Re: Review of Board Committee Policy and Meeting Assignments

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Directors review Resolution No. 06-54, Resolution Setting the Policy on Committee Meetings According to Government Code Section 54954(a), and make assignments for each committee.

BACKGROUND AND OVERVIEW:

During the regular meeting of the Board of Directors on December 15, 2010, it was the Board's request to be provided information regarding the various committees, so that the Board may make assignments of members, dates, times and place for each committee. It was further suggested that this action be taken at the first Board meeting in January 2011, rather than during a Board Planning Day.

The attached Resolution No. 06-54 provides the District's policy on committee meetings, summarizes the general subject matter for each committee, and establishes the authority for each committee.

In general, each committee meets once a month at a scheduled time. The following has been the 2010 assignments and schedule for the various committee meetings:

Recreation	1 st Monday, 9:00 AM	Hicks/Baggerly

Executive	1 st Thursday, 8:00 AM	Handley/Kaiser

It has been customary for the President and Vice-President of the Board to be assigned to the Executive Committee and each director is assigned to two committees. The meeting schedule has been based on the availability of committee members and avoiding conflict with other scheduled meetings.

In addition to the general subject matter stated in there resolution, there are several priority issues that we will be addressing during the 2011 meetings, as follows:

Finance – changes in State tax funding of special districts;

Water Resources – continued review of the 2011 Urban Water Management Plan and revisions to the Rates and regulations for water service, State Water issues;

Recreation – fisheries management plan, Resource Management Plan review and

implementation;

Personnel – employee negotiations, revisions to the personnel policies and manual.

The Board has also established several ad hoc committees to address special issues not directly covered by the standing committees. The ad hoc committees are developed, assigned and dissolved on an as-needed basis. Previous ad hoc committees have included safety and quagga mussel issues. At this time, the key ad hoc committee (Baggerly/Word) is working through Bureau contracts for the safety of dam repayment negotiations and the recreation authority negotiations.

RESOLUTION NO. 06-54

RESOLUTION SETTING THE POLICY ON COMMITTEE MEETINGS ACCORDING TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 54954(a)

Whereas; the District is required to set by ordinance or resolution rules that are required for the conduct of business by the Board and for the time and place of holding their meetings; and

Whereas; Government Code 54956 provides that the presiding officer of the legislative body of a local agency, or a majority of the members of the legislative body can call a meeting; and

Whereas; the District has not accomplished this requirement of law and wishes to do so; and

Whereas; this resolution is being developed to comply with this law.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved, by the Board of Directors of the Casitas Municipal Water District as follows:

1. Committee Meetings:

- A. There shall be 5 committees of the Board including the Water Resources Committee, the Executive Committee, the Finance Committee, the Recreation Committee, and the Personnel Committee.
- B. The Time, and Place of the Committee Meetings shall be set annually at the Board Planning Day by motion of the Board.
- C. The Board shall approve by motion two of its members to serve on each committee during Board Planning Day.
- D. It shall take a quorum to conduct business at a committee meeting. A quorum is two members of the Board.
- E. The Board may assign an alternate for the committee. The alternate may serve in the place of the member of the committee. The alternate shall be a member of the Board. The alternate shall be a member of the committee only if one of the two committee members is absent. If the alternate attends with the two committee members present, that alternate shall comply with Government Code Section 54952.2(c)(6) and shall attend only as an observer which is limited to watching and listening, and is undertaken without pay. It is the intent of the Board that the actual committee members serve, it is only if the committee member cannot serve and is willing for an alternate, that the alternate may serve. The alternate would then serve only for that meeting.
- F. All items considered by the committee with an alternate, requiring Board action by code or by direction of the Board, shall be sent to the Board for disposition without

returning it to the same committee, unless the minutes of the committee meeting has been reviewed during an intervening Board meeting, in order to avoid seriatim meetings. (See 63 OAG 820).

