Minutes of the Casitas Municipal Water District Board Meeting Held September 25, 2013

A meeting of the Board of Directors was held September 25, 2013 at Casitas' Office, Oak View, California. Directors Word, Hicks, Kaiser and Baggerly were present. Director Bergen was absent. Also present were Steve Wickstrum, General Manager, Rebekah Vieira, Clerk of the Board, and Attorney, John Mathews. There were four staff members and one member of the public in attendance. President Word led the group in the flag salute.

2. <u>General Manager comments</u>

Mr. Wickstrum reported that the pillow tank arrived in a small box at Villanova and preparations are being made for the interior coating. The tanks will begin being moved from Upper Ojai either tomorrow or Friday. There was discussion on scheduling a time where the board could see work at the site and the filling of the pillow tank.

Mr. Wickstrum informed the board that the shoreline clean up at Lake Casitas would begin at 9:30 on Sunday. Staff has begun to get into the area that Director Kaiser brought to our attention to remove chairs and empty drums. We have to be careful in the mud as staff has already had to perform a rescue for someone who got stuck in the mud. The Executive Committee was rescheduled for October 8th.

Mr. Wickstrum reported that the Park Services Manager received a call from Dwayne Maxwell with Fish & Wildlife and there is no permitting of fish plants at Casitas, Cachuma, Piru and Castaic as these lakes were left out of the Biologic Opinion process. There is a Fish & Wildlife Commission meeting next Wednesday at the Crowne Plaza. Park Services Manager Belser will attend and a quorum notice will be posted in case numerous directors want to attend.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the General Manager approve a purchase order for Kone Cranes Inc, in the amount of \$22,035.00 for the purchase and installation of a five ton electric chain hoist on Casitas Dam's intake screen removal system.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:

The FY 2013/14 budget contains funds in the amount of \$28,000.000 for the purchase and installation of a five ton electric chain hoist on Casitas dam's intake screen removal system. The electric chain hoist will replace a manual chain fall hoist.

A job walk was conducted and three contractors attended. One of the firms submitted a bid. When the other two bidders became aware that Kone was submitting a bid, they were convinced their bids would be higher; thus opting out.







SUBJECT: Night Fishing Tournaments 2014

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Directors award the 2014 Night Fishing Tournaments to Western Outdoor News Bass.

BACKGROUND:

Lake Casitas Recreation Area submitted bid requests with a September 17, 2013 deadline for exclusive rights to organize night fishing tournaments in 2014 with the payments being made to the Lake Casitas Improvement Foundation (LCIF).

Bids were solicited to several organizations, with one (1) bid received. Western Outdoor News Bass was the responsible bidder with a bid of \$71 per team.

The bid of \$71 per team with a minimum payment of 20 boats will bring at least \$1,420 per tournament.

ANALYSIS:

WON Bass has been hosting fishing tournaments at Lake Casitas for several years and has a proven record to fulfill the requirements in the bid specifications. Casitas boat inspection protocol is required to be followed for all teams participating in the tournaments.

The funds donated to the LCIF have been used to support special events such as Kids Fishing Day, the purchase of additional trout and fish habitats, and most recently to funds were allocated to assist in the purchase of a rowing dock.

Recommendation:

It is recommended the Board approve the attached Agreement outlining the parameters of the Lake Casitas Rowing Association's activities in the Lake Casitas Recreation Area.

Background:

The Lake Casitas Rowing Association "Club" has been active in Lake Casitas since 2007 within operational parameters pursuant to an agreement. The Club's activities complement the lake's operations and are very popular with Ojai Valley and Ventura area residents. There are 168 current club members.

The Club uses a portion of the Recreation Area to store equipment and areas for Club activities primarily the waters of Lake Casitas. Recently the Lake Casitas Improvement Foundation authorized an expenditure to help support a new rowing dock.

The Club's popularity warranted a search for a new, larger location to store equipment. The current location, a triangular shaped parcel adjacent to the trailer storage area that is approximately 4,968 square feet, is now too small and, more importantly, it forces participants to cross the main road (along trailer storage to the east side of the park) to get to the lake.

Analysis:

The Club representatives and staff together conducted a field search of possible locations and agree that the area shown in Exhibit A attached to the Agreement is the most logical location for the Club. The identified area will provide the Club with 6,000 square feet of storage space and an additional 2,000 square feet of "buffer zone" that will not be fenced in, but will be used to enter and exit the storage area. This is especially important for carrying the long rowing shells (up to 60' long) out of the storage area and down to the lake unobstructed. The Picnic #1 restrooms are close to the new area and there are plenty of parking spaces nearby. The Club officials also like the area because the new location is closer to the water's edge.

The new storage space will be secured with a chain link fence paid for by the Club. The area is obscured from direct public view yet visible, screened by eucalyptus trees and shrubs.

The Recreation Committee supported the attached Agreement at the June 3 and September 23, 2013 meetings. The Bureau of Reclamation is also in approval of this Agreement and requested the final draft for their file once approved by the Casitas Board.

CASITAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT LAKE CASITAS RECREATION AREA

AGREEMENT FOR ROWING ASSOCIATION ACTIVITIES TO OPERATE AT THE LAKE CASITAS RECREATION AREA

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between CASITAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT, called herein "Casitas", and LAKE CASITAS ROWING ASSOCIATION, called herein "Association".

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED as follows:

1. **Rights of Casitas and USBR.**

(a) The USBR retains the primary jurisdiction over the Ventura River Project and the Lake Casitas Recreation Area, called herein "LCRA". The USBR can give written notice to Casitas if the USBR determines that changes in land use for USBR purposes within the LCRA are necessary. Casitas will give written notice to Association if any land use changes required by the USBR are necessary.

(b) Casitas or the USBR may close the LCRA, or any portion thereof, including the area being utilized by the Association, to public use whenever it is determined such restriction is necessary in the interest of water delivery project operation, public safety or national security. Casitas' designated representative will give written notice to Association of any such closure. This notice will be given as soon as practicable after a determination for closure is made and will include the date when the closure becomes effective. Association will enforce such closure and such enforcement will include coordination and cooperation with Casitas.

(c) The USBR and Casitas reserves the right to establish, grant or utilize additional easements rights of way over, under, along and across the area being utilized by Association for utilities and/or public access to the LCRA provided Casitas shall exercise such rights in a manner as will avoid any substantial interference with the operations to be conducted hereunder. Association shall not claim any damages, loss of use, impact costs or other costs of any kind due to such an easement.

2. Activities.

(a) Association will conduct rowing club activities, including storage and maintenance of equipment, e.g. rowing sculls, oars, cradles and racks, etc. as provided for in Item 5 hereafter, hereinafter referred to as "Activities" at the LCRA. Activities may take place both on land and water.

(b) The Association will provide comprehensive rowing activities for youth and adults including team building skills and physical fitness training that are related to rowing skill refinement.

(c) Activities will be conducted only during the day use hours of operation of the LCRA, which vary throughout the year. Activities will be restricted to day use areas that are not occupied or reserved by other patrons. Other activity times can be considered on a case by case basis and are subject to the prior written approval of Casitas.

(d) Non-day use activities and special events such as competitions, sculling events and regattas which are beyond the scope of this Agreement will be handled separately, on a case by case basis, through the Lake Casitas Recreation Area Application for Special Event Facility Use and agreement process.

(e) Because of the family oriented nature of the LCRA facilities, Casitas reserves the right to disapprove any activities, music, acts, entertainment, performances or attractions at any time which it considers, in its sole discretion, to be inconsistent with its current philosophy.

(f) While Casitas will make every effort to provide its facilities for Association's activities, Casitas shall have no liability to Association if Casitas' facilities become restricted or closed for reasons including, but not limited to, acts of God, terrorism, war or the inability to provide facilities if permitting agencies revoke permits or authorization to use facilities.

