ORDINANCE 19-01

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CASITAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT INCREASING COMPENSATION AUTHORIZED TO BE PAID TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS PURSUANT TO WATER CODE SECTION 20200, ET. SEQ.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Casitas Municipal Water District Ordinance No. 17-02, passed on October 11, 2017, the Board of Directors of the Casitas Municipal Water District are currently paid \$188.59 per day for occurrences constituting District business, official duties or each day's service rendered as a Director by request of the Board, not to exceed ten (10) days for any one calendar month; and

WHEREAS, the Directors of the Casitas Municipal Water District come within the provisions of California Water Code Section 20201 *et. seq.* authorizing compensation in excess of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per day; and

WHEREAS, the last increase to the Directors fees from \$179.61 to \$188.59 per day was effective December 10, 2017; and

WHEREAS, California Water Code Section 20202 *et seq*. permits the increase of the Directors current fee by an annual amount equal to up to 5% for every year since the last effective increase; and

WHEREAS, it is proposed that by adoption of this Ordinance No. 19-01, the Board shall increase the per diem fee paid to District Directors 5% to \$198.02.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Directors of the Casitas Municipal Water District ordains as follows:

That each Director of this District shall receive compensation in an amount not to exceed One Hundred Ninety Eight dollars and two cents (\$198.02) per day for each day's attendance at meetings of the Board or for each day's service rendered as a Director by the request of the Board, for a maximum of ten days in any calendar month.

This ordinance shall become effective sixty (60) days after its adoption but no earlier than November 10, 2019.

Per California Water Code 20202, an increase in board compensation may not exceed an amount equal to 5 percent, for each calendar year following the operative date of the last adjustment. An increase to board compensation is only done by adoption of an ordinance which requires a public hearing, noticed in the paper. The ordinance is not effective until 60 days from the date of final passage. Voters of the district have the right to petition protesting the adoption of the ordinance.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended the Board of Directors authorize the General Manager to sign professional services agreement with IRJ Engineers Inc. and GHD Inc. for on-call electrical engineering services for fiscal year 2019-20.

BACKGROUND:

The Capital Projects budget for fiscal year 2019-20 includes significant effort for design of improvements to the Casitas and Ojai Water Systems. The District currently has three firms under contract to provide on-call engineering services to support these projects. Several of these projects, however, are strictly electrical improvements for which a general engineering firm must subcontract electrical engineering services. Utilizing an on-call electrical engineering firm allows the District to directly engage these specialty services.

A Request for Qualifications for On-Call Electrical Engineering Services for fiscal year 2019-20 was advertised on the District's website on August 9, 2019, with optional one-year extensions for two additional years. Two Statement of Qualification (SOQ) were received prior to the deadline of September 4, 2019: 1) IRJ Engineers, Inc. (IRJ) and 2) GHD Inc. (GHD). IRJ is currently a subconsultant to two of the three on-call engineering firms and has provided excellent service to the District on several projects. GHD completed the Ojai Water System Arc Flash Study for the District as a subconsultant to an on-call engineering firm and District staff were also pleased with the quality of their work.

Using the on-call electrical engineering contract, task orders will be issued to IRJ and GHD, who will provide a letter proposal to the District with a project understanding, approach, scope, fee, and schedule. A separate Task Order will be issued for each project with a negotiated scope, fee, and schedule. There is no designated minimum nor maximum value of services to be awarded to either firm. Services to be provided will be dependent on the capital improvement program budget on an annual basis. Task Orders above the General Manager's authorization limit will be presented to the appropriate Committee and the Board for approval.

Future years may include services for support during bidding and construction, construction inspection services, and preparation of record drawings.