- G. The Committee shall select the presiding officer and alternate presiding officer of each committee, who shall preside unless changed by the committee.
 - H. The Time, Date and Place of the Committee Meetings may be changed as follows:
 - i. By both Members of the Committee.
 - ii. By the General Manager.
 - J. The change of the Time, Date and Place of the Committee Meetings shall be done by a public noticed agenda for a regular or special committee meeting depending on available time.
 - K. The general subject matter jurisdiction of each committee shall be as follows:

The Water Resources Committee: All matters generally related to the District's development, purchase, diversion, pumping, receipt, storage and delivery of water; the District's real and personal property employed in such activities; water conservation; water quality; water rights; provision of water meters, connections, and service agreements to customers; and all other matters reasonably related to the District's function as a public water district.

The Executive Committee: All matters generally related to the District's interaction with, membership in, and participation in or with, other public and private entities; attendance of meetings, seminars and conferences by Directors or employees of the District; and District policies;

The Finance Committee: All matters generally related to the District's budget, income and expenses, and water rates; financial claims against the District; and the District's liability, casualty, workers compensation, and other insurance.

The Recreation Committee: All matters generally related to the District's operation of the Lake Casitas Recreation Area, including, but not limited to, those portions of the District's budget and income and expenses related to the Lake Casitas Recreation Area.

The Personnel Committee: All matters generally related to the hiring, training, retention and termination of District employees (including Directors, part-time or temporary employees, campground hosts, and volunteers), and the wages, salaries and retirement, health, welfare, and other benefits provided to the same.

Furthermore, any matter may be referred to any committee by the Board of Directors, by the President of the District, or by the General Manager if it is deemed that there is a limited time for committee consideration of the matter, and the matter cannot be considered in a timely manner by the committee having subject matter jurisdiction thereof, and the matter has not previously been considered by the committee having subject matter jurisdiction thereof.

L. Authority of the Committees:

- a. The general authority of the committee is to review items being prepared by management for Board action to ensure that questions are asked that would otherwise go unanswered delaying an item before the board.
- b. An action by the Board is necessary to approve Ordinances, Resolutions, Leak Relief required by policy, approval of attendance and payment at meetings for the Board, legislative support or opposition not covered in the legislative policy, memberships in organizations and funding support of those organizations in excess of \$75, redistricting, changing any ownership in property or enforcing property rights, any rate changes, and Contracts among other things. All such actions will be taken by the Board not the Committee.
- c. The Committee may review any type of information without moving it on to the Board.
- d. The Committee may approve actions consistent with Board policy without re-approval of that policy by the Board, or deny actions inconsistent with Board Policy without approval of the denial by the Board.
- e. The Committee may review and approve newsletters, presentations by the General Manager, or other actions by staff for content and consistency with Board Policy without approval of the Board.
- f. The Committee may review and comment upon management policies without the approval of the Board as such policies are made by management not the Board.
- g. The Committee may review recommendations consistent with legislative policy approved by the Board without further Board action.
- h. Working with management to deal with incidents at the district does not require Board approval.
- i. The Committee may review and suggest solutions to complaints by customers as long as the actions do not exceed the General Managers budget authority or violate any Board Policy.
- j. The Committee may review budget items and support or oppose an expenditure that is within the authority of the General Manager to control.
- k. The Committee may meet with the Auditor of the District and discuss all issues of importance with the Auditors and make suggestions without those suggestions or information requiring Board action.
- 1. The Committee may review budgets and do evaluations and discuss and recommend priorities without Board approval as long as the budget is not exceeded or the suggestion of priorities is not inconsistent with Board policy.
- m. The Committee may review risk transfer provided for events and contracts and make suggestions without approval of the Board as long as it is not inconsistent with Board policy.