3. **Term and Termination**.

(a) The term of this Agreement shall be for one (1) year commencing on October 9, 2013 to and until October 9, 2014, and continuing thereafter on a month-to-month basis until terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice each to the other, but in no event will exceed the term of the Management Agreement Number 11-LC-20-02162011 between Casitas and the USBR which will expire on October 10, 2036 unless sooner terminated.

(b) Notwithstanding the foregoing, this Agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice each to the other.

(c) Within thirty (30) days after termination of this Agreement, all permanent improvements shall be removed and land restored to its original state at Association's sole cost and expense. Upon prior written acceptance by Casitas any equipment and improvements remaining on site after thirty (30) days after the termination date shall become the property of Casitas and/or the United States of America at no cost to Casitas or the United States of America. Thereafter, any equipment not removed by Association and not accepted by Casitas will be subject to removal by Casitas at Association's sole cost and expense.

4. **Payment to Casitas**.

(a) For and in consideration of this Agreement, Association shall pay Casitas the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200) monthly in advance due and payable on the first day of each month. Payment can be made at the Casitas Municipal Water District Office, 1055 Ventura Avenue, Oak View, California 93022 or the Lake Casitas Recreation Area, 11311 Santa Ana Road, Venture, California 93001 in person, by mail or phone. Payments shall be considered unpaid if not paid by the last day of the month in which billed, at which time a late fee as stated on the monthly Storage Statement shall be added to the account balance.

(b) The Self-Service Storage Facility Rental Agreement, called herein "SSSFRA" dated March 24, 2008 between Association and Casitas is hereby terminated effective the date of this Agreement. It is the intention of the parties hereto that the monthly fees will continue uninterrupted during the transition from the SSSFRA to this Agreement and Permit #00994 will continue to be referenced for identification.

(c) In order to accommodate Association with respect to inspections of multiple rowing sculls owned by Association and its members transported on large trailers, Association will pay inspection fees as follows:

- (1) The sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per trailer carrying five (5) or more sculls.
- (2) Current inspection fee rate for trailers carrying less than five (5) sculls.

(d) Rowing sculls and trailers eligible for the above rates must be owned by Association and/or its members (not outside agencies e.g. USC, UCLA, etc. or non Association members).

5. Special and Temporary Use Areas, Relocation of Equipment, Storage

(a) <u>Special Use Area</u>. A Special Use Area, hereinafter referred to as "SUA", as outlined on Exhibit A attached hereto, will be made available for storage of the equipment Association uses to conduct its Activities. The SUA will be fenced at the Association's sole cost and expense and will be approximately forty feet (40') by one hundred fifty feet (150') for a total of six thousand (6,000) square feet. Prior to erecting fencing or storage racks, written specifications of materials and work to be completed must be submitted for written approval by Casitas. A non exclusive transition area forty feet (40') by fifty feet (50') for a total of two thousand (2,000) square feet will be located adjacent to the fenced area.

(b) <u>Temporary Use Area</u>. A Temporary Use Area, hereinafter "TUA", as shown on Exhibit B. attached hereto, will be made available to Association in the event Lake Casitas water level approaches or rises to the 560' mark as shown on Exhibit C attached hereto. The TUA is located at the corner of the Santa Ana Launch Ramp parking area adjacent to Picnic Area #1. It will be approximately forty feet (40') by one hundred forty feet (140') for a total of five thousand six hundred (5,600) square feet in size. Association may install fencing needed to secure and protect racks and equipment, with the prior written approval of Casitas. Any materials used in the installation must be of a temporary nature and must not cause permanent damage to the launch ramp or surrounding area. Upon removal of the temporary fencing, the area must be restored to its original state at Association's sole cost and expense. Casitas may, at its sole option, designate an alternative Temporary Use Area for temporary use by Association.

(c) <u>Relocation</u>. Immediately upon written (email acceptable) notification by Casitas, Association will be required to relocate its equipment to the TUA. It is the Association's sole responsibility to ensure that its equipment is relocated to the TUA. The decision to relocate will be based on several variables including the current water level, time of year and possible future precipitation. Casitas reserves the right to determine, in its sole discretion, when the Association will be required to relocate to the TSU and when to return to the SUA.

(d) The fencing and storage racks may be left in the SUA after relocation of the equipment to the TUA. However, in order to alert boaters to the submerged objects, Association shall attach white twenty-four inch (24") diameter buoys with reflective tape to the tops of all four top corners and half way along the long edges of the fenced enclosure at a distance of seventy-five feet (75'). The buoys shall be secured with one inch (1") polypro line, five feet (5') in length and be installed so that the buoys will float free as the water rises.

(e) <u>Return to SUA</u>. When the Lake Casitas water level recedes to below the 560' mark, the Association will relocate its equipment back to the SUA within thirty (30) days of written notification by Casitas. The predetermined water level mark is subject to change by Casitas depending on rate of fill, time of year, precipitation predictions and/or other variables that contribute to rising lake water levels.

(f) <u>Maintenance</u>. The SUA, TUA and any other Casitas approved area for use by Association will be maintained by Association and kept in a neat, clean and safe condition.

6. **Daily Operations**

(a) All of Casitas Municipal Water District Ordinances, rules and regulations must be strictly adhered to and supported by the Association. All Association agents, employees, members, participants, volunteers, visitors, etc. are subject to Public Use Fees as defined in Item 3 of Casitas Ordinance 10-01 dated March 24, 2010, a copy of which is attached hereto, and any amendments thereto or new Ordinances, including, but not limited to, entrance, vessel inspections, vessel annual decals, camping, use of picnic areas, etc. It is the Association shall cooperate with and support the LCRA Public Use Fees and Ordinance adherence. Association shall cooperate with and support any and all restrictions regarding use of the Lake, particularly inspections for invasive species and the restriction of no body contact with the Lake.

(b) Appointments must be made with Casitas staff for all vessel inspections. In the case of the multiple units on large trailers, Association must provide a list and description of each, including the correct Annual Boat decal number. If it is determined by Casitas staff that in order to carry out a safe and expeditious inspection some units must be removed from the trailer, Association will fully cooperate with any such request.

(c) Association shall be allowed to store multiple vessels, general and rowing equipment, tools and supplies, hereinafter referred to as "inventory", used in connection with Activities, in the applicable SUA or TUA, provided they are stored neatly and safely, as determined by Casitas, and are contained within the applicable boundaries. Association is solely responsible for the security of its inventory, racks and fencing.

(d) Association shall maintain a current list of inventory located inside the applicable areas and provide Casitas with said list upon request.

(e) Association shall ensure that current annual boat decals and state issued identification numbers are attached to all vessels used in connection with Activities, as applicable. In addition, Association shall immediately inform Casitas of any additions or removals of vessels.

(f) Association shall, at Association's sole cost and expense, make arrangements to provide trash/debris removal. Casitas' dumpsters are not available for Association use.

(g) This Agreement does not provide for use of water, electricity and restrooms beyond that of the ordinary visiting public. Any special use requests must be submitted in writing and will be considered on a case by case basis.

(h) Any pest and/or weed control proposed by Association must receive the prior written approval of Casitas and be performed in compliance with the Lake Casitas Recreation Area Integrated Pest Management Plan dated September 12, 2012 and any amendments thereto.

(i) A Casitas dock may be made available for use by Association in connection with its Activities. Association shall have non exclusive use of the dock for vessels approved by Casitas. Association shall maintain the dock and surrounding area in a clean condition. All vessels and equipment shall be removed and appropriately stored each day in time to comply with the close of LCRA daytime operation.