FUNDING SOURCE:

Funding for specific projects is included as part of the Ojai System Capital budget and Casitas System Capital budget for FY 2019-20.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CASITAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT & IRJ ENGINEERS INC. FOR ON-CALL ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING SERVICES FY 2019-20

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this <u>11th</u> day of <u>September</u> in the year 2019 by and between the CASITAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT, herein designated as the **District**, and **IRJ Engineers**, **Inc.**, herein designated as the **Consultant**.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the District issued a Request for Qualifications for On-Call Electrical Engineering Services for FY 2019-20; and

WHEREAS, the Consultant submitted a Statement of Qualifications dated September 4, 2019 presenting their qualifications for the anticipated scope of work for on-call electrical engineering services; and

WHEREAS, District desires and Consultant is willing to provide the professional services requested; and

WHEREAS, Consultant is well qualified to complete the requested services; and

WHEREAS, District intends to issue individual Task Orders for specific engineering projects for which the scope, fee and schedule will be negotiated at that time by the Parties.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the recitals above and their mutual promises, obligations, valuable consideration and covenants herein contained, the Parties hereby agree to abide by the following:

1. <u>TERM OF AGREEMENT</u>. The term of this Agreement shall be from the date this Agreement is made and entered into, as first written above, until the completion of all services by the Consultant and acceptance of those services and materials by the District or until June 30, 2020. The District reserves the right to extend the term of this Agreement for one-year intervals for a maximum of two additional years.

2. <u>DATA FURNISHED BY District.</u> For the purpose of aiding Consultant in the performance of its obligations under this Agreement, District has furnished Consultant with existing information which was indicated by District as being available and which Consultant had requested. Consultant shall apply reasonable caution in its use and interpretation of the data and shall promptly advise District of any suspected inaccuracies or omissions in the data that has been furnished, or may be furnished during the project. Consultant shall have no liability for defects in the Services attributable to Consultant's reliance upon or use of As Built drawings, furnished by District or third parties retained by District.

3. SCOPE OF SERVICES.

The scope of services for each Task Order will be negotiated separately by the Parties for each Task Order issued by the District.

4. <u>FEE FOR SERVICES</u>. The District shall pay to the Consultant on a completed task basis for services requested by the District for each Task Order. The completed task unit cost shall be stated in the scope of work agreed to by the Parties. The task unit cost for services shall be the fully loaded cost and shall include all overhead costs, material costs and miscellaneous costs.

The total fee for services shall not exceed the negotiated fee for each Task Order without the prior written consent of the District.

- 5. <u>DELIVERABLES.</u> The format, completion and delivery of work products shall be provided in the scope of work for each Task Order agreed to by the Parties.
- 6. <u>PAYMENT OF COMPENSATION</u>. Compensation shall be billed monthly in increments based on the percentage of each task completed for each Task Order.
- 7. <u>CHARGES FOR REVIEW OF BILLS</u>. The Consultant shall not charge District for questions of billings under this Agreement. The Consultant shall answer all questions about billings to the satisfaction of District.
- 8. <u>NO INTEREST, NO ATTORNEYS' FEES</u>. No interest shall be charged on bills and each party will bear their own attorneys' fees and costs for any lawsuit or arbitration or other dispute resolution methodology arising out of this project.
- 9. <u>CHANGES</u>. Consultant shall provide engineering services as required by this Agreement without modification or changes to the hourly rate or any other extra compensation, excepting only changes authorized by a written change order signed by District and Consultant. Any change in the total compensation allowed for performance under this Agreement shall be accomplished only by such a change order. Accordingly, no course of conduct or dealings between the parties, nor express or implied acceptance of alterations or additions to the work, and no claim that District has been unjustly enriched by any alteration or addition to work, whether or not there is, in fact, any unjust enrichment to the

work, shall be the basis of any claim to any increase in the total compensation provided for in this Agreement. Should District request a change in the services covered by this Agreement, Consultant shall not expend any time or money for the change until a written change order is prepared and signed by District and Consultant. Should Consultant expend time or funds without an executed change order, all costs therefore shall be the sole responsibility of Consultant. Once a change order is prepared and signed by both parties, it shall constitute a final settlement of all matters relating to the change which is the subject of the change order, including, but limited to, all direct and indirect costs associated with such change and any and all adjustments to the fee due the Consultant and the work schedule.

