Minutes of the Casitas Municipal Water District Board Meeting Held February 8, 2017

A meeting of the Board of Directors was held February 8, 2017 at the Casitas Municipal Water District located at 1055 Ventura Ave. in Oak View, California. The meeting was called to order at 3:00 p.m. Directors Baggerly, Word, Hicks, Bergen and Kaiser were present. Also present were Steve Wickstrum, General Manager, Rebekah Vieira, Clerk of the Board, and Attorney, John Mathews. There were three staff members and three members of the public in attendance. President Baggerly led the group in the flag salute.

1. <u>Public Comments</u> (items not on the agenda – three minute limit).

Angelo Spandrio asked for an update to be provided on the HoBo project as it had been about eight weeks since the project was awarded. Mr. Wickstrum explained that an update could be provided at a future meeting.

2. <u>General Manager comments</u>.

Mr. Wickstrum reported that we have been busy keeping everybody informed on what is happening at Robles Diversion Dam. We hope to have a good and thorough article in the Ojai Valley News on Friday. Since January 23rd to date we have gathered approximately 10,000 acre feet of water. We have about 95,000 AF of storage. The rains right now have been very gentle and we have had about 18.5 inches so far. We have not seen high intensity as we have seen in many other years but are hopeful we will see that. He expressed thanks to Mr. Merckling for working with NOAA who is in the process of updating the drought monitor. They wanted to move everyone out of extreme drought. Ron provided evidence that we are still in extreme drought up through Santa Barbara. It would have sent the wrong signals. We don't want what happened in 1991/1992 where everyone forgot about the drought. We did move from exception to extreme. Additionally, Mr. Merckling and Mr. Cole have fielded many calls on diversions. There has been a lot of excitement and tomorrow we have an employee meeting for our staff to understand what we have to proceed through. Director Word expressed gratitude to staff for the effort they go through and decisions they make on the weekends to make the diversions happen. Mr. Wickstrum added they are out there 24/7. We have automation on controls that allows us to set up Robles and automatically fall into a diversion mode. If you have any questions when we are in diversions let me know. Neil has also been informing the BO committee on a daily basis. Bert Rapp with Ventura River Water District has reported that their wells are recovering but not as fast as I would have thought. They are not on Casitas any more.

Mr. Wickstrum then mentioned the status of Lake Orville and yesterday's inflows were 130,000 cfs. In one day they put as much water in as the entire Lake Casitas is in volume. They blew out their spillway and will require major repairs.

Mr. Wickstrum then asked who was interested in attending the Ojai Chamber of Commerce Gala. Director Bergen indicated she would attend and Director Kaiser will let know.

Director Hicks asked about what we release downstream for downstream users. Mr. Wickstrum explained that our water rights license states that it does not interfere with downstream users, called the 1959 criteria, if 20 cfs is seen at Santa Ana Blvd, it would reach the city, then we could slow down on the releases. Now the BO sets other flow regimes. There have been a lot of questions lately.

3. <u>Board of Director comments</u>.

Director Kaiser expressed appreciation to the recreation staff that took care of the staircase safety issue.

Director Hicks provided a document from 2003 from NOAA to the state fisheries department talking about a group that when less than 100,000 AF this group would meet to analyze data and make temporary adjustments fish flows etc. Are these people meeting? Mr. Wickstrum explained this will be discussed on agenda item 8 and this is in the Biological Opinion.

Director Word told Ron that he did a good interview this morning. He then mentioned a meeting with John Krist as the speaker talking about Ag in Ventura county and water etc. He had a chart showing as of February 6, 2016 about 80% of the state in extreme drought and this year only Ventura and Santa Barbara and little of Kern County are still in drought.

President Baggerly stated at the last OBGMA meeting a number of actions were taken. They will update the 2007 groundwater management plan. We now understand through a section of water code that we can update our existing plan and base that on our primary act the OBGMA act of 1991. We had the first ad hoc committee meeting today and are moving ahead very quickly. We switched to the alternative plan and developed it showing we had not been in overdraft for the last ten years and no undesirable results had occurred. That analysis was submitted to Department of Water Resources on Dec 27th and a 60 day period of public comments have started on that. People were shocked, it is not a plan, it is data and science showing two things, one that we have not been in overdraft for over ten years and two, there are no undesirable results taking place. We received three comment letters, one from Ian Miller and looking at it as inadequate with no management actions in it. Larry Yee wrote a letter. And there is a nine page letter from Mark Capelli and cover letter from Anthony Spina which will be more challenging to respond to. My preliminary read is they talked about what can happen or speculate, did not show any undesirable results occurring. We will respond to that letter shortly and it will probably be on our Feb 23rd agenda. A lot of work is being done in a timely fashion.

President Baggerly then informed the board that Jordan Kear had been out reading the data loggers today of a number of different wells overlying the basin and he said the basin is recovering so fast that the data he is receiving is outdated as they are recovering so fast. Data has also been gathered for the San Antonio spreading grounds.

4. Board of Director Verbal Reports on Meetings Attended.

Director Bergen attended the Upper Ventura River GSA meeting held in Ojai. Staggered terms were set for directors and the environmental director Larry Rose of the Ojai Land Conservancy, and Ag representative Emily Ayala were chosen. The meeting locations have changed to here at Casitas. We had to continue our meeting and having a continuation to tomorrow here. Meetings start at 1:00 p.m. the second Thursday of the month here. We had to figure out where to do the public hearing to apply to be a GSA and at Ojai Community Center. Date is not set yet. The next meeting is March 9.