(j) Association shall not violate contracts of other recognized concessionaires, specifically the Marina Concessionaire. The renting of kayaks and canoes is specifically prohibited. The renting of rowing

shells (sweep boats and sculling boats) to Association members may be allowed with the prior written approval of Casitas.

(k) Protocol for rowing activities includes the calling of loud, verbal instruction. Since sound travels quickly and easily over water, Association acknowledges that this may be disruptive and agrees to be respectful of campers in the area. Association will abide by any and all restrictions imposed by Casitas to mitigate such circumstances.

(1) Minors at the LCRA for the purpose of the Association's Activities are the responsibility and liability of Association which must provide adequate adult supervision at all times.

(m) Association shall report any incidents of injury or infraction of Casitas Ordinances, rules and regulations including, but not limited to, body contact with the Lake, involving participants in Activities, Association members and persons directly connected with Association such as parents, guardians or caretakers of minor children and spectators of Activities. Association's representative shall make a verbal/phone message report to Casitas' designated representative within twenty-four (24) hours of incident. If requested by Casitas, Association shall submit a written incident report via hard copy or e-mail to Casitas' designated representative within two (2) calendar days of the verbal notice. Incidents requiring 911 emergency response must be reported to Casitas immediately.

7. **Obligations of Association**. Association specifically hereby agrees that notwithstanding the fact that it is a legal entity named Lake Casitas Rowing Association, it will never, at any time, use the acronym "LCRA".

8. Access. Access to the SUA, or other areas, as applicable, will be only through the main entrance to the LCRA.

9. **Sale of Alcohol**. This Agreement does not provide for the sale of alcohol.

10. **Commercial General Liability Coverage for Activities**. All Association members and participants must be covered by insurance provided by Association, in order to participate in Activities.

(a) <u>Coverage</u>. Coverage for commercial general liability shall be at least as broad as Insurance Services Office Commercial General Liability Coverage (Occurrence Form CG 0001).

(b) <u>Limits</u>. Association shall, during the course of activities, maintain limits of general liability no less than ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000) per occurrence for bodily injury property damage and personal injury. If Commercial General Liability Insurance or other form with a general aggregate limit is used, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to the project/location (with the ISO CG 2503, or ISO CG 2504, or insurer's equivalent endorsement provided to Casitas) or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit (two million dollars).

(c) <u>Required Provisions</u>. The general liability policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain the following provisions:

(1) The United States of America (Bureau of Reclamation), Casitas, its directors, officers, employees, or authorized volunteers shall be named as additional insured (via ISO endorsement CG 2026 or insurer's equivalent for general liability coverage) as respects: liability arising out of activities performed by or on behalf of the Association; products and completed operations of the Association; premises

occupied or used by the Association. The coverage shall contain no special limitations on the scope of protection afforded to the Casitas, its directors, officers, employees, or authorized volunteers.

- (2) For any claims related to these activities, the Association's insurance shall state that coverage is primary as respects the United States of America (Bureau of Reclamation), Casitas Municipal Water District, its directors, officers, employees, or authorized volunteers, and any insurance, self insurance, or other coverage obtained or maintained by Casitas Municipal Water District, its directors, officers, employees, or authorized volunteers shall be in excess of said primary coverage and not contributing.
- (3) Any failure to comply with reporting or other provisions of the policies including breaches of warranties shall not affect coverage provided to the United States of America (Bureau of Reclamation), Casitas, its directors, officers, employees, or authorized volunteers.
- (4) The Association's insurance shall apply separately to the insured against whom claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability.
- (5) Each insurance policy required by this clause shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be canceled by either party, except after thirty (30) days (10 days for non-payment of premium) prior written notice by U.S. Mail has been given to Casitas.
- (6) Such liability insurance shall indemnify the Association against loss from liability imposed by law upon, or assumed under contract by, the Association for damages on account of such bodily injury (including death), property damage, and personal injury.
- (7) The general liability policy shall cover bodily injury and property damage liability, owned and non-owned equipment, and blanket contractual liability.

(d) <u>Deductibles and Self-Insured Retentions</u>. Any deductible or self-insured retention must be declared to and approved by Casitas. At the option of Casitas, the insurer shall either reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retentions.

(e) <u>Acceptability of Insurers</u>. All of the insurance shall be provided on policy forms and through companies satisfactory to Casitas. Insurance is to be placed with insurers having a current A.M. Best rating of no less than A-:VII or equivalent or as otherwise approved by Casitas.

(f) <u>Workers' Compensation & Employer's Liability Insurance</u>. By authorized signature hereunder, Association certifies that it is aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the California Labor Code, which require every employer to be insured against liability for workers' compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that code, and he/she will comply with such provisions before commencing the activities. The Association shall cover or insure under the applicable laws relating to workers' compensation insurance, all of the employees working on or about the activities, in accordance with the "Workers' Compensation and Insurance Act," Division IV of the Labor Code of the State of California and any Acts amendatory thereof. The Association shall provide employer's liability insurance in the amount of at least ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000) per accident for bodily injury

and disease. In the event Workers' Compensation & Employer's Liability Insurance does not apply to Association, Association shall execute a California Workers' Compensation Law Certificate of Exemption.

(g) <u>Evidences of Insurance</u>. Within fourteen (14) days prior to the commencement of this Agreement, Association shall file with Casitas a Certificate of Insurance (Acord Form 25-S or equivalent) signed by the insurer's representative. Such evidence shall include an original copy of the additional insured endorsement signed by the insurer's representative. Such evidence shall also include confirmation that coverage includes or has been modified to include (c) Required Provisions (1) through (7) above.

(h) The Association shall, upon demand of Casitas, deliver to Casitas such policy or policies of insurance and the receipts for payment of premiums thereon. In the event evidence of such insurance coverage is not provided to Casitas within fourteen (14) days prior to activities, Casitas shall, at its sole option, obtain such insurance coverage and charge Association the cost thereof plus any administrative costs involved in obtaining said insurance. Failure to provide the required insurance coverage may result in the loss of the use of the facility. Association shall provide increased limits of insurance if required of Casitas by Casitas' insurer at no cost or liability to Casitas.

11. **Indemnification for Activities**. To the fullest extent permitted by law, Association shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the United States of America (Bureau of Reclamation) Casitas, its directors, officers, employees or authorized volunteers from and against:

(a) All claims, damages, losses and expenses, including, but not limited to reasonable attorney's fees arising out of or resulting from any act, conduct, omission, negligence, misconduct or unlawful act (or act contrary to any applicable governmental order or regulation) of Association, its officers, directors, employees, contractors, subcontractors, agents or volunteers.

(b) Any and all actions, proceedings, damages, costs, expenses, penalties or liabilities, in law or equity, of every kind or nature whatsoever, arising out of, resulting from or on account of the violation of any governmental law or regulation, compliance with which is the responsibility of Association.

(c) Any and all losses, expenses, damages (including damages to the work itself), and other costs, including all costs of defense, which any of them may incur with respect to the failure, neglect, or refusal of Association to faithfully perform all of its obligations under the contract. Such costs, expenses, and damages shall include all costs incurred by the indemnified parties in any lawsuits to which they are a party.

(d) Association shall defend, at Association's own cost, expense and risk, any and all such aforesaid suits, actions or other legal proceedings of every kind that may be brought or instituted against Casitas or Casitas' directors, officers, employees, or authorized volunteers.

(e) Association shall pay and satisfy any judgment, award or decree that may be rendered against Casitas or its directors, officers, employees, or authorized volunteers, in any such suit, action or other legal proceeding.

(f) Association shall reimburse Casitas and its directors, officers, employees, or authorized volunteers, for any and all legal expenses and costs incurred by each of them in connection therewith or in enforcing the indemnity herein provided.

