Total itemized cost CMWD spent 2010 and 2011 on all Casitas board of director's health, life, dental insurance, expenses, mileage, travel, dues memberships etc.
- 2. How much money is CMWD paying the state to purchase water from the state?
 - 3. How years has CMWD been paying the State for water?
- 4. For each year CMWD has paid how much, each annual amount for water from the State of California.
 - 5. What is total money paid to the State for water over the years?
 - 6. Why haven't you received the water you paid for?
 - 7. How much of this water has Casitas not used or resold to others?

Director Word explained that we have no choice on state water. That was voted on by the people. We do not have a way to take it. President Baggerly added in 1998 it was \$100 million to take it from Castaic.

It was determined that the District was not aware of Mr. Anderson's request for information. He supplied his request and Mr. Mathews asked for and Mr. Anderson agreed to a ten day time frame for response to the request.

President Baggerly asked if there were any additional written protests? Seeing there were none, he closed the public hearing at 3:45 p.m. and stated there are not enough written protests therefore there is not a majority protest.

8. Public Hearing for the adoption of the 2012-2013 Budget.

a. Public Hearing

President Baggerly stated this is the time and place for a public hearing to consider input regarding the proposed Fiscal Year 2012-2013 Budget. He asked the Clerk of the Board to provide the names of the public who called or submitted communications regarding the proposed budget. Ms. Vieira stated Larry Yuva provided communication.

President Baggerly then asked for the General Manager's report. Mr. Wickstrum explained that each year we sit down with staff and begin a detailed analysis on what we are spending and what we can cut. We enter into the budget phase at mid-January. There have been several items staff brought forward as cost savers and things that will not defer the maintenance in the project. After 50 years we need to focus on the maintenance of this district and will continue to do so. This is a large project. It takes money to keep this ready and waiting for our customers when they demand our water supply. We are on the verge of signing the agreement on the Safety of Dams with the Bureau. We hope to have that in place by the end of this calendar year. Last week we signed the check on the M & I and interest bearing portion. I am happy to get that concluded so costs do not rise on this district.

President Baggerly added this is a new era with the signing of the recreation contract and potential funding to help with deficit, operations costs and infrastructure. Director Kaiser added this is unprecedented. Mr. Wickstrum added for this district it is. For other areas they have helped fund in other areas but for this district it is a new time of cooperation and we as a community in the Ventura River watershed need to embrace and develop the cooperation.

Mr. Wickstrum added we have the lowest residential water rates in this area. We work hard to get our cost of service in line with our expenditures. We had a work shop on May 7th with Board of Directors. No public was here at that time to participate. It was an open meeting. We are now ready to bring the budget forward for approval.

President Baggerly opened the public hearing at 3:52 p.m. and since there were no comments from the public he closed the public hearing at 3:53 p.m.

Director Bergen added the Finance Committee went over the budget very carefully and the board looked over it carefully and it is a good budget. Director Kaiser commended staff for their deliberative process. The budget before us that is bottom line. We are operating efficiently for the last several years. This is a meager adjustment. We could look at inflationary increases in the future.

3. **Board/Management comments**.

Director Word noted the article in today's Ventura Star regarding the zip-line ride as an attraction to a Santa Paula park.

GM Wickstrum shared with the Committee a letter from the Rotary Club of Ojai West expressing gratitude for the assistance provided by Assistant Park Service Officer Mitch Tull. APSO Tull provided a nature tour of Lake Casitas to a 4th grade class from Topa Topa Elementary School when a docent was not available for the Rotary Club boat tour.

Director Word asked that a staff person be available for the AWA event as a tour boat docent. PSM Belser will make the arrangements for staff.

PSM Belser reported that PSO Doan is conducting a survey on boating insurance with current boating customers.

4. <u>Discussion regarding alterations to the Boat Rental building.</u>

Mr. Wolfe presented his initial plot and floor plans for the replacement of the Boat Rental building. The new building will be adjacent to the Café building, one-story with a similar size to the existing building, a slight change in building orientation on the same location, and providing a better work area for Mr. Wolfe's staff. Mr. Wolfe was advised to work with PSM Belser to coordinate Bureau of Reclamation interactions. Mr. Wolfe expressed that he would like to have construction complete by end of Winter 2013.

5. Report on concessions progress.

PSM Belser stated that the three new concessions are in full effect. The park store services have greatly improved and have a good selection of products. The

Committee reviewed café menus and suggested developing an anchor meal, much like the Jalama burger at Jalama Beach. The dinner menu was very good and several meals that could possibly be the anchor meal. Mr. Wolfe expressed that prices are comparable with many local eating establishments in Oak View and Mira Monte. The Committee expressed appreciation for the effort and service by all concessionaires.

Lewis Berbari asked the Committee to permit the placement of a trailer at the park store. The trailer would house his father who is working at the park store. While the request was heard, no action could be taken by the Committee. PSM Belser has told Mr. Berbari twice that special live-in will not permitted.