 PROJECT SCHEDULE. Consultant understands the importance of accurate and timely completion of the required tasks. The project schedule shall be in the scope of work for each Task Order as agreed to by the Parties.

11. RESPONSIBILITY OF Consultant.

- a) The standard of care for all professional engineering and related services performed or furnished by Consultant under this Agreement will be the care and skill ordinarily used by members of the subject profession practicing under similar circumstances at the same time and same locality. Consultant makes no warranties, express or implied, under this Agreement or otherwise, in connection with Consultant's services.
- b) Consultant shall be responsible for the professional quality, technical accuracy, timely completion, and the coordination of all testing, analysis, inspection, reports, designs and other services furnished by Consultant under this Agreement. Consultant shall, without additional compensation, promptly correct any Consultant errors, omissions, or other deficiencies in its analysis, inspection, testing, reports, designs, and other services; to the extent such corrections are not attributable to change in project description or data modification by District.
- c) Consultant shall perform such professional services as may be necessary to accomplish the work required to be performed under this Agreement, in accordance with this Agreement and the negotiated scope of work for each Task Order. Approval by District of analyses, inspection, testing, reports, designs and incidental engineering work or materials furnished hereunder shall not in any way relieve Consultant of responsibility for the technical adequacy of its work. Neither District's approval or acceptance of, nor payment for, any of Consultant's services shall be construed to operate as a waiver of any rights under this Agreement or of any cause of action arising out of the performance of this Agreement.
- d) Consultant shall be and remain liable in accordance with applicable California law for damages to District caused by Consultant's negligent performance of any of the services furnished under this Agreement.
- 12. <u>PERSONNEL.</u> District requires the following project team members to work directly with the District until completion of the project. Consultant shall inform District immediately if any of the following personnel or staff listed in the proposal become unavailable for any reason prior to completion of their tasks:

Name Jack Ivers

Role Principal-in-Charge

In the event a change in any of the above-named personnel or staff listed in the proposal becomes necessary, Consultant shall promptly submit to the District the name and qualifications of the proposed replacement person(s). Consultant and District will then agree upon the selection of the replacement person(s) whose qualifications and expertise shall be at least equal to the person replaced. The penalty for replacement of personnel without permission of Casitas will be ten percent (10%) of the gross of the contract. Consultant agrees not to request an increase in the per-hour fee or any other compensation for such a change in personnel.

13. <u>INSURANCE.</u>

- a) During the course of this Agreement, Consultant shall pay for and maintain in full force and effect, and cause each of its subconsultants to maintain in full force and effect, all insurance required by any governmental agency having jurisdiction to require particular insurance of Consultant or its subcontractors in connection with or related to the assessment services to be performed under this Agreement.
- b) During the course of this Agreement, Consultant shall pay for and maintain in full force and effect, and cause each of its subconsultants to maintain in full force and effect, workers' compensation insurance, including occupational disease provisions, as required by the laws of the State of California and employer's general liability insurance for all labor employed by them, directly or indirectly, in the performance of this Agreement.
- During the course of this Agreement, Consultant shall pay for and maintain in full force c) and effect, public liability and property damage insurance naming District, its officers, directors, and employees as additional insured, insuring against liability and claims for damages because of bodily injury, sickness or disease, death or injury to or destruction of tangible property arising out of or resulting from any work performed under this Agreement, whether such work is performed by Consultant or a subconsultant or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by them, or by anyone else for whose acts any of them may be liable. Such insurance shall include all major divisions of coverage and be on a comprehensive basis, including: (a) premises/operations; (b) independent contractor's protection; (c) products included in operations; (d) contractual (including Consultant's indemnity obligations for tort liability under this Agreement); (e) owned, non-owned and hired motor vehicles and other mobile equipment; and (f) broad form property damage endorsement, including completed operations. The limits of liability for such insurance shall be not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence for public liability and \$1,000,000 per occurrence for property damage. Such insurance shall be issued by a responsible carrier or carriers acceptable to District. All such insurance shall be written on an occurrence basis and shall be primary and noncontributory. Consultant shall cause each of its subcontractors to procure, pay for and maintain in full force and effect during the course of this Agreement, public liability and property damage

insurance reasonably satisfactory to District and naming District, its officers, directors and employees as additional insured with respect to claims arising out of operations performed on behalf of Consultant for the consulting services covered by this Agreement.