(g) Association agrees to carry insurance for this purpose as set out in the specifications. Association's obligation to indemnify shall not be restricted to insurance proceeds, if any, received by the United States of America (Bureau of Reclamation), Casitas, or its directors, officers, employees, or authorized volunteers.

12. **Overnight Camping in the Designated Area.** This Agreement does not provide for overnight camping.

13. **Use of Animals.** This Agreement does not provide for the use of animals.

14. **Use of Explosives**. This Agreement does not provide for the use of explosives.

15. **Taxes and Assessments**. A taxable possessory interest may be created by this Agreement and Association may be subject to the payment of property taxes levied upon such interest. Association shall pay, before delinquent, any and all taxes and assessments levied against Association by reason of Association's use and occupancy of the Recreation Area.

16. **Publicity**. Association hereby agrees that Casitas may utilize any publicity generated for, or because of, any of the activities for the mutual and/or separate benefit of Association and/or Casitas at no cost to Casitas. Association agrees that any printed material used by Association shall include the words "Lake Casitas Recreation Area".

17. **Compliance with Rules and Regulations**. The Association hereby certifies that it has read and will comply with the rules, regulations, and laws governing the LCRA, and will be responsible for the activities and conduct of all people whose activities and conduct are a result of the Activities at the designated area or arise out of the Activities. Association shall enforce the applicable LCRA rules and regulations in the designated area. Any person or persons violating any LCRA rules or laws may be evicted from the LCRA at Casitas' sole discretion. Association must comply with Casitas' decision and, if necessary, provide verbal assistance to Staff in the removal of any such person or persons.

18. **Raffles and Games of Chance**. Association hereby agrees that no one will be allowed to conduct games of chance, raffles, or any such activities at LCRA, which contravene state and local lottery laws.

19. **Discrimination**. The Association agrees that during the use of Casitas Municipal Water District's Recreation Area facilities, no qualified person shall be prevented from participating or denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination because of the person's race, color, national origin, age or handicap.

20. **Title VI Compliance**. Association hereby acknowledges that as a subrecipient of federal funds, Casitas Municipal Water District's Recreation Area cannot discriminate against anyone on the basis of race, color, natural origin, age or handicap in the provision of its services to the public. Anyone who believes that he/she has been subjected to discrimination can file a complaint either with the Casitas Municipal Water District, 1055 Ventura Avenue, Oak View, CA 93022, or the Office for Equal Opportunity, U.S. Department of the Interior, Washington, D.C. 20240.

21. **Law & Jurisdiction Governing**. This Agreement is being delivered and shall be deemed entered into in the State of California and shall be governed by and construed according to the laws of such state. Any dispute, claim or controversy between the parties shall be arbitrated and/or litigated in Ventura County, California. If any provision of this Agreement is determined to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions hereof shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect.

22. Entire Agreement.

(a) This document constitutes the entire Agreement between Casitas and Association for the use granted at the LCRA for Association activities.

(b) This document may be modified only by further written agreement between the parties hereto. Any such modification shall not be effective unless and until executed by Association and in the case of Casitas, except as otherwise specifically authorized herein, until approved and executed by Casitas' Park Services Manager, General Manager and/or Board of Directors.

23. Time is of the Essence. Time is of the essence for all the time frames of this Agreement.

24. **Representatives**. The representatives of the parties to this Agreement are those set forth below:

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
Exhibit A Rowing Special Use Area (SUA)

ORDINANCE NO. 10-01

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CASITAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT ESTABLISHING RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE PUBLIC USE OF THE LAKE CASITAS RECREATION AREA

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Directors of the Casitas Municipal Water District as follows:

1. DEFINITIONS. As used in this Ordinance, unless the context clearly requires a different meaning, the following words have the following meanings:

1.1 "Casitas" (also herein referred to as "District") means the Casitas Municipal Water District.

- 1.2 "Board" means the Board of Directors of Casitas.
- 1.3 "Park" means Lake Casitas Recreation Area.
- 1.4 "Lake Casitas" means the lake created by Casitas Dam.

1.5 "Lake Casitas Recreation Area" (also herein referred to as "Recreation Area") means the portion of Casitas Reservoir right-of-way used or planned for use for recreational purposes.

1.6 "General Manager" means the General Manager of Casitas.

1.7 "Park Services Manager" means the Park Services Manager or the person acting in that capacity of the Lake Casitas Recreation Area.

1.8 Park Services Officer means a specific employee of Casitas at the Lake Casitas Recreation Area as designated by the General Manager.

1.9 "Casitas Personnel" means any full, part time or volunteer staff of the Lake Casitas Recreation Area.

1.10 "Department" means the Lake Casitas Recreation Area.

1.11 "Lake" means the Lake Casitas and other lakes or ponds in the Lake Casitas Recreation Area.

1.12 "Stream" means any watercourse within the Lake Casitas watershed whose waters eventually flow into Lake Casitas.

1.13 "Aquaplane" means any plank, surfboard, water ski, or other device used for transporting, conveying, or carrying a person who is towed or pulled by any vessel by means of a rope, chain, cable,

wire, or other connection.

1.14 "Horse" means any member of the equine family.

1.15 "Animal" means any one of the lower animals as distinguished from man except fish bait or birds other than poultry.

1.16 "Trail" means any roadway or footpath capable of being used by a vehicle or pedestrian.

1.17 "Vehicle" includes any mechanically propelled device including, but not limited to, cycles and motor driven scooters, and/or as defined in the applicable section(s) of the California Motor Vehicle Code.

2. GENERAL

2.1 Powers granted to the Department or its personnel under this Ordinance shall be construed to be powers delegated by the Board to the General Manager and redelegated by him to the Park Services Manager for the purpose of management control, and redelegated by the Park Services Manager to Casitas Personnel, as deemed appropriate.

2.1.1 Park Services Officers are empowered to enforce within the Park all of the provisions of this Ordinance and any amendment or amendments thereto, and the California Administrative Code Title 14, relating to Fish and Game regulations, and the California State Boating Law. Such Park Services Officers are normally not authorized to enforce such laws, Ordinances or regulations outside the Park.

2.2 The provisions of Section 71660 of the California Water Code make it a misdemeanor to violate any of the regulations adopted by this Ordinance relating to vehicle or vessel speed limits, defacement of Casitas' property, the use, possession or discharge of firearms, weapons or fireworks, the creation of fire hazards, being under the influence of intoxicating beverages or dangerous drugs, or remaining on, or reentering Casitas' premises after authorized Casitas Personnel have specifically withdrawn consent for a person to utilize Casitas' facilities. It is an infraction to violate any other regulations of Casitas adopted pursuant to this section. The following procedures shall be subject to citation issuance within the Park, by Casitas Personnel as authorized by the General Manager, of persons suspected of the violation of regulations adopted by this Ordinance.

- 2.2.1 When any person is issued a citation, the person issuing the citation shall prepare, in triplicate, a written Notice of Violation, containing the name and address of the person violating the Ordinance, the offense charged, and the fine as approved by the Board of Directors for such offence.
- 2.2.2 The fine specified in the Notice of Violation must be paid to the District within thirty (30) days of issuance.

2.3 The Department is authorized to revoke any Park permit and to expel any person from the Park for violation of any applicable law, rule, or regulation.

- 2.3.1 The Department shall have the authority to cause to be towed, removed or disposed of any property in the Park at the owner's expense when it has been left without written authorization of the Department, becomes a navigational or safety hazard on a trail or waterway, has or may potentially introduce pollution into the Lake or when the permit of the person(s) leaving the property has expired or has been revoked for violation of any applicable law.
- 2.3.2 To refuse to present upon request a valid identification document with proof of age.

