Minutes of the Casitas Municipal Water District Board Meeting Held January 25, 2012

A meeting of the Board of Directors was held January 25, 2012 at Casitas' Office, Oak View, California. Directors Baggerly, Word, Hicks, Bergen and Kaiser were present. Also present were Steve Wickstrum, General Manager, Rebekah Vieira, Clerk of the Board, and Attorney, John Mathews. There were three staff members and no members of the public in attendance. President Baggerly led the group in the flag salute.

1. <u>Public Comments</u>

Mr. Mathews gave kudos to Ron Merckling regarding his representation of the district and the great speakers that he lined up for the AWA Symposium in April.

2. <u>General Manager comments.</u>

Mr. Wickstrum reported that he would be meeting with the Bureau of Reclamation and the US Forest Service tomorrow regarding improvements at Casitas Fire Station, improving the water pipe and the septic system. Discussions will also cover responsibilities on CRW lands. Next week there is a meeting with various representatives regarding state water.

Mr. Wickstrum also reported on his attendance at Matilija Fine Sediment committee meetings. The Coastal Conservancy has fronted the money for this effort to bring in experts to better look at the fine sediments. One thing that hasn't been realized over 12 years of review is that they stopped drilling and have 25 – 45 feet of organic matter. That is the source of what needs to be looked at further. There were presentations on other dams that were removed recently and comments that the water coming off was clean. Experts in charge of those jobs refrained and said you have seen the very start of it and haven't seen the materials that bring high turbidity, therefore, don't jump to conclusions. I hope this group will work through this. There were good suggestions over the two days. The notching was brought up and the problem Brian McClure saw is that if you notch it down it will bring the courser gravels and overlay on top of the finer sediment and mix in and make it difficult to deal with the fine sediment.

BACKGROUND AND OVERVIEW:

1. <u>Roll Call</u>. Director Bergen and Director Word Staff – Steve Wickstrum and Denise Collin

2. **Public comments**. None.

3. Board/Management comments.

The General Manager reported that staff received a bid from CD Lyon Construction, Inc., for the refurbishment of the Casitas Dam intake screen #7 and the articulating cart in the amount of \$18,092. A key issue with these elements is the removal of old red-lead coatings which is to be performed at the contractor's shop. It was noted that two other contractors declined to submit a bid due to the requirement to perform coating work offsite. The project is budgeted and within the approval range of the General Manager, therefore the project bid will be accepted and approved by the General Manager.

The Committee noted that the article in the Ojai Valley News stated that the California Public Utilities Commission is planning to hold two public meetings in Ojai on February 27, regarding the Golden State Water Company rate increases.

4. <u>Review of the Financial Statement for December 2011.</u>

The Committee reviewed the November 2011 financial statement and asked questions regarding various elements of the statement. Denise Collin noted a high number of hang-tags and shutoffs for unpaid water bills during this month. Staff are working with the public on time extensions and payment plans where and when warranted.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that Casitas purchase three (3) E-Z-Go Sport II gasoline powered carts, the cost for two (2) of which will be reimbursed by the Bureau of Reclamation.

BACKGROUND AND OVERVIEW:

At the January 26, 2012 Recreation Committee meeting, staff recommended that Casitas lease three (3) gas powered carts. However, after discussion, the Committee suggested exploring the possibility of purchasing the carts instead of leasing them.

The Bureau of Reclamation has agreed to purchase two (2) carts (through a reimbursement) for a total of approximately sixteen thousand one hundred seventy seven dollars (\$16,177.00). Casitas' cost to purchase the one (1) remaining cart to meet staff's needs would be approximately eight thousand eighty eight dollars (\$8,088.00) and is within the budgeted amount.

The Bureau of Reclamation will retain ownership of the two carts it purchases. Casitas will be responsible for maintaining each cart and providing an annual status report to the Bureau. We have been advised by the supplier that the approximate "shelf life" of the gas powered carts is 7-8 years with average use. This purchase is a very desirable alternative to leasing the carts or purchasing the carts at Casitas' full cost and is therefore recommended for approval.

BACKGROUND AND OVERVIEW:

Lisa Taylor Crouse was a tenant of the property located at 11415 Creek Road and has since moved out. Ms. Crouse was informed by the District of a large leak on September 2, 2011. On September 9, 2011 the Owner of the property, Cary Jones informed us the meter was stuck, the meter was rebuilt and advised there was still a leak. Two small leaks were repaired after hiring a leak detection service, but after the rebuild of the meter and repairs a leak was still present. A Leak Relief request was received on 10/07/2011 and denied because the service was still leaking and the request came from the owner of the property, not the tenant who is responsible for the balance due.