The District, its directors, officers, employees, agents and volunteers are to be covered as insureds as respects: liability arising out of activities performed by or on behalf of the Consultant, products and completed operations of the Consultant; premises owned, occupied or used by the Consultant; or automobiles owned, leased, hired or borrowed by the Consultant. The coverage shall contain no special limitations on the scope of protection afforded to the District, its directors, officers, employees, agents and volunteers.

d) Worker's Compensation Insurance - by signature hereunder, Consultant certifies that he is aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the Labor Code which require every employer to be insured against liability for worker's compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that code, and he will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this contract.

The Consultant shall maintain, and shall cause all subcontractors he may employ to maintain, adequate workers compensation insurance under the laws of the State of California for all labor employed by them, directly or indirectly, in the execution of the work. The Consultant and all subcontractors shall file with the District certification of such workers compensation insurance prior to beginning any work under this Agreement.

- e) Prior to the commencement of performance of any work under this Agreement, Consultant and its subconsultants shall furnish District with certificates of insurance in form and substance satisfactory to the District evidencing all of the insurance coverage required by paragraphs a. through c. above. All policies and certificates of insurance required under paragraphs a. through c. above shall expressly provide for no less than 30 days prior written notice to District in the event of a cancellation, non-renewal or expiration of the coverage.
- 14. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>. Consultant shall defend, indemnify and hold District and its officers, directors, and employees, harmless from all loss, liability and expense from all third party tort claims and demands or liability if and to the extent caused by negligence or willful misconduct of Consultant, its subconsultants and employees whether such claims, demands or liability are caused by Consultant, Consultant's agents or employees, or subconsultants employed by Consultant, their agents or employees, or products installed on the project by Consultant or its subconsultant, excepting such loss, liability or expense as may be caused by District's negligence or willful misconduct. Such indemnification shall extend to claims, demands or liability for injury, death or damage to property arising after completion of the project as well as during the work's progress. The foregoing indemnification shall apply, without limitation, to bodily injury and property damage claims as well as to stop notices and monetary claims for

labor, materials or equipment furnished in the performance of the professional services covered by this Agreement. In the event such liability, claims, actions, causes of action or demands are caused by the joint or concurrent negligence of more than one party, such liability shall be borne by each party in proportion to its own fault. The duty to defend shall not apply to professional liability claims.

- 15. <u>ASSIGNMENT</u>. Neither party may assign this Agreement or any payments due under this Agreement, either voluntarily or involuntarily, without the prior written consent of the other party. If and to the extent any assignment is authorized, it shall not be effective until the assignee signs a written agreement to be bound by all of the provisions of this Agreement, nor shall it relieve the assignor of its obligations under this Agreement unless the written consent to the assignment expressly states that the assignor shall be relieved.
- 16. TERMINATION. The District may, by written notice to Consultant, suspend or discontinue the performance of all work pursuant to this Agreement, and may terminate this Agreement, with or without cause after 15 calendar day's written notice from the date of mailing. In the event of a termination without cause, Consultant will be entitled to a reasonable portion of the lump sum fee for its services rendered prior to the effective date of the notice, but Consultant shall have no claim against District for loss of anticipated profits or other payment on account of services not yet performed and which are not thereafter performed by Consultant. In the event of a termination without cause, Consultant will submit a final invoice to District for all services rendered prior to termination within a reasonable time, not to exceed 45 days of the effective date of such notice. Any bills received after the expiration of the 45-day period need not be paid by the District.
- 17. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS. All plans, studies, sketches, reports, test data, and drawings, prepared by or for either party pursuant to this Agreement including copyright ownership shall be the property of District when Consultant has been compensated for all undisputed billings in accordance with this Agreement, whether the work for which they are prepared be executed or not. Upon completion of all work under this Agreement, or in the event this Agreement is terminated prior to completion of all such work, all documents, plans, specifications, drawings pertaining to the facility, and all other material provided to assist Consultant in performing under this Agreement shall be delivered forthwith to District. However, nothing shall prevent Consultant from using intellectual property developed under this contract in other works. All documents, including, but not limited to. drawings, specifications, and computer software prepared by Consultant pursuant to this Agreement are instruments for service specific to this project. They are not intended nor represented to be suitable for reuse by District or others on extensions of the project or on any other project. Any reuse without the prior written verification or adaptation by District for the specific purpose intended shall be at District's sole risk.
- 18. <u>GOVERNING LAW; PLACE OF SUIT</u>. This Agreement is to be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California. Any lawsuit arising out of this Agreement shall be filed and prosecuted exclusively in Ventura County, California Superior Court.