2.4 The General Manager is authorized to direct the visiting public in its use of the Park, according to statutes, Ordinances, rules, and regulations applicable to the Park. In the event of fire or other emergency or to expedite vehicle or boating traffic, to expedite the launching or removal of vessels, to insure the safety of persons in the Park, to insure against pollution of the Lake or to protect property and facilities in the Park, the General Manager may direct the public as conditions may require notwithstanding other provisions of this Ordinance.

2.4.1 The General Manager may make variances to this Ordinance as approved by the Board of Directors. The variances will apply only for the time specified. The variances will be on file in the Recreation Area while they are in effect

2.5 It is unlawful to willfully fail or refuse to comply with any lawful order, signal, or direction of any Park Services Officer or to refuse to submit to any lawful inspection under this Ordinance.

3. PUBLIC USE FEES

3.1 Public use fees shall be established by Ordinance of the Board and may be revised from time to time by Ordinance of the Board, provided that nothing contained herein shall be construed to permit the collection of a fee from any pedestrian for entering the Park for day use. Public access to the Recreation Area is through the main gate only unless a special use permit is granted by the General Manager and is on file at the Recreation Area.

3.2 Public use fees shall be due and payable upon entering the park. They shall be considered earned upon receipt and shall not be subject to refund by Casitas. Receipts and fees are not transferable. It shall be unlawful to be in or to enter the Park without paying all fees that may be applicable under the public fee schedule in effect at the time of entry.

3.3 Annual vehicle permit shall be affixed to the vehicle windshield or displayed to Casitas Personnel, whichever is applicable.

3.4 The annual boat permit shall be affixed by Casitas Personnel_to the side of the vessel immediately behind the break of the bow at least 12 inches from the CF number and state registration sticker.

3.5 An annual vehicle permit or Frequent Visitor Card shall be valid for only one vehicle in the Park at a time.

3.6 Annual boat permits are issued to specific vessels and are transferable in the event of transfer or sale of the vessel or vehicle to a new owner upon application to the Department and the payment of a transfer fee. Annual boat permits are not transferable between vessels in the event owner has more than one.

3.7 Annual permits shall be valid for the period ending on the month and year indicated on the permits unless revoked for cause.

3.8 Vessels owned by the Bait & Tackle Concessionaire for rental purposes shall not be required to obtain boat permits but shall be subject to all other rules and regulations of this Ordinance.

3.9 The Department may take possession of any certificate, card, permit or decal issued hereunder upon revocation, cancellation or suspension thereof or which is fictitious or which has been unlawfully or erroneously issued or altered.

3.10 Camping or day use permits shall be affixed by the customer to the inside windshield of the vehicle viewable from the front side of the campsite.

3.11 The storage facility is for storage of recreational items such as travel trailers, 5th wheel trailers, vessel trailers, vessels, campers, motor homes, etc., as determined by the General Manager.

3.12 All customers who store a recreation vehicle, vessel or other vehicle approved by the General Manager shall sign and comply with all terms and conditions as set forth in the "Self-Service Storage Facility Rental Agreement" including, but not limited to California Business and Professional Code, Chapter 10, Sections 21700 - 21716 and the most current Public Use Fees for the Park as established by the Board. Storage fees are due monthly in advance of the first day of each month following entry into the storage area. Fees shall be considered unpaid if not paid in accordance with the terms of the Lake Casitas Recreation Area Self-Service Storage Facility Rental Agreement, as amended from time-to-time. Casitas may terminate the Self-Service Storage Facility Rental Agreement when said fees are unpaid for fourteen (14) days. Casitas may then take all actions required by law to remove the items.

3.13 At the discretion of the General Manager, in lieu of the remedies provided for in 3.12 above, Casitas may proceed to sue the owner or the person contracting for said storage in any court of competent jurisdiction or take any other proper steps to effect collection.

3.14 Should a check be returned by a bank for any reason, the customer shall be charged a returned check charge for each such check returned as determined by the Board by Ordinance. In the event Casitas is unable to collect the amount due, the returned check(s) will be forwarded to the Ventura County District Attorney's office, or other jurisdiction as applicable, for processing.

4. SCHEDULE OF OPERATIONS

4.1 The schedule of operations for the Park shall be set by resolution of the Board and may be revised from time to time by resolution of the Board.

4.2 The Department is authorized to restrict the public use of the Park by closing the Park or any Park area or any of its facilities, or restricting the hours of operation for good and sufficient reasons including, but not limited to, the following:

- 4.2.1 Sanitary protection of the watershed.
- 4.2.2 Fire prevention and/or fire suppression.
- 4.2.3 Construction or maintenance.
- 4.2.4 Dangerous or unsafe conditions.
- 4.2.5 To prevent damage to the Park or its facilities.
- 4.2.6 Conservation of fish and game.
- 4.2.7 Special activities or events and off-season restrictions.

5. RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 5.1 **Sanitary Regulations.** It shall be unlawful for any person within the Park:
 - 5.1.1 To have, or to permit any child or animal under that person's supervision to have body contact with the waters of the Lake or streams.
 - 5.1.2 To throw or discharge into the waters of the Lake or any stream, or place upon the shore area thereof, or place in the Park unless in approved containers, any litter, waste products, trash, motor oil, or other debris, or to discharge into the Lake or any stream along the shore area thereof, any contaminating or polluting substance of any kind whatsoever, or to use any motor or container which leaks oil or gas into the waters of the Lake. Household or industrial waste, including water softener brine, may not be brought into or disposed of in the Park.
 - 5.1.3 To enter or reach into trash cans, recycle containers or dumpsters for the purpose of retrieving discarded materials.
 - 5.1.4 To clean fish in the Park except at fish cleaning facilities provided by Casitas.
 - 5.1.5 To operate a bilge pump on the Lake, except in an emergency, or at a place or places designated by the General Manager.
 - 5.1.6 To allow waste from vessel washing to discharge into the Lake or along the shore except into a waste disposal system that has been approved by the General Manager.
 - 5.1.7 To wade or swim in, or have body contact with the waters of the Lake or streams or to engage in any aquaplane, parasail, or windsail activities in, on, or over the Lake.

- 5.1.8 To operate, or permit to be operated, any vessel under that person's supervision to tow or pull an aquaplane or similar device.
- 5.1.9 To permit any animal to enter into or remain within the Park unless the animal is on a leash of no more than six feet in length and under the immediate control of a person or confined in a vehicle.
 - 5.1.9.1 To permit an animal under the person's control to remain outside a tent, camper or enclosed vehicle during the quiet hours.
 - 5.1.9.2 To keep any noisy, vicious or dangerous animal, or one that is disturbing to other persons, as determined by Casitas Personnel.
 - 5.1.9.3 To allow any animal to be within 50 feet laterally of the shores of the Lake or streams of the Park or on a vessel on the lake with the exception of dogs, which are allowed on vessels.
 - 5.1.9.4 To have more than two such animals per campsite.
 - 5.1.9.5 To abandon any animal in the Park.