The Accounting Manager also denied a new tenant opening service in their name until all leaks were detected and repaired by the owner, Mr. Jones. Mr. Jones turned off the water at the meter while searching for leaks; he found the last leak and repaired it on December 19, 2011.

Mr. Jones had several leaks which were difficult to find and repair, all leaks were underground and undetectable. A Leak Relief request was received from Ms. Crouse on January 9, 2012. Ms. Crouse is requesting Leak Relief as well as further financial consideration based on the fact that the meter was stuck and that the read was incorrect as to the actual amount of water loss during the leak period.

Administration

Proposals were opened on December 20, 2011 for Recreation Area long term concession agreements that included: the Marina (marina, café and bait and tackle), the Park Store and the Casitas Water Adventure Temporary Seasonal Snack Bar. Staff are in process of evaluating the proposals and will review the proposals with the Recreation Committee to then forward to the Board for consideration.

The Park Services Manager addressed the Department of Fish and Game Commission at their regularly scheduled meeting in San Diego on December 15 to speak in opposition of a DFG staff recommendation that if approved would have made it virtually impossible for Casitas to plant fish in Lake Casitas. The agenda item attracted the attention of many other agencies who also expressed opposition to the proposal resulting in the DFG Commission rejecting staff recommendation.

Boating

There were 11 cables sold for new inspections, 31 vessel re-inspections, and 556 boats were retagged.

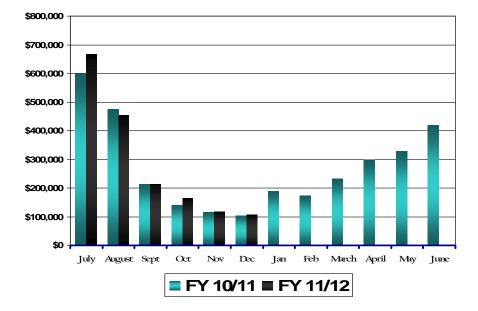
Five failed the first inspection. Shoreline fishing at night was held December 9 and 10.

Lake Casitas received the second of three deliveries of Nebraska Tail Walkers (triploid rainbow trout) on December 20. Trout fishing continued to be very good and trout anglers seem pleased with the planting.

PSO and APSO staff are continuing to collect data for the creel survey and an opinion survey the first week of each month. The data collected is analyzed by Scott Lewis and will be used in the Fisheries Management Plan.

First rain of season not enough

Ojai Valley residents got a chance to don rain gear over the weekend for the first time this season. Small storms dumped their payloads on the valley on Saturday and Monday, and puddles began to form on street corners and to form on street corners and gutters. As those puddles dry up however, Ojai still faces drought conditions. National Weather Service experts from the Ventura County station say the valley has seen less those 50 percent

has seen less than 50 percent of its average rainfall since

"We have La Niña conditions which usually leads to drier weather," said NWS meteorologist Ryan Kittell. "Right now we're running at about half of what we would normally see."

Although a rainy weekend might be an inconvenience to some locals, seasonal rains are vital to the valley and its residents. The lack of substantial precipitation can make life much more difficult for those in the agriculture business, and can even have grave effects on the valley's water

"I don't like irrigating in the middle of January," said citrus ranch owner Jim Coultas, who has a well on his property tapping into the local aquifer. "We're not supposed to have to do that.

Coultas says that when the valley sees multiple dry years in a row, residents and business owners that use wells have to start buying water from local purveyors like Casitas Municipal Water District or Golden State Water

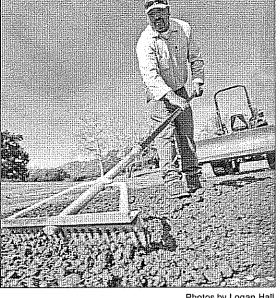
'Company. "The big concern," he said, "is if the aquifer gets depleted and my well dries out, then I gotta go back on Casitas again."

Supplementing well water with water from companies like Golden State and Casitas can get expensive for those like Coultas, whose ranch encompasses 135 acres, 60 of which are used for agriculture.

"Two or three years ago we had a real dry winter," said Coultas who h as spent his whole life working his ranch. "I had to irrigate in October and September that year. My water bill was like five-grand a month."

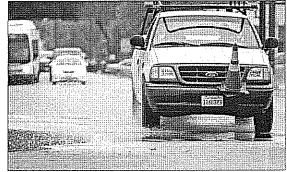
The benefit of Mother Nature's watering can goes beyond potential financial

"When you irrigate for long periods," continued Coultas, "there will be a build-up of salts in the water - things like magnesium, calcium and so forth.

CPUC grants Ojai water hearing

The voices of Ojai citizens are going to be heard by the government.