- 19. <u>SUBCONTRACTS</u>. District has entered into this Agreement in order to receive the services of Consultant. The provisions of the Agreement shall equally apply to any subcontractor of Consultant. Consultant shall include in all subcontracts a clause making the terms of this Agreement binding upon the subcontract.
- 20. MONTHLY BILLINGS. Contractor shall not bill District more often than monthly during the term of this Agreement. Invoices shall fully define the work component completed, the hours spent on each task, the budget for each person in terms of cost and hours, the pay rate for the person assigned, the percentage of the task completed in terms of actual work remaining, and costs remaining until completion of the task at the time of billing. Each invoice shall also contain a purchase order number or task order number assigned and the invoice shall state the billing period. The invoice will be paid within thirty (30) days after the approval by the District Board of Directors.
- 21. <u>ENTIRE AGREEMENT</u>. This Agreement constitutes the whole Agreement between the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof, and neither party nor any of its agents or employees has made any representation except as specifically provided herein. Neither of the parties in executing or performing this Agreement is relying upon any statement or information to whomsoever made or given directly or indirectly, verbally or in writing by any individual or corporation except as specifically provided herein. The Agreement may not be modified or altered except in writing signed by both parties.
- 22. <u>OPINIONS OF COST AND SCHEDULE</u>. Consultant's opinions on cost and schedule shall be made on the basis of available information and Consultant's expertise and qualifications as a professional. Consultant does not warrant or guarantee that its opinions on cost or schedule of current and future levels and events will not vary from Consultant's estimates or forecasts or from actual outcomes.
- 23. <u>NOTICES</u>. All communication, notices, and demands of any kind which either party hereto may be required or may desire to give to or serve upon the other party may be given or served by manual delivery to such party or an office thereof or by enclosing it in a sealed envelope and depositing it in the United State mail, postage prepaid, registered, and addressed to the respective parties as follows:

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CASITAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT & GHD INC. FOR ON-CALL ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING SERVICES FY 2019-20

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this <u>11th</u> day of <u>September</u> in the year 2019 by and between the CASITAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT, herein designated as the **District**, and **GHD**, **Inc.**, herein designated as the **Consultant**.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the District issued a Request for Qualifications for On-Call Electrical Engineering Services for FY 2019-20; and

WHEREAS, the Consultant submitted a Statement of Qualifications dated September 4, 2019 presenting their qualifications for the anticipated scope of work for on-call electrical engineering services; and

WHEREAS, District desires and Consultant is willing to provide the professional services requested; and

WHEREAS, Consultant is well qualified to complete the requested services; and

WHEREAS, District intends to issue individual Task Orders for specific engineering projects for which the scope, fee and schedule will be negotiated at that time by the Parties.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the recitals above and their mutual promises, obligations, valuable consideration and covenants herein contained, the Parties hereby agree to abide by the following:

1. <u>TERM OF AGREEMENT</u>. The term of this Agreement shall be from the date this Agreement is made and entered into, as first written above, until the completion of all services by the Consultant and acceptance of those services and materials by the District or until June 30, 2020. The District reserves the right to extend the term of this Agreement for one-year intervals for a maximum of two additional years.