5.2 **Boating Regulations.**

- 5.2.1 It shall be unlawful for any person to have, use, or operate a vessel in the Park that does not meet the minimum requirements for, or that does not have a Park boat permit.
- 5.2.2 All vessel owners and/or operators intending to launch take any type of vessel into the Park waters shall be required to complete a written survey provided by the Department, and declare under penalty of perjury that all of the information provided is true and correct.
 - 5.2.2.1 The Board may establish and have the Department enforce criteria, and/or rules and regulations, that will cause the Department to exclude and/or deny access to the Park by vessels boats and watercraft that have been launched into waters known to be contaminated with invasive aquatic species (including but not limited to quagga and zebra mussels, hydrilla) or if the Department determines by its inspection that an invasive aquatic species is present or may be present on and/or in the vessel and/or the vessel's trailer. The Department reserves the right to deny public access to the Park based on any potential of Lake contamination by the vessel.
- 5.2.3 Each vessel, prior to being issued a boat permit, may be inspected by Casitas Personnel to determine that it meets the following standards:

- 5.2.3.1 It shall possess sufficient buoyancy to keep the vessel afloat if overturned or swamped when loaded to capacity.
- 5.2.3.2 It shall be not less than 11 feet in length or narrower in width than 4 feet nor over 35 feet in length, centerline measurement. It shall have a minimum of 1 foot of freeboard and, if fitted with a motor, shall have a capacity of not more that 400 horsepower. Non standard vessels may be issued with a special boat permit.
- 5.2.3.3 It shall be in a seaworthy, clean, dry and sanitary condition.
- 5.2.3.4 It shall be a vessel of standard design as determined by the General Manager.
- 5.2.3.5 It shall be a vessel not possessing a holding tank or toilet unless such is sealed or otherwise rendered inoperable or designed so that no wastes can be discharged into the Lake.
- 5.2.3.6 It shall not be equipped with any motor or other means of propulsion machinery beyond its safe power capacity, taking into consideration the type and construction of such watercraft and other existing operating conditions.
- 5.2.4 Each vessel issued a permit hereunder or in the Park without a valid permit shall be subject to re-inspection and re-evaluation at any time the vessel is in or enters the Park to ascertain whether such vessel is properly rated and complies with the regulations for granting a boat permit. If any vessel, upon such inspection and re-evaluation, is found not to meet the requirements of this Ordinance, then the permit for such vessel shall be revoked and the vessel shall be removed from the Park or impounded in the Park or impounded on the Lake at the owner's expense until the deficiency is corrected.
 - 5.2.4.1 No person shall move, use or tamper with any impounded vessel, vehicle or equipment.
 - 5.2.4.2 No person shall move, use or tamper with any device used to impound a vessel, vehicle or equipment.
- 5.2.5 It shall be unlawful for any person within the Park:
 - 5.2.5.1 To allow a minor under twelve (12) years of age to occupy a vessel upon the Lake unless such minor is wearing a Coast Guard approved child's vest type life preserver.
 - 5.2.5.2 To operate a vessel within a prohibited area designated by markers on

the Lake or posted on the bulletin board at the ramp.

- 5.2.5.3 To tie a vessel to, or mutilate, damage, or move from position, any buoy or connecting line, chain, or cable placed or installed on the Lake.
- 5.2.5.4 To operate any vessel without allowing at least 250 feet clearance behind trolling fishing vessels so as to avoid fouling the trolling lines. Trolling fishing vessels shall display a white flag not less than two feet square, to give adequate warning of such vessel's trolling activities.
- 5.2.5.5 To operate or navigate any commercial vessel while carrying passengers for hire without a Casitas special use permit or Casitas concession contract.
- 5.2.5.6 To take, use or operate any vessel without the specific consent of the owner or person in charge thereof, or to be an accessory to the taking, or use or operation of any vessel without such consent of the owner or person in charge thereof.
- 5.2.5.7 To operate a siren on any vessel used, operated or driven or propelled on the Lake except a vessel used by authorized Casitas Personnel in the performance of their duties.
- 5.2.5.8 To launch, retrieve or land any vessel except at an approved dock, ramp or such beaching areas as may be specifically designated by the General Manager.
- 5.2.5.9 To keep any vessel on shore overnight except in the designated area.
- 5.2.5.10 To operate or occupy any vessel between the time of sunset and sunrise unless a special use permit is issued by the General Manager.
- 5.2.5.11 To allow any person to ride or sit on either the gunwales or on the decking over the bow of the vessel while underway, unless such vessel is provided with adequate guards or railing to prevent passengers from being lost overboard. Nothing in this section shall be construed to mean that passengers or other persons aboard a vessel cannot occupy the decking or the bow of the vessel to moor or cast off from a landing, or for any other necessary purpose.
- 5.2.5.12 It shall be unlawful for the owner of any vessel or any person having such in his charge or control to authorize or knowingly permit the same to be operated by any person who is incapable of operating such watercraft under the prevailing circumstances for any reason, including, but not limited to inexperience or physical or mental disability.

5.2.5.13 To operate, occupy or load any boat beyond the safe carrying capacity of such boat.

5.2.6 Speed Limits.

- 5.2.6.1 It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a vessel on the Lake at speeds in excess of those posted.
- 5.2.6.2 No person shall operate a vessel at a speed greater than is reasonable or prudent having due regard for weather, visibility and the number of other vessels on the Lake, and in no event at a speed which endangers the safety of persons or property.
- 5.2.6.3 The following specific speed restrictions shall apply:
 - 5.2.6.3.1 Maximum of forty (40) miles per hour sunrise to sunset, except as qualified below.
 - 5.2.6.3.2 Five (5) miles per hour within 200 feet of any vessel landing, dock, ramp, or beaching area.
 - 5.2.6.3.3 Five (5) miles per hour within 100 feet of any vessel not underway.
- 5.2.7 The General Manager is authorized to designate restricted speed zones for the Lake as deemed desirable for the safety of persons or property.
- 5.2.8 It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in a boat regatta, race, tournament or exhibition on the Lake without approval of the General Manager.
- 5.2.9 The General Manager is authorized to close the Lake or portions thereof to boating for good and sufficient reasons including but not limited to the following:
 - 5.2.9.1 Dangerous water or weather conditions.
 - 5.2.9.2 Unsatisfactory ramp, parking or roadway conditions.
 - 5.2.9.3 Construction or movement of ramp facilities.
 - 5.2.9.4 Special activities or events.

5.2.10Any person having, using or operating a vessel in the Lake Casitas Recreation Area shall abide by the applicable sections of the California Administrative Code Title 14, California State Boating Law and the provisions of this Ordinance.

5.2.11It shall be unlawful to land or operate any amphibious seaplane on the lake unless

authorized by the General Manager.

5.3 Vehicle Regulations.

- 5.3.1 It shall be unlawful for any person within the Park:
 - 5.3.1.1 To operate a motor vehicle at a speed in excess of 15 miles per hour or to exceed 5 miles per hour in a picnic area, campground or parking lot, or to exceed the speed limit posted by the Department in any area.
 - 5.3.1.2 To drive a vehicle at a speed greater than is reasonable or prudent having due regard for weather, visibility, traffic, the surface and width of the roadway, and in no event at a speed, which endangers the safety of persons or property.
 - 5.3.1.3 To operate a motor vehicle except on designated roadways and parking areas, unless otherwise directed by the General Manager.
 - 5.3.1.4 To throw or otherwise dispose of any burning material, trash, waste or other debris from a vehicle.
 - 5.3.1.5 To park a vehicle in other than a designated parking area, or to park or leave parked a vehicle in a parking lot between the hours of sunset and sunrise, unless otherwise permitted by the General Manager. Vehicles parked in unauthorized areas will be towed away at the owner's expense.
 - 5.3.1.6 To drive a vehicle in a careless or reckless fashion so as to endanger the said vehicle, it's occupants, or any person, equipment, facilities, or property.
 - 5.3.1.7 To park more than two (2) vehicles per campsite without specific authority from the General Manager.
- 5.3.2 The Board may establish special speed zones and they may be revised from time to time by resolution of the Board.
- 5.3.3 The General Manager is authorized to close any Park roadways or reduce the speed limit on any such roadways for good and sufficient reasons including but not limited to the following:
 - 5.3.3.1 Construction or maintenance of facilities.
 - 5.3.3.2 Dangerous roadway conditions.
 - 5.3.3.3 Special activities or events.