The Committee discussed further the zip line idea that was featured in the Ventura Star. This recreational activity may be considered at Lake Casitas. Staff will investigate further. Mr. Berbari expressed interest in the activity.

Director Baggerly updated the Committee on the status of the San Antonio Creek Spreading Grounds project. It appears that the project has resolved water rights and environmental permitting and is ready for bidding. There is some concern that the engineer's estimate is greater than the grant funding, and that there is hope that the actual bid is less than the engineer's estimate. The project sponsors may have to look for additional funding or cut parts of the project. The General Manager is to review the terms of the contract.

The Committee discussed protocol for requests by others to endorse their cause. The General Manager will address the request and use judgment on forwarding an endorsement to the Board.

The General Manager reported on the following topics:

- a. CSDA report that the Governor had signed the budget and protected pass through funding (\$250M).
- b. Fisheries staff completed the quagga mussel survey on June 27, 2012, in the area of the Santa Ana launch ramp. No quagga or zebra mussels were found during the survey. The Directors stated that they wanted to express appreciation and recognition in some manner to those staff members that have been vigilant in protecting Lake Casitas over the past four years.
- c. The Department of Fish and Game performed an O. mykiss rescue from the Robles weir pools on June 28, 2012. Jordan Switzer, Fisheries Technician, observed the rescue efforts on behalf of the District. Nine O. mykiss were relocated from the weir pools.

4. <u>Update on Villanova Main Hit.</u>

The General Manager provided the Committee with a status update on the incident on the Villanova Main and current efforts under way to determine and

recoup costs incurred by the District. A letter has been sent to the property owner, subcontractors, City of Ojai, and the Bureau of Reclamation stating the District's position on this incident. The Bureau of Reclamation will be visiting the site on July 10th during their comprehensive facility review. The Committee also discussed the professional response by staff during the incident, noting that at least twenty-three staff members were involved with the response and recovery actions.

5. Review of Leak Relief Policy.

Staff are in the process of determining what actions are taken by other agencies and a discussion will occur at a later meeting.

6. Review of California Special Districts Association 2012 board elections ballot information.

The Committee was noticed that a CSDA ballot has been received and will be moved to the Board for discussion and decision on the vote for the Region 5 Director position.

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Larry Yuva: Water-rate increase a done deal

Saturday, June 23, 2012

Wednesday, the Casitas Municipal Water District will "discuss" its proposal to jack up our water rates again. It won't be much of a discussion.

The board of directors has already decided. It is going to raise our water-usage rates by 3 percent this year and again next year. It is raising our "service charges" by a flat 6 percent.

The service charge is what ratepayers pay each month regardless of how much water is used. According to Director Mary Bergen, the increases are justified because we are using less water! Darn those conservationists.

I say the directors have already decided on this issue because in the decade that I have watching the board, I have never known a public hearing to result in the public getting their voiced opinions considered. No matter how many people attend.

This time, three of the directors will probably be too busy thinking about their next junket vacation rather than listening. The three just returned from a water conference in Monterey. We picked up their \$200 per night hotel room, paid them 55 cents a mile to drive up there and gave them a nice food allowance, too.

Of course, we did not pay for their guests/wives' meals. Still, it is nice to have your getaways paid for by the public.

According to our independent auditor's report, the district is financially sound. In 2011, district's net assets increased by 4 percent, more than \$3 million. True, the income was down due in part to the successful water conservation measures we paid the district to implement. But also because the recreation area is such a money loser.

Last year, it lost \$444,000 and the year before it was \$186,000. Yet, the directors swear that the recreation area is totally separate from the utility. The losses do not justify any water-rate increases.

At the rate hearing this week, the directors will say that the increases are necessary due to inflation and uncontrollable overhead costs. That is because neither the managers nor the board ever try to cut costs.

At a time when our schools are losing teachers, class hours and activities, the district will not consider cuts to its staff or their wages. In fact, the directors just gave the general manager a bump to his generous compensation.

The other employees get automatic wage increases. That could change if anyone there really wanted to preserve public trust.

We could save \$100,000 a year just by hiring a local fisheries biologist. For seven years now, we have been flying a man down from Oregon seven or eight times a year to study the fish in the Ventura River. Yet, he is paid more than \$120,000 per year.

That's not all. We are paying for him to pursue his doctoral degree — online. We pay his tuition, his books, his computer, his Internet connection, his travel expenses, his hotels, his food and his car. As of a few months ago, the district had no idea when he would earn his doctorate.

The board of directors could save us about \$70,000 per year by eliminating its own health insurance. The board receives full-time health insurance for its very part-time work. Their junkets to the above-mentioned conference cost us about \$1,000 each and they attend two or three of these apiece each year.

They won't give the ratepayers a discount on the entrance to Lake Casitas, but they get unrestricted passes themselves.

Last year's budget demonstrates that the managerial staff at the district does not value the public's money. That budget underestimated the district's revenues by \$1.398 million. It overestimated expenditures by three times that amount. Try as it might, the district could only spend \$11 million of the \$15 million budgeted.