2. <u>DATA FURNISHED BY District.</u> For the purpose of aiding Consultant in the performance of its obligations under this Agreement, District has furnished Consultant with existing information which was indicated by District as being available and which Consultant had requested. Consultant shall apply reasonable caution in its use and interpretation of the data and shall promptly advise District of any suspected inaccuracies or omissions in the data that has been furnished, or may be furnished during the project. Consultant shall have no liability for defects in the Services attributable to Consultant's reliance upon or use of As Built drawings, furnished by District or third parties retained by District.

3. SCOPE OF SERVICES.

The scope of services for each Task Order will be negotiated separately by the Parties for each Task Order issued by the District.

4. <u>FEE FOR SERVICES</u>. The District shall pay to the Consultant on a completed task basis for services requested by the District for each Task Order. The completed task unit cost shall be stated in the scope of work agreed to by the Parties. The task unit cost for services shall be the fully loaded cost and shall include all overhead costs, material costs and miscellaneous costs.

The total fee for services shall not exceed the negotiated fee for each Task Order without the prior written consent of the District.

- 5. <u>DELIVERABLES.</u> The format, completion and delivery of work products shall be provided in the scope of work for each Task Order agreed to by the Parties.
- 6. <u>PAYMENT OF COMPENSATION</u>. Compensation shall be billed monthly in increments based on the percentage of each task completed for each Task Order.
- 7. <u>CHARGES FOR REVIEW OF BILLS</u>. The Consultant shall not charge District for questions of billings under this Agreement. The Consultant shall answer all questions about billings to the satisfaction of District.
- 8. <u>NO INTEREST, NO ATTORNEYS' FEES</u>. No interest shall be charged on bills and each party will bear their own attorneys' fees and costs for any lawsuit or arbitration or other dispute resolution methodology arising out of this project.
- 9. <u>CHANGES</u>. Consultant shall provide engineering services as required by this Agreement without modification or changes to the hourly rate or any other extra compensation, excepting only changes authorized by a written change order signed by District and Consultant. Any change in the total compensation allowed for performance under this Agreement shall be accomplished only by such a change order. Accordingly, no course of conduct or dealings between the parties, nor express or implied acceptance of alterations or additions to the work, and no claim that District has been unjustly enriched by any alteration or addition to work, whether or not there is, in fact, any unjust enrichment to the

work, shall be the basis of any claim to any increase in the total compensation provided for in this Agreement. Should District request a change in the services covered by this Agreement, Consultant shall not expend any time or money for the change until a written change order is prepared and signed by District and Consultant. Should Consultant expend time or funds without an executed change order, all costs therefore shall be the sole responsibility of Consultant. Once a change order is prepared and signed by both parties, it shall constitute a final settlement of all matters relating to the change which is the subject of the change order, including, but limited to, all direct and indirect costs associated with such change and any and all adjustments to the fee due the Consultant and the work schedule.

 PROJECT SCHEDULE. Consultant understands the importance of accurate and timely completion of the required tasks. The project schedule shall be in the scope of work for each Task Order as agreed to by the Parties.