- n. The Committee may review and give suggestions for negotiations with the Union that are not inconsistent with Board policy or guidance approved by the Board.
- o. The Committee may review and give suggestions for recruitments, personnel policies, and management direction on personnel issues that are not inconsistent with Board policy.
- p. The Committee may review and give suggestions for solving of agreement issues that are not beyond the General Managers budget authority.
- q. The Committee may review and suggest solutions to issues for activities in the park without Board action as long as they do not violate any policy of the Board.
- r. The Committee may give direction to enforce existing contracts without Board action.
- s. The Committee may take other similar action without Board action.
- t. Any ministerial acts by staff.

M. The General Manager shall cause to be prepared for the Board's review the minutes of the committee meeting. The Board may direct that any item on the Committee minutes be brought to the Board if any Board member deems it important and requests that it be brought to the Board.

Minutes of the Casitas Municipal Water District Board Meeting Held November 13, 2010

A meeting of the Board of Directors was held November 13, 2010 at Casitas' Office, Oak View, California. Directors Handley, Kaiser, Word, Baggerly and Hicks were present. Also present were Steve Wickstrum, General Manager, Rebekah Vieira, Clerk of the Board, and Attorney, John Mathews. There were two staff members and ten members of the public in attendance. President Handley led the group in the flag salute.

1. Public comments.

Sholom Joshua addressed the board stating he has lived in Ojai for 33 years. I am concerned about the now well known Casitas fence. I have driven around the lake, seen the existing fence and seen how important that stretch is for wildlife in the area. I think it is a mistake and cruel if it is replaced with chain link topped with 3 strands of barbed wire. This doesn't provide any additional value to the people in the area and not to the animals in the area. Seems to have been announced and not something I knew about to vote on or express an opinion on. It is a serious issue and he would like to be informed on any action being taken.

Suza Francina addressed the board stating she has lived in Ojai since 1957. I am a founding member of Ojai Wildlife League. The league was formed in response to a bear that wondered into town and well established that he was looking for water. I have concerns about the fence. A number of us have walked the area with the map and tried to see where the openings would go. I am concerned they don't respond to existing corridors. It will fence in the length of Santa Ana Rd. The winery is fenced. There are a number of fences on Hwy 150. More forward thinking scenic areas are moving to permeable fencing. I ask that you issue a moratorium and reconsider other options. Permeable or wooden stakes and old fashioned signage with strict fines. I want to support the comments that Shalom made and hope you read my editorial in the OVN. We would like to be included in any meetings you have regarding this with the Bureau or biologist and be kept in the loop.

Pam Edwards, residing in Oak View stated that the past 15 years the biggest joys is walking early in the morning around the lake and the trail. There is few times I have walked that road when I haven't seen a coyote, deer or fox come over the hillside, cross the road and fence to get some water. I think putting the fence up would be cruel. I spoke with Steve at a CERT meeting and he described the fence. From what I heard and I understand it if a person can't get through how can a deer or a bear. I appreciate being informed of meetings or actions taking place.

Patty who resides in Ojai expressed concerns about the fence. It does not make sense to keep the wildlife out. It is a main source of water for the animals.

What is the funding source for the fencing and have you considered other options that would make more sense and maybe cost less money.

Sue Williamson with Ojai Wildlife League asked if there could be a discussion afterwards. Mr. Mathews stated the board generally does not respond to questions. They can give direction to staff to bring it back to the board. Public comment does not involve back and forth. Ms. Williamson added she is not clear how to proceed. Mr. Mathews added you can ask a question and the board can respond now or direct to staff. Ms. Williamson asked if the district received money from homeland security? Other questions are how this has been done regarding CEQA. Look into permeable fencing and I spoke with a man from Fish and Game that said if you want to keep boats out not put a fence up but dig a ditch. Have you considered these things? There are many options beside the chain link with the barb wire on top. It is frustrating. We would like to participate with you and be included in this. I know there is a better solution and hope we can work together and participate and inform us as much as you can.

Marjorie Emerson, a water customer expressed concerns about the fence. I drive out to Taft on a regular basis. On Santa Ana I always see deer early in the morning. To put a fence up I think we will have animals hit by cars. Maybe a deer and fawn, one can jump and the other not. I see fox and coyote. Not fair to the animals. Hoping we can come up with something better than the proposed plan.