After Ojai's request for a hearing with the California Public Utilities Commission was rejected last year, the city has been given notice that a public participation hearing will be held in Ojai regarding Golden

held in Ojai regarding Golden State Water Company's proposal to raise its water rates. Steve McClary, assistant to city manager Rob Clark, confirmed that the CPUC — which regulates utilities like Golden State — contacted the city this week, setting a date and time for the hearing. McClary time for the hearing. McClary said that the hearing will take place on Feb. 27 at two separate times — 2 and 6 p.m. — but that the location hasn't been decided yet

Although he said that he hasn't seen anything in writing, McClary did receive confirmation from the office of the commission's Administrative Law Judge via phone that a hearing will take place in Ojai. "I consider that sufficiently official," he said on Thursday.

For Ojai residents paying Golden State for water, the deci-sion by the CPUC offers a chance for citizens to volce their opposition to GSWC's rate opposition to GSWC's rate increase request. If the water purveyor gets what it is asking for, Ojai's water rates will increase 25 percent by 2015. During the upcoming hearing, locals will get the chance to speak directly to representatives of the CPUC to state their reasons for opposing the poten-tial rate increase. tial rate increase.

McClary stated that the city, with recommendations from FL.O.W., suggested that the hearing be held in Chaparral Auditorium, but the decision would rest with the commission,

Blatz and McClary both point out that there is still a long way to go for the citizens in their fight against Golden State, a forprofit corporation. Blatz said that FL.O.W. is continuing to increase its momentum and will be working more closely with the city in the next month. We're putting together some things that will further formalize the city's support of EL.O.W.," said Blatz.

The city is expanding its involvement by finding out what other cities in California are doing to fight Golden State's latest rate case. McClary said he attended a meeting in Claremont that outlined a plan for five cities to "pool their resources" together. He stated that aside from Claremont, the cities of Barstow, Cypress, Placentia and Stanton have pledged \$5,000 each to support the cause. He also said that Claremont is going a step further by pledging funds to begin the process of acquiring the water company and having the city of Claremont take over.

The city will also be meeting in closed session with attorney Jeffery Oderman, who won the case for the city of Felton in a takeover of their water system from California-Ámerican Water, a subsidiary of the German corporation RWE. The meeting between the city and Oderman will take place in two w according to McClary. weeks

Casitas pays off dam debt, lowers property taxes

8, 1960 to approve a payment of \$31.4 million to be paid over 50 years to the United State Bureau of Reclamation. The funds were allocated for building the Ventura River Project that included the Casitas Dam, Robles Canal, Robles Diversion Facility, and pipeline system. During the January 25, 2012 regular meeting of the Casitas Board of Directors, the Board signed the last payment of \$943,645.96 for delivery to the Bureau.

The repayment dollars have been collected from property owners within the district boundaries as a specific tax for Casitas. Property owners will now see a decrease in the tax collected for the Casitas Municipal Water District. The remaining amount left on the property tax line item will be for the annual debt

Notching Matilija dam may be answer to silt

The vast majority of the Matilija Dam still stands, shouldering its payload of water and silt. But a recent gathering of officials, concerned with the prospect of tearing down the defunct structure, are shedding new light on what is to be the

next best step. The team of officials — dubbed the Technical Advisory Committee — met Jan. 12 and 13 and included officials from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Association Fisheries, Department of Fish and Game, Army Corps of Engineers, National Fish and Wildlife Service, University of California at Santa Barbara, U.S. Bureau of Bardametica, Statistica, Statis Reclamation, Stoeker Ecological, Matilija Coalition and Casitas Municipal Water District,

CMWD general manager Steve Wickstrum said he thinks bringing in a few fresh faces to look at the issue will be beneficial in determining the best way to deal with the dam removal process. Wickstrum emphasized that maintaining water quality and supply in Lake Casitas is the most important concern for the Water District.

"We have to look at the mate-rial as it moves downstream and we're concerned with water supply," Wickstrum said. "If the nutrient loads and dissolved oxygen result in an algae bloom it could result in very expensive treatment, so we need to avoid those scenarios.'

"We're looking at ways to reduce costs and make this thing feasible from a cost perspective," Jenkin said.

Recent dam removals in the perpetually rainy Pacific Northwest offered perspective and room for more debate about the best ways to deal with silt. Jenkin thinks notching the dam once per year down to the silt line could be a good way to move forward.

All of the dams removed in the northwest have used natural transport to move incremental sediment out," Jenkin said.

"But obviously it rains all the time in the northwest and here we sit around and wait for the rain. So that makes things different." very

Since the mid-January meeting, the members of the TAC have continued to communicate. Jenkin and Wickstrum both said they anticipate that a consultant will be brought in within the next few months. That consultant will be funded by the Cali-fornia Coastal Conser-vancy, and should result in a final recommendation of the next steps in the dam the next steps in the dam removal process.