8. <u>Discussion regarding the critical drought protection measures for Robles</u> <u>Diversion facility</u>.

Mr. Wickstrum informed the board that critical drought protection measures are mentioned on page 12 of the Biological Opinion and that there is an evaluation of Casitas effectiveness of conservation measures which occurred in October of 2015. Numbers were produced with conservation and the way the population is responding was presented to understand if we head that direction. We hit 100,000 AF late last spring. The BO committees meet in Oct, 2016 and our staff brought forward the data on conservation and recommendations to share and have equity between people and fish and releases at Robles. We offered four recommendations and it is now at nine. It is apparent to me this group had discussed this about once a month but we are not seeing a recommendation being brought forward to the management committee. I called and sent a letter on January 26th requesting that the management committee be convened and requested the BO committee to move on this. The BO committee would formulate the options and make a recommendation to the management committee. Options will be discussed with staff on Monday and to management committee on February 28th. In federal government terms that is light speed.

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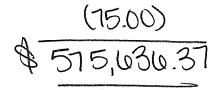

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Directors review the draft letter and direct staff.

BACKGROUND:

The Ojai Basin Groundwater Management Agency has filed with the Department of Water Resources an Alternative to Groundwater Sustainability Plans (Alternative Demonstration) for consideration of the Alternative's applicability under the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act. The Alternative Demonstration must follow specific guidelines stated in Title 23, Section 358 and subsections of 358, in order to be considered by the Department. The information submitted by the OBGMA demonstrates the that the basin has operated within sustainable yield over a period of at least 10 years without the SGMA defined "undesirable results" occurring in the Ojai Groundwater Basin. OBGMA has operated with a groundwater management plan (2007) that is current under review and revision.

The department will be giving the OBGMA Alternative Demonstration a serious review and determination. If approved, OBGMA will be able to proceed with the current plan revisions and implementation of the plan. If denied, OBGMA will adapt to the full provisions of SGMA. Given the lack of undesirable conditions in the Ojai Basin, the consideration of the Alternative demonstration is appropriate.

A letter of support has been prepared for consideration of the Casitas Board of Directors.

Casitas Municipal Water District (Casitas) has been an internal part of OBGMA since its inception in 1991, with one Casitas Director serving on the OBGMA Board. The principal act, the Ojai Basin Groundwater Management Act (SB 534), created the OBGMA with the legislative authority to manage the Ojai Groundwater Basin. The Alternative Demonstration submitted by OBGMA provides the opportunity to show the Department of Water Resources (DWR) actual data that the agency has operated the Basin within its sustainable yield for longer than ten years and also has not produced any SGMA defined undesirable results. This letter of support for the Alternative Demonstration is entirely appropriate because the Ojai Groundwater Basin appears to be functioning properly.

The Analysis of Basin Conditions submitted by the OBGMA complies with Water Code Section 10733.6(b)(3) in every aspect. OBGMA has a management plan adopted and implemented. The 2007 Plan is currently being updated in accordance with the Ojai Basin Groundwater Management Act and SGMA.

During the exceptional drought that Ventura County has suffered for the past 5 years, the Ojai Groundwater Basin has operated conjunctively with the local surface water supply, Lake Casitas. As the drought persists, the local communities have responded with water conservation practices that have reduced demands on both groundwater and surface water by forty (40) percent. The recent rains have begun to recover the basin.

Casitas appreciates the opportunity to support the Ojai Basin Groundwater Management Agency and its Alternative Demonstration. The Casitas Board of Directors sincerely hope that DWR will support the Alternative Demonstration.

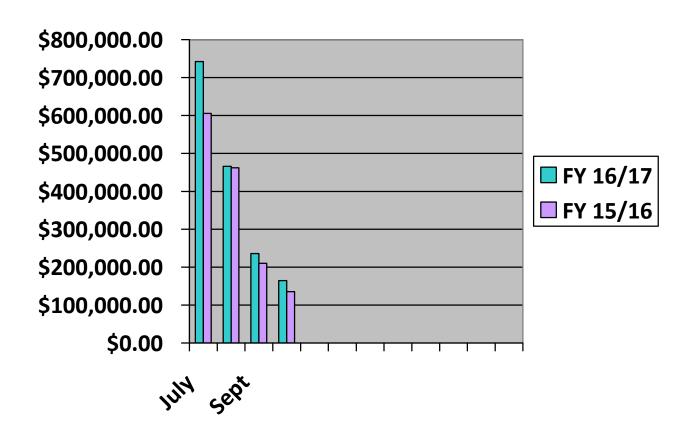

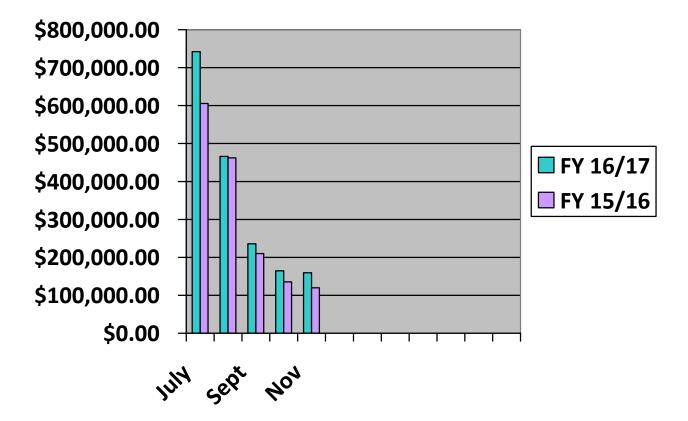