Ingrid Boulting who has lived in this community for 25 years stated my feelings concerning this proposed fence have been expressed. I don't think County or state regulation would approve this fence. Wildlife and SRP would say you can't have this type of fencing. Concern is not just for animals it is for animals and their young. I have photographs of deer hanging on fencing and rest of family hanging around. It is also for the people. I see the animals crossing. Sometimes the animals run back. They don't understand cars. I know there are alternatives and we have to start thinking from our hearts and not just through our heads. Have compassion for all of life. Hope you consider us all.

Director Baggerly added there seems to be a lot of misunderstanding and the administrative process. This was approved by this board with the Mitigated Negative Declaration. 30 days after it is approved it can not be challenged. Bureau of Reclamation did an environmental document and they approved the fence. The fence is not a mile long chain link fence. 25% of it has openings for animals to cross. We will make sure that openings and depressions and hillocks will have smooth wire on top and perhaps on the bottom. So that animals can get through. That is the permeable fence. I saw tracks leading directly to the place we are leaving those openings. We didn't get money from homeland security. This is on federal land. The agenda is posted 72 hours in advance of every meeting. You could come to the meetings and state your opinions. It was approved and the Bureau reviewed it and did NEPA. They sent approval back to us a few weeks ago. We tried to make the fence accommodate the idea of the permeable fencing along with the security issues.

Director Baggerly added the measurement on the fence from the top is the one Suza sent to me and suggested. The three strand barb wire will be designed like what Suza sent to us. It will not change the contract. That takes care of the security issues and the animal crossing issues. We will look for some signage for those animal crossings. Mr. Wickstrum added the county will look to Fish and Game for crossing signs.

Director Kaiser added I walked the length of the project and agree with Director Baggerly. There are multiple areas for crossings that coincide with the wildlife corridors. There is plenty of access to make their way to the water. Director Baggerly added there are no other meetings on this. It is done.

Ms. Francina stated several of our members were here. The hour is late, the fence is not up. We feel there is a better way then building more chain link in the corridor. There will be dead animals everywhere. If legally it is done in your view, our concerns remain the same. Other issue is question of what a biologist thinks funneling the animals into these small areas.

Director Kaiser added there are multiple corridors for crossing of wildlife of all sizes. We have taken into consideration what you have provided to Director Baggerly, what you have presented to us.

President Handley thanked the speakers for providing input.

2. <u>General Manager comments.</u>

Mr. Wickstrum took notes of the threats that were just received from the exiting members of the public who spoke in public comments regarding the fence. He expressed concern of the comments to block fences and potentially contaminate the lake.

Mr. Wickstrum explained that there are a lot of projects and progress at this time. Ojai 4m and Oak View Reservoir are being painted. Filters are being done. The Ojai Valley 4m Pump Plant with electrical panels and the canal panels are being done. We will be posting signs when we dewater the tanks.

Regarding the Safety of Dams, I sent a letter several months ago requesting our willingness to meet in September or November. When I returned from DC I received a message from our Bureau contact stating they will be recarpeting and painting the office building in November and she suggested meeting sometime early next year. I asked her to let us know their schedule and asked that they be prepared to meet with us.

Mr. Wickstrum reported that the meeting with the Bureau scheduled for November 17th has been cancelled by Don Glasser's office. In a conversation with his assistant today she confirmed a meeting on Thursday of the ACWA

conference for an initial meeting with Michael Jackson, Rick Woodley, the Resource Manager and the Deputy Director, Pablo Arroyave. Following this meeting they will brief Don Glasser and then there may be a meeting with Don Glasser. They have not assigned a time for the meeting yet. Director Word asked who would be attending that meeting from the District as Director Word is not attending the ACWA conference. Directors Baggerly and Kaiser will represent the District.