- 5.3.4 Any person having, using or operating a motor vehicle, vehicle, or trailer in the Park shall abide by all applicable sections of the California Vehicle Code.
- 5.4 **General and Conservation.** It shall be unlawful for any person within the Park:
 - 5.4.1 To receive, bring, or cause to be brought into the Recreation Area any fish, crustacean, amphibian or aquatic plant from any place for the purposes of propagation or use as fish bait,.
 - 5.4.2 To cut, pick, mutilate or destroy any vegetation, except when authorized by the General Manager.
 - 5.4.3 To remove soil or rock except when authorized by the General Manager.
 - 5.4.4 To mutilate, vandalize, or destroy any equipment or facility of others.
 - 5.4.5 To receive, bring, or cause to be brought into the Recreation Area, or use, possess, or discharge, fireworks, firearms, or other explosives other than fuels except when authorized by the General Manager.
 - 5.4.6 To possess or discharge a firearm, bow and arrow, projectile launching device, air or gas weapon or any device capable of injuring or killing any animal or damaging or destroying any property except when authorized by the General Manager.
 - 5.4.7 To build, ignite, or utilize fires except in fire pits, stoves, incinerators, or other facilities provided by Casitas for the use of the public, except in portable barbecue pits or portable stoves of a type approved by the General Manager in camping or picnicking areas.
 - 5.4.8 To leave any fire unattended or to fail to put out a fire prior to departure, or to leave a fire burning unattended while a person sleeps.
 - 5.4.9 To molest, injure, or kill any animal or bird, or to allow any child or animal under that person's supervision to molest, injure or kill any animal or bird, except that controlled hunting may be authorized by resolution of the Board.
 - 5.4.10 To bring into, possess, or use any firearm or other weapon except for peace officers when in a duty status, except as may be authorized by resolution of the Board.
 - 5.4.11 To possess fish in number or size, including but not limited to, trout, catfish, pan fish or bass, other than as specified in the Lake Casitas Recreation Area Fisheries Management Plan, as periodically amended.
 - 5.4.12 No person who has not attained the age of twenty-one years shall use or possess any alcoholic beverage within the park.

- 5.5 **Closed Areas.** It shall be unlawful for any person:
 - 5.5.1 To take fish or attempt to fish except during the posted daylight hours when the Lake is open unless otherwise posted for special events.
 - 5.5.2 To fish in an area or on a structure posted by Casitas, "Closed to Fishing".
 - 5.5.3 To enter any area of the Park which is posted by Casitas against entry or is designated as a closed area.
 - 5.5.4 To remain on or re-enter Casitas' premises or facilities after Casitas Personnel have specifically withdrawn consent and given notice thereof for a person to utilize said Casitas' premises or facilities.
 - 5.5.5 To operate any aircraft of any nature or parachute on Casitas' premises without prior written permission from the General Manager.
 - 5.5.6 To fail to obey signs posted by Casitas.
 - 5.5.7 To use a loudspeaker, public address system, or amplifier without a valid special event permit or written permission from the General Manager.

5.6 **Horses.** It shall be unlawful for any person to bring a horse into the Recreation Area without a valid special event permit or written permission of the General Manager.

5.7 Camping.

- 5.7.1 It shall be unlawful for any person to occupy a campground without first obtaining a camping permit or possessing a valid camping permit. Camping permits shall be issued on the basis of per camping day, per campsite and per vehicle.
- 5.7.2 Campsites will be assigned at the entrance gate. Camping units and camp gear left on campground without first obtaining a camping permit will be removed at the owner's expense.
- 5.7.3 Camping is limited to fourteen (14) days per party, during any calendar month period except that the General Manager is authorized to extend the limit up to twenty-eight (28) days on a case-by-case basis. Campers and their equipment must leave the Recreation Area for a minimum of seventy-two hours (72) in order to be issued a permit for an additional fourteen (14) day camping period. Special permits may be issued by the General Manager for extended stays beyond the above-described limits.
- 5.7.4 If, in the discretion of Casitas Personnel assigning campsites, a particular campsite is of sufficient size, a maximum of two vehicles and eight (8) persons may be permitted to camp within the same campsite.

- 5.7.5 Campers may use plumbing hook-ups, TV and electrical hookups by permit only.
- 5.7.6 It shall be unlawful for any person to disturb the peace and quiet of other Park visitors in any manner.
- 5.7.7 It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of eighteen (18) years to occupy a campsite between the hours of 10:00 pm and 8:00 am unless accompanied by a responsible adult.
- 5.7.8 It shall be unlawful for any person to construct or hang a clothesline inside the Park.

5.8 **Commercial Activity.** It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to engage in any commercial activity within the Park, except by permit or as authorized by the General Manager.

5.9 Water Park.

- 5.9.1 It shall be unlawful for any person to fail to obey the directions of any Casitas Personnel with regard to the rules and regulations of the operation of the Water Park.
- 5.9.2 It shall be unlawful for any persons to remain in the Water Park facility after their respective permits have been revoked by Casitas Personnel for failure to follow any rules or regulations.
- 5.9.3 It shall be unlawful for any person to bring the following into the Water Park: glass containers, alcoholic beverages or controlled substances.
- 5.9.4 It shall be unlawful for any person to enter into the waters of the Water Park wearing bathing apparel that is not approved by Casitas Personnel.
- 5.9.5 It shall be unlawful for any person to distract or otherwise interfere with the duties of any Casitas Personnel.
- 5.9.6 It shall be unlawful for any person to enter into the Water Park without paying all applicable fees and charges.

6. CONSTITUTIONALITY. If any competent court shall find any portion of this Ordinance unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of any other portion thereof.

7. **REPEAL OF ORDINANCE NO. 07-01, As Amended.** This Ordinance supersedes and repeals the provisions of Casitas Municipal Water District Ordinance No. 07-01, As Amended.

8. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance becomes effective this 24th day of March, 2010.

Recommendation

Adopt resolution to release APN 033-0-150-555 and APN 032-0-202-115 from Casitas Municipal Water District service area provided said parcels are formally annexed into the Ventura River County Water District service area.

Background and Discussion

The Ventura River County Water District (VRCWD) has approached Casitas with the desire to clean up the service area boundaries of our respective agencies by annexing two properties into the VRCWD boundaries. The VRCWD desires to move through the LAFCo process and fund the annexations. The two properties that are to be considered at this time are now within the Casitas service area. The Casitas position in the past for such parcels has been to have VRCWD serve water to such parcels, but the parcel would remain a Casitas customer and be billed by Casitas. This approach has led to double administrative billing process between the two water purveyors. Recently, Casitas and VRCWD have considered how any one parcel is best served by either agency, on a case by case basis.


The VRCWD is also proceeding with other boundary clean up on several other parcels that had been transferred to Casitas in the 1990's, but not removed from the VRCWD service area boundaries. A majority of these parcels are in the Creek Road area in Oak View. The VRCWD action would remove these parcels from the VRCWD jurisdiction for voting and taxing roles. The attached exhibits illustrate the changes in service area boundaries that are sought by VRCWD.

The first property referred to by VRCWD as the "Parker Tank Site", APN 033-0-150-555, is located far and away from any Casitas infrastructure. In fact, the VRCWD's Parker Tank and pump plant is the entirety of the parcel. There is no reason that Casitas would need to serve water to this parcel. It is recommended that this parcel be released to VRCWD for annexation to their district boundaries.

The second parcel, APN 032-0-202-115, is a drainage mitigation parcel on Burnham Road that is owned by the Ventura County Watershed Protection District. In 2003, Casitas arranged with VRCWD to provide the water service to this parcel. VRCWD reads the water meter and bills Casitas for the water use, and then Casitas bills the Ventura County Watershed Protection District. There are no Casitas facilities in the street adjacent to the parcel and it is not likely that there ever will be any Casitas facilities in the area of the parcel. There is a 0.47 acre-foot allocation for the parcel that could be considered for transfer to VRCWD on behalf of the parcel. It is recommended that this parcel be released to VRCWD for annexation to their boundaries.