In conclusion, there is really not much we can do about the mess at our special district. It won't listen. The board isn't going to change its happy lifestyle. It's just going to charge us more.

This is an election year. Three of the directors are up for election. Time to vote them out. If for no other reason than to give other people a shot at the good life at Casitas Municipal Water District.

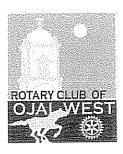

On June 27, 2012, from 2:00 pm to 3:00 pm, a snorkel survey was conducted at Lake Casitas for zebra/quagga mussels. The methodology used for the survey followed DWR's Zebra/Quagga Surface Survey Protocol. The survey was conducted by two snorkelers, using visual and tactile methods, and one safety observer. Approximately 15 percent of Santa Ana Ramp/Marina was surveyed which included: 200 ft of dock, 100 ft of shoreline, 100 ft of boat ramp bottom, 100 ft of dock cable, 50 ft. of mooring line, 113 ft of woody debris, 5 ft of concrete structure, and 60 ft of marina barrier buoys. No quagga or zebra mussels were observed during the survey, although dozens of *Corbicula sp.* and snails were observed.

Synopsis

California Department of Fish and Game (CDFG) personnel rescued nine Oncorhynchus mykiss (O. mykiss) from two weir pools immediately downstream of the Robles Fish Passage Facility (Robles) measurement weir. CDFG transported and released the O. mykiss to a pool approximately 400 m upstream of the Ojai Valley Sanitation District (OVSD) Waste Water Treatment Plant effluent pipe. Of the nine released O. mykiss, eight were in good health and one appeared to be in a state of recuperation.

Background

Each year, receding surface flow often causes *O. mykiss* to become stranded in holding areas which may dry up. Casitas Municipal Water District (CMWD) fisheries personnel monitor subsurface flow in the upper Robles Reach and notifies NMFS and CDFG when holding areas containing endangered O. *mykiss* may become dry.

Beginning in mid-May 2012, when surface flows were observed to be actively receding in the upper Robles Reach, CMWD fisheries personnel began monitoring the down welling location on a weekly basis. On 25 June 2012, the down welling location was 130 meters downstream of the Robles measurement weir. Flow over the weir measured 0.22 cfs. O. *mykiss* were observed in weir pools #2 and #3 downstream of the measurement weir.

On 28 June 2012 at 08:00, Mike Gibson (CMWD) escorted Chris Lima (CDFG) to Robles. Very low flow was observed passing over the measurement weir. The upper three pools held little water and the fourth was dry. The presence of O. *mykiss* was confirmed in weir pool #2 and #3 and NMFS determined an electrofishing fish rescue was necessary and would be conducted by CDFG.

Chris Lima stayed on location and was later met by Jordan Switzer (CMWD), Dana McCanne (CDFG), Jillian Taylor (CCC), and Dylan Brook (CCC). At 11:15, weir pool #2 had a dissolved oxygen and temperature of 9.6 mg/L and 24.6 °C, respectively. A

recovery cooler was filled with water from upstream of the facility at a temperature of 22.7 °C.

From 11:30 to 12:00, nine O. *mykiss* ranging from 16 to 29 cm were captured from weir pool #2 and #3. Dana McCanne operated the electrofisher with Jillian Taylor and Chris Lima netting the fish (see Photo #1). One pass was made through weir pool #2 yielding one O. *mykiss*. Several passes were made in weir pool #3 yielding eight O. *mykiss*. The last remained on its side in the recovery cooler for several minutes (see Photo #2). It eventually regained equilibrium, although did not appear to fully recover.

A scour pool measuring 33 m long, 14 m wide, and approximate 2.3 m deep was selected as a release site. The pool is located at river kilometer 8.5, approximately 400 m upstream of the OVSD treatment plant. It was chosen for its location in a reach with perennial flows, relative inaccessibility by the public, and a depth that provides safety from predators, and cooler temperatures for over-summering.

The crew arrived at 12:40 with the nine O. *mykiss* to be released. Dissolved oxygen and temperature in the pool were 10.6 mg/L and 21.2 °C, respectively. The water in the cooler was 23.0 °C. The last O. *mykiss* captured was released first. It appeared sluggish and was having difficulty maintaining equilibrium. The fish measured and was held by hand in the water for a couple minutes before it swam away to take shelter under a nearby algae patch (see Photo #3). It remained in the area for several minutes, exhibiting sluggish behavior, before eventually moving to the depths of the pool.

The remaining eight O. *mykiss* were also measured before release, and moved into the pool within several seconds. The crew stayed for several minutes to take pool measurements, and insure released O. *mykiss* were not exhibiting abnormal behavior. Nothing was observed and the crew left at approximately 13:00.

Robles was visually surveyed on 29 June 2012 at 09:15 by Jordan Switzer. No water was flowing over the weir and all four pools contained water. Each pool was observed for several minutes. No O. *mykiss* were observed, however, several out of view sheltering areas were present. Water was not flowing out of the entrance pool immediately downstream of the facility, indicating another rescue will be likely in the near future.