Mr. Wickstrum prepared a letter to the Bureau to remove water service to CRW 11 in 60 days. It is time to move forward without delay. They were supposed to move forward with their groundwater source and then we would remove the service and abandon that pipeline.

3. <u>Board of Director comments.</u>

Director Hicks passed on the positive comments he heard from a friend at Solimar who stated a Casitas employee named Andy was very helpful. Mr. Wickstrum explained that Andy Benetiz works in Engineering.

Director Kaiser suggested looking into the mirror lake pump station as it appears there is a little bit of flow. Mr. Wickstrum explained there can be a bit of leakage from the packing and when it rains there are drainages that collect there and go into the vernal pool.

Mr. Wickstrum brought up the question of fisheries and what this organization has done is support kids fishing day to build on the fishing sport and part of what we are assigned to be able to do. If we can stock fish perhaps LCIF can help funding a smaller order of fish to support Kids Fishing Day. It is worthwhile program to keep going.

Mr. Wickstrum added that perhaps we need to get together quarterly and formulate some other improvements as the fisheries plan develops.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff requests direction from the Board

BACKGROUND AND OVERVIEW:

In 2008 the Finance Committee discussed that some of the District's Resale Customers were not only in arrears but were not being charged Delinquency Fees. The Committee felt it to be fair and equitable for all Customer Classes that Resale Customers adhere to the Rates and Regulations (10.2.2) of the District and be subject to Delinquency fees.

On September 2, 2010 The City of Ventura incurred Delinquent Fees of \$37,567.86 after numerous telephone calls, emails and voice mail reminders for the billing period of June 3, 2010 through July 7, 2010 for seven (7) of their accounts. The bill was dated July 28, 2010 and due on September 1, 2010, the payment was received on September 7, 2010.

Copies of the bills and a verbal explanation of the Delinquency Fees were hand carried by the Accounting Manager and explained to the City of Ventura in an attempt to bring the account current before the payment was received. Numerous attempts have been made to remind the City of pending Delinquency Fees and numerous Delinquency Fees have been waived.

The City of Ventura did have a billing adjustment that was pending a resolution, requested by the District's Treatment Plant Manager relating to erroneous and intermittent daily meter reads from the City of Ventura for the months of September and October of 2009. The pending adjustment for September and October of 2009 had nothing to do with the bills dated July 28, 2010, the bills were paid late, therefore assessed a Delinguency Fee.

The City of Ventura paid the \$37,567.86 in Delinquency Fees and submit a letter of protest requesting the consideration of removal of all fees and crediting the City of Ventura's account.

Since receiving the City of Ventura's Letter of Protest, another \$7,611.74 in Delinquency Fees has been applied to one (1) of their accounts from the September 27, 2010 billing, due November 1, 2010. After speaking with the staff at the City of Ventura, the bill that was omitted from their payment was faxed at the City's request to the proper department for payment processing.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Directors adopt the resolution accepting the proposal submitted by the lowest responsible bidder and award the contract for the construction of the Rincon Pipeline Replacement Station 450 to 451, Specification 10-337 to Toro Enterprises Inc. in the amount of \$54,215. It is further recommended that the President of the Board execute the agreement for said work and the Board authorize staff to proceed with the administration of the contract.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:

The Rincon Main pipeline located in the agricultural fields about one half of a mile from Highway 150 and Gubernator Canyon Road had a leak in 2009. During the repair of the leak, it was noticed by Casitas staff that the pipeline in this area needed to be replaced because of corrosion issues. The pipeline is under high pressure in this location. This project will replace about 100 feet of the corroded pipeline. The remaining pipeline in this area is either in good condition or has been previously replaced.

The project was advertised through F.W. Dodge. Five bidders completed site visits four bidders submitted proposals. The bid results are

Three out of the four bidders, including Toro Enterprises, did not fully meet the safety ratios that Casitas has established. Specifically Toro Enterprises did not meet the guidelines for the Recordable Incident Rate or the Lost Time Incident Rate. Toro Enterprises did meet the guidelines for Experience Modification Rate (EMR). Casitas staff have reviewed Toro Enterprises OSHA 300 log and have determined that the recordable injuries were minor. This is also reflected in their EMR as their EMR would be significantly higher if the firm had serious and costly injuries.

