SUBJECT: Casitas Water Adventure Play Structure Update

REQUEST OF THE COMMITTEE

The Recreation Committee requested an update on the replacement of the Casitas Water Adventure Play Structure.

BACKGROUND AND OVERVIEW

The Casitas Water Adventure (CWA) has been closed since the end of the 2019-20 season due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. In preparation of the 2021 season, Lake Casitas Recreation Area engaged Counsilman-Hunsaker, a consultant firm in the aquatics industry, to perform a facility audit of the existing Aqua Play Structure (APS). The subsequent evaluation of the structure and its physical condition indicated that the existing APS had exceeded its expected lifespan of fifteen years, being currently twenty-three years old. The existing APS was then dismantled and removed.

LCRA staff began seeking a replacement of the CWA APS with a more modern structure able to accommodate a larger number of guests. Also, the ability to accommodate children, teens, and adults as compared to the old APS which could only be used by children under 48 inches tall would be a plus.

ANALYSIS

In October of 2021, LCRA staff attended the World Waterpark Association's annual conference and contacted various manufactures specializing in waterslides, multi-level water play structures and filtration systems.

Several manufacturers provided information regarding design, planning, engineering, installation, and maintenance of an APS. One important element is the ability to place a replacement APS in the current footprint of the previous play structure, which would minimize construction time and cost. All structures have structural steel features and supports, fiberglass decking and stairs, acrylic guard panels, and stainless guard railings.


Three estimates were received from APS manufacturers that fit existing footprint:

1. Empex Watertoys (Ontario, Canada)

C1210 Aquadek

This unit is similar to the previous Casitas Water Adventure APS and includes 28 water event features and three slides that cater to toddlers and teens. The instantaneous capacity for the C1210 is approximately 350.

The quoted price for the C1210 structure in Sept 2021 was \$597,870. The estimated installation cost is \$210,000 for a total estimated cost of **\$807,870**.



2. Whitewater West Industries (San Diego, Ca.)

Whitewater West Industries Ltd, submitted estimates for two different sizes:

Aqua Play 1050

This APS is approximately 5,450 sq. ft, with 95 features, two kid slides, three water slides (teen/adults) with the highest slide at 11 feet. The instantaneous capacity for the AP1050 is 285 for the pool and 100 for the structure for a total of 385 guests.


As of 1/24/2022 the cost for the AP 1050 is \$649,750. Installation is estimated at 35% of the purchase price or approximately \$230,000 for an estimated total cost of **\$879,750**.



Aqua Play 1750

This APS is approximately 6,250 sq. ft, with 135 features, two kid slides, three water slides (teen/adult) with the highest slide at 18 feet. The instantaneous capacity for the AP1750 is 339 for the pool and 201 for the structure for a total of 540 guests.

As of 1/24/2022 the cost of the AP1750 is \$924,600. Installation is roughly 35% of the purchase price or approximately \$325,000 for an estimated total of **\$1,249,600**.



3. SplashTacular Waterslides and Waterpark Attractions, LLC (Paola, Kansas)

Mega Play Unit (MPU)

This APS is similar to Whitewater's AP1750, with the exception of an additional slide and a customizable theme (campsite theme shown). This structure would be expected to have a similar instantaneous capacity to that of the Whitewater AP 1750 (540 guests). As of December of 2021 the cost of the structure was \$1,502,000. The installation cost is estimated at \$225,530 for an estimated total cost of **\$1,727,530**.

Regenerative Media Filtration System

The installation of a new APS should include an updated filtration system. Staff is looking to upgrade all of the waterpark's sand filters to a Regenerative Media Filtration System and has contacted three manufacturers specializing in this technology for cost estimates. These systems require less maintenance, less backwashing, and produce less water waste than that of the existing sand filtration system.

Three estimates have been received from the following manufactures and all provide a fifteenyear warranty. The goal is to provide a cost-effective aquatic regenerative media filter.

1. AquaRevival

• BSG40 – 705 Sq. Ft Filtration Area, 8" valves: \$ 61,844.40 (Play Structure)

• BSG60 – 1667 Sq. Ft. Filtration Area, 12" valves: \$ 93,679.20 (Lazy River)

• Startup (Optional): \$ 1,500.00

In December 2021, The Lake Casitas Recreation Area was opened at a 100% for all camping. High touch areas such as restrooms, showers and Chemical toilets, continued to be cleaned daily. LCRA staff continue to follow District guidelines by wearing mask and maintaining distance when dealing with the public.

The Following events were held in December:

The SoCalCross Prestige Series event and campout was held in Lakeside and campground Greb. The event had approximately 95 participants on Saturday and 75 on Sunday.

The Event Area was host for a celebration of life. The celebration was well attended with approximately 100 in attendance.

The monthly night fishing from the shoreline was held on the New Moon weekend.

There were 225 vessels retagged for reentry, 17 vessel inspections with 15 vessels passing, and 2 failures.

The number of fishing guided trips for 2021, as reported by the fishing guides was 357.

Maintenance completed another restroom remodel in campground Fox, and began painting the restrooms in campground Angler. The remaining three restrooms will be completed by 2023. All restrooms were old pit toilets and they had not been cleaned out since the conversion to flushing toilets. Also completed was a new storage for Water Park.