Ventura River County Water District is willing to annex and serve these parcels, however, Casitas must first release each parcel and then Ventura River County Water District must formally annex each parcel into Ventura River County Water District's service area. Mr. Rapp, VRCWD has hinted at Casitas providing some funding for the annexation cost. The change of boundaries is for the benefit of the VRCWD and therefore funding assistance by Casitas is not recommended.

As I'm sure you're aware, Lake Casitas in Ventura County is a renowned fishing and recreation resource that attracts fishing enthusiasts from around the State and nation. A key element of that fishing resource is trout fishing. Lake Casitas relies on the stocking of hatchery fish to sustain a viable population of trout in the lake, and for that to occur, a DF&W biological assessment is urgently needed.

Lake Casitas has waited for four years for the preparation of the needed biological assessment. Disappointingly, Casitas staff was recently informed that a DFW biological assessment is not even scheduled. This is simply unacceptable for a fishing resource as valuable and popular as Lake Casitas, and presently puts at risk the Lake Casitas trout fishery.

I respectfully urge your attention to this issue and the prompt scheduling and completion of a biological assessment for trout stocking at Lake Casitas.

I strongly urge the inclusion of Lake Casitas for a biological assessment for trout stocking. Despite ongoing conversations over the past four years, and a moratorium since 2010, Lake Casitas has not been included on the list of scheduled assessments for spring 2014 as originally expected. The biological assessment by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife is a key first step so that the National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) can do their biological opinion, and explore any necessary mitigation measures to ensure that there are no adverse environmental impacts.

The timely completion of an assessment is a priority since delays present a significant impact to the recreational opportunities that Lake Casitas provides. These activities generate significant economic and civic opportunities for the surrounding community. At the 2013 Kids Fishing Day, more than 400 youth signed in to participate. In 2012, nearly 5,000 boats entered Lake Casitas from outside the Recreation Area. There are 120 boats per month in dry storage, and the Marina concessionaire reported that they rent nearly 3,600 boats annually and have 110 boat rental slips per month. These numbers do not include the many people who do not own boats and utilize Lake Casitas for shoreline fishing.

In order to ensure continued public access to this important resource, please promptly schedule and complete a biological assessment at Lake Casitas. If you have any further questions, please contact my staff member, KK Holland, at (805) 988-1940.

Dear President Sutton and Commissioners:

The Casitas Municipal Water District has been recently informed by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife that Lake Casitas was not included in the recent Biological Assessments that were conducted for the stocking of hatchery fish in California lakes and reservoirs. The inability to stock hatchery fish, including rainbow trout, in Lake Casitas has a significant impact on the local and regional recreational angling opportunities and economies. The Casitas Municipal Water District urges the CDFW to take immediate action to include Lake Casitas in the current Biological Assessments for rainbow trout stocking.

Lake Casitas is an important angling resource for thousands of anglers annually. Of the anglers surveyed recently at Lake Casitas, 48% are angling for rainbow trout, 78% of the anglers are fishing Lake Casitas monthly to weekly, and 57% are traveling from outside of the Ventura River basin. It is clear that Lake Casitas is important and significant to the local and regional anglers.

The Casitas Municipal Water District is acutely aware of the issues surrounding the stocking of rainbow trout near protected habitat of steelhead in the Southern California DPS. Millions of dollars have been spent for the enhancement and protection of the Southern California Steelhead Trout on the Ventura River, and significant scientific work is ongoing to preclude the extinction of the Steelhead Trout. We want those efforts to succeed as well. However, we feel that taking the precaution to prevent genetic inbreeding by only stocking sterile triploid rainbow trout is logical and effective. Moreover, the likelihood of habitat competition is limited due to the low chance of stocked rainbow trout escaping from Lake Casitas during spill conditions. These are examples of the many reasonable considerations for a Biological Assessment is scheduled and conducted for Lake Casitas.

Casitas Municipal Water District respectfully requests your support to facilitate CDFW to conduct a Biological Assessment at Lake Casitas in a timely manner.

BACKGROUND AND OVERVIEW:

1. <u>Roll Call</u>. Directors Kaiser and Hicks, General Manager Steve Wickstrum Park Services Manager Carol Belser and PSO Aaron Wall Principal Engineer Neil Cole and Assistant Engineer Todd Evans Public: Eric Gillett, Wendy Gillett, Dee Bennett, and Gary Wolfe

2. **Public comments**. None.

3. Board/Management comments.

Carol Belser informed the Committee that she had been informed by Dr. Dwayne Maxwell, Department of Fish and Wildlife (DFW), that Lake Casitas could no longer stock fish in Lake Casitas, pursuant to the lawsuit against DFW for statewide stocking of trout near or adjacent to anadromous streams and the requirement to have a Biological Assessment performed at Lake Casitas. The Committee was informed that there is to be a California Fish and Game Commission meeting at the Ventura Crown Plaza on Wednesday, October 2, and that appropriate Casitas representation attend this meeting. There is a need to make a Biological Assessment a priority for Lake Casitas.

4. Discussion on the draft agreement with the Rowing Club.

Eric Gillett had several questions and/or clarifications to two terms of the agreement, (1) the supervision of minors and (2) the reporting of infractions. The discussions seemed to clarify responsibilities and the need for good communication between the Club and Casitas staff. The agreement is likely to move forward to the Board for consideration of approval.

5. Discussion on the end of season report for the Water Adventure.

PSO Aaron Wall informed the Committee that the format of the next annual report on the Water Adventure is likely to be more direct with numbers and less picture oriented. The time spent on the report will be reduced and more effort on the preparation of the Water Adventure for next season's opening. The Committee members expressed appreciation for the content of the previous reports and understood the need to be direct with important information.

6. Update on the Zipline.

Carol Belser has had more discussions with one zipline contractor regarding potential sites for a zipline. The discussion will be limited in the future unless a contract is developed to either have consultation on the design or contract to operate a zipline facility. The Committee continues with interest in additional recreational activities for the Lake Casitas Recreation Area.

7. Update on awarded Grants.

Carol Belser reported that the Bureau of Reclamation is continuing to find additional funding assistance for the Lake Casitas Recreation Area. A list of projects from the ten-year capital plan has been the source of projects considered by the USBR for funding assistance.

8. Discussion regarding the front entrance.

Todd Evans presented to the Committee preliminary drawings of the revisions to the Lake Casitas Recreation Area entrance gate. The drawings illustrate the replacement of the existing roof structure, kiosks, and traffic routing features. Staff will be refining the project, preparing specification, and developing cost estimates. It is desired to get this project completed before April 1, 2014. The Committee encouraged staff to continue with the work to improve the entrance gate.

9. Update on the use of the Ojai Trolley in the Lake Casitas Recreation Area.

Carol Belser reported that the summer Saturdays during which there was no charge for riding the trolley, the ridership numbers ballooned to an average of 264 riders per day. The trolley program was a trial program by the city of Ojai and Lake Casitas Recreation Area to encourage transportation and activity options to the tourist visiting the area. The increase of ridership during free days is encouraging enough that there may be sufficient justification to continue the program and ask for continued assistance from the Ventura Transportation Commission.

10. Progress on Shoreline Cleanup.

Carol Belser informed the Committee that staff has made significant progress in removing objects that have recent surfaced in the drying areas of Lake Casitas. There are a few items that will need a backhoe to lift, but will only be attempted when the ground becomes firm enough to support the machinery. A shoreline cleanup has been scheduled for September 29th, 9:30 to 10:30 am.

11. Discussion on Monthly Reporting Numbers.

Carol Belser discussed the method by which monthly numbers are calculated and presented. The method is consistent with the practices of the Bureau of Reclamation.

12. Review of Incidents and Comments.

PSM Belser reported that there had been a few minor incidents over the past month.