The FY 2010-11 Budget allocated \$99,313 to complete the replacement of this portion of the Rincon Main Pipeline.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:

Per your request, I have produced the following initial hydrology information for the recent three months and the changes that occurred during the December 2010 rainfall event:

<u>Lake Elevation</u>: The lake began the water year at an elevation of 539.36 feet on October 1st. While the area did experience approximately 2" of rain in each of the months of October and November this simply slowed the lowering of the lake. It wasn't until December 17^{th,} when a series of storms occurred, that the elevation of the lake went from an elevation of 537.88 (182,093 AF) to an elevation of 543.46 (194,824 AF). This translated to a net gain in water storage of **12,731 AF**.

Rainfall at Lake Casitas Recreational Area:

October 2.14" November 1.91" December 13.09"

<u>Diversions</u>: Due to the large amount of rain in December, all diversions occurred in December. The previous 4" had primed the ground and made conditions ripe for large amounts of run off. The diversions and releases are in accordance with the BA/BO. Monthly diversions quantities are:

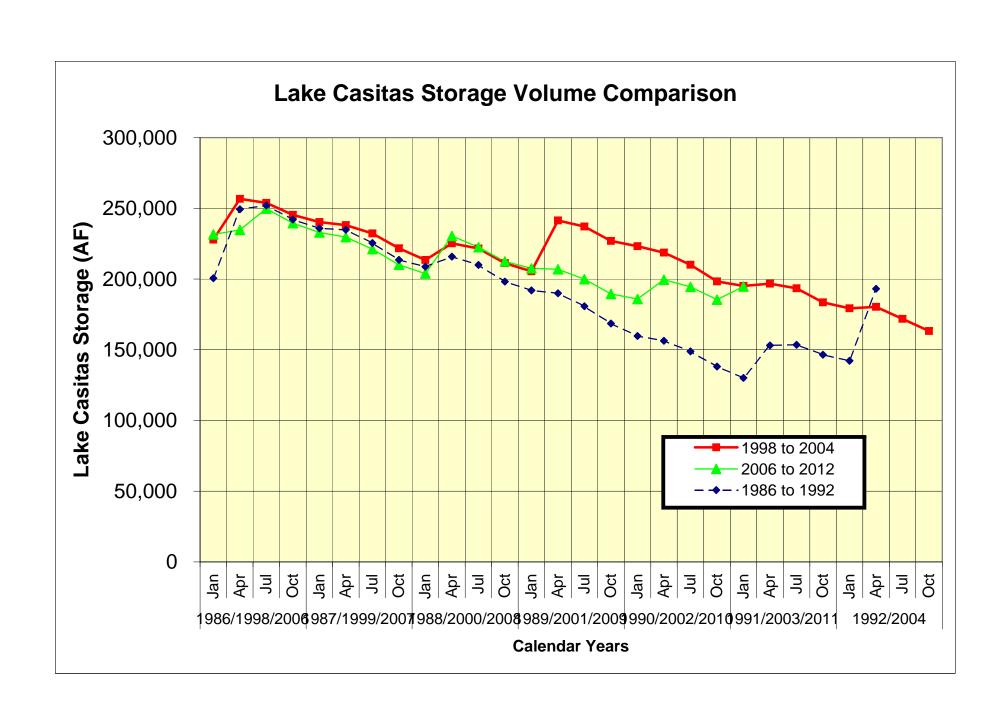

As California faces a budget deficit that could top \$28 billion over the next 18 months, Gov. Jerry Brown and other state leaders are poised to shift the responsibility for providing some services from the state to counties and cities.

In one of his first meetings as governor, Brown spoke with county leaders Tuesday about significantly restructuring government. He also attempted to allay the fears of some local officials that the state could pass off duties without providing sufficient means to pay for them.

