The formulas for calculating the above attendance figures derived from the daily cash reports are as follows:

<u>Visitor Days</u> = Daily vehicles + 30-minute passes X 3 + café passes + attendance at special events + annual vehicle decals + replacement decals + campsites occupied +extra vehicles X 4

<u>Camps</u> = Campsites occupied + extra vehicles

<u>Cars</u> = Daily vehicles + 30-minute passes X 3 + café passes + attendance at special events + annual vehicle decals + replacement decals + campsites occupied + extra vehicles

<u>Boats</u> = Daily boats + overnight boats + annual decals + replacement decals

Kayaks & Canoes = Daily kayaks and canoes + overnight kayaks and canoes + annual kayaks and canoes

The month of August is the month we begin to see a decline in attendance both at camping and at the water park. Attendance during the week dropped about the third week due to the beginning of school for most students. The Water Park also went from weekdays to weekends only on the third weekend of the month due to our lifeguards returning to school. The weekends remained busy for the remainder of the month.

The American Bass Association (ABA) had two fishing tournaments scheduled. The August 5<sup>th</sup> tournament had 10 teams with no winning team. This was the first time no fish were caught in a tournament. The second tournament was scheduled for August 19<sup>th</sup>, but due to the results of the tournament held on August 5<sup>th</sup>, it was canceled. There were 190 vessel tags issued in August as well as 20 vessels scheduled for inspection, with 10 passing, 3 failures, and 7 cancellations, or rescheduled. The monthly night fishing from the shoreline was held on the first weekend of the month.

Maintenance continued to maintain campgrounds and grass areas by mowing, trimming trees, repairing leaking waterlines, and bathroom issues. Maintenance staff member Ron Tindel competed a sign replacing the old fabric sign on highway 150 and Santa Ana. The sign indicates most services we provide at the LCRA, and it has the ability to add future concessionaires. The sign lighting is also solar powered, which provides nighttime visibility.





Casitas Water Adventure's Lazy River and MPU were a success this season and we anticipate a better season next year. The CWA moved from operating 7 days a week to weekends only the third week in August due to most of the lifeguarding staff returning to school. The CWA will continued to operate weekends only until after Labor Day when operations moved to Saturday's only for the remainder of the season.





## Revenue Reporting

The 23/24 FY total for the month of August was approximately 64% higher than the prior FY year of 22/23. The FY figures are unaudited and reported when made available for the respective months (operations, concessions, Casitas Water Adventure, etc.) per the District's Financial Summary, generated by the Chief Financial Officer.