"We're going to shift funding to the local level, we're going to make sure there's enough responsibility and discretion to use the money in the wisest possible ways," Brown told reporters after the meeting, adding that he does not believe it will be an easy change. "There will be controversies."

Brown did not publicly lay out a specific plan, but said he is considering changing the way foster care, welfare, food stamps, redevelopment, and parole and probation services are provided to the public.

Brown's campaign plan

The restructuring is the underpinning of Brown's campaign promise to move the responsibility for delivery and funding of government services closer to the people instead of keeping it concentrated in Sacramento.

The meeting at the headquarters of the California State Association of Counties was met with praise from that organization's leaders, who said they believe counties and local government agencies can provide the same services more efficiently than a statewide bureaucracy.

Money must be there

Chief among the concerns of locals, though, is that the state would hand over responsibility without sufficient resources to pay for them. County officials have in the past complained that that's what

happened when the state gave them oversight of In-Home Supportive Services for the elderly and the disabled.

"We expressed to the governor that the money has to be there with the shifts, but we can ultimately save money on the local level by being more efficient," said John Tavaglione, president of the California State Association of Counties and a Riverside County supervisor.

Senate Democrats in June proposed restructuring government over several years by shifting the oversight of juvenile parolees from the state to the counties and by moving low-level criminal offenders from state prisons to county jails.

They also proposed transferring some welfare duties and programs for the elderly, including adult protective services. Making those changes would move billions of dollars worth of costs for providing services from the Capitol to the state's 58 counties.

The Senate plan called for a new tax on oil plus adjusting some current taxes to provide up to \$4.2 billion to counties to pay for the new duties.

It's a starting point

Senate President Pro Tem Darrell Steinberg, D-Sacramento, the leading proponent of the restructuring, said he sees the Senate proposal as a starting point in a drive to eliminate overlap in government. Currently, more than 70 percent of the money the state collects is passed through to counties, school districts and other local bodies to provide services for residents.

In short, Steinberg said, "If you are responsible for providing the service, you ought to have the responsibility on how to pay for it. And if you don't have the responsibility for providing the service, then you ought not to be the one ... raising the money."

The money-raising issue could prove to be the most difficult at the Capitol, as Democrats have said local governments should have greater ability to raise taxes while Republicans have opposed that transfer of power. Steinberg said he would let Brown decide whether the shift would entail the power to raise local taxes.

After the meeting Tuesday, Brown told reporters: "If we're doing something here, we can send it back to the counties and send the money with it and it does not require a tax." He added, when asked about giving local entities new authorities to tax, that first he wants to "give them some responsibility with some funding."

Brown refused to comment on whether he would seek an extension of taxes set to expire, or new taxes, as part of his budget solution.

Higher taxes predicted

Steinberg said a restructuring is critical if leaders decide to ask voters to increase taxes in the near future, as many Capitol observers say is likely.

"I just don't think the public is going to look at the revenue question, which is going to be an inevitable discussion, and say, 'Let's use that to continue (the current) structure.' I just don't think that will happen," he said.

He said the state should set minimum standards for public services to ensure some uniformity among counties and other local agencies, but he would try to avoid hard mandates to allow them some flexibility to run the programs.

Brown will release his budget Jan. 10.

The funding and control of services began moving from counties and other local agencies to the state after the 1978 passage of Proposition 13, which limited property taxes and was passed during Brown's first term as governor.

1991 restructuring

That's when the state began backfilling billions of dollars lost from local coffers. California's last major restructuring happened in 1991, when the state was facing a multibillion-dollar budget deficit. That year the state shifted \$2 billion worth of services, including mental health and inhome services for the elderly and disabled, to counties.

The restructuring generally is regarded as being successful for mental health services, but some counties still are upset with the state because resources to pay for services such as in-home services have not kept up with demand and have burdened local budgets, said Marianne O'Malley, director of general government for the Legislative Analyst's Office.