11. RESPONSIBILITY OF Consultant.

- a) The standard of care for all professional engineering and related services performed or furnished by Consultant under this Agreement will be the care and skill ordinarily used by members of the subject profession practicing under similar circumstances at the same time and same locality. Consultant makes no warranties, express or implied, under this Agreement or otherwise, in connection with Consultant's services.
- b) Consultant shall be responsible for the professional quality, technical accuracy, timely completion, and the coordination of all testing, analysis, inspection, reports, designs and other services furnished by Consultant under this Agreement. Consultant shall, without additional compensation, promptly correct any Consultant errors, omissions, or other deficiencies in its analysis, inspection, testing, reports, designs, and other services; to the extent such corrections are not attributable to change in project description or data modification by District.
- c) Consultant shall perform such professional services as may be necessary to accomplish the work required to be performed under this Agreement, in accordance with this Agreement and the negotiated scope of work for each Task Order. Approval by District of analyses, inspection, testing, reports, designs and incidental engineering work or materials furnished hereunder shall not in any way relieve Consultant of responsibility for the technical adequacy of its work. Neither District's approval or acceptance of, nor payment for, any of Consultant's services shall be construed to operate as a waiver of any rights under this Agreement or of any cause of action arising out of the performance of this Agreement.
- d) Consultant shall be and remain liable in accordance with applicable California law for damages to District caused by Consultant's negligent performance of any of the services furnished under this Agreement.
- 12. <u>PERSONNEL.</u> District requires the following project team members to work directly with the District until completion of the project. Consultant shall inform District immediately if any of the following personnel or staff listed in the proposal become unavailable for any reason prior to completion of their tasks:

<u>Name</u> Paul Hermann, PE Mehdi Mardi, PE Role Project Principal Project Manager

In the event a change in any of the above-named personnel or staff listed in the proposal becomes necessary, Consultant shall promptly submit to the District the name and qualifications of the proposed replacement person(s). Consultant and District will then agree upon the selection of the replacement person(s) whose qualifications and expertise shall be at least equal to the person replaced. The penalty for replacement of personnel without permission of Casitas will be ten percent (10%) of the gross of the contract. Consultant agrees not to request an increase in the per-hour fee or any other compensation for such a change in personnel.

13. <u>INSURANCE.</u>

- a) During the course of this Agreement, Consultant shall pay for and maintain in full force and effect, and cause each of its subconsultants to maintain in full force and effect, all insurance required by any governmental agency having jurisdiction to require particular insurance of Consultant or its subcontractors in connection with or related to the assessment services to be performed under this Agreement.
- b) During the course of this Agreement, Consultant shall pay for and maintain in full force and effect, and cause each of its subconsultants to maintain in full force and effect, workers' compensation insurance, including occupational disease provisions, as required by the laws of the State of California and employer's general liability insurance for all labor employed by them, directly or indirectly, in the performance of this Agreement.
- During the course of this Agreement, Consultant shall pay for and maintain in full force c) and effect, public liability and property damage insurance naming District, its officers, directors, and employees as additional insured, insuring against liability and claims for damages because of bodily injury, sickness or disease, death or injury to or destruction of tangible property arising out of or resulting from any work performed under this Agreement, whether such work is performed by Consultant or a subconsultant or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by them, or by anyone else for whose acts any of them may be liable. Such insurance shall include all major divisions of coverage and be on a comprehensive basis, including: (a) premises/operations; (b) independent contractor's protection; (c) products included in operations; (d) contractual (including Consultant's indemnity obligations for tort liability under this Agreement); (e) owned, non-owned and hired motor vehicles and other mobile equipment; and (f) broad form property damage endorsement, including completed operations. The limits of liability for such insurance shall be not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence for public liability and \$1,000,000 per occurrence for property damage. Such insurance shall be issued by a responsible carrier or carriers acceptable to District. All such insurance shall be written on an occurrence basis and shall be primary and noncontributory. Consultant shall cause each of its subcontractors to procure, pay for and maintain in full force and

effect during the course of this Agreement, public liability and property damage insurance reasonably satisfactory to District and naming District, its officers, directors and employees as additional insured with respect to claims arising out of operations performed on behalf of Consultant for the consulting services covered by this Agreement.

The District, its directors, officers, employees, agents and volunteers are to be covered as insureds as respects: liability arising out of activities performed by or on behalf of the Consultant, products and completed operations of the Consultant; premises owned, occupied or used by the Consultant; or automobiles owned, leased, hired or borrowed by the Consultant. The coverage shall contain no special limitations on the scope of protection afforded to the District, its directors, officers, employees, agents and volunteers.

d) Worker's Compensation Insurance - by signature hereunder, Consultant certifies that he is aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the Labor Code which require every employer to be insured against liability for worker's compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that code, and he will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this contract.

The Consultant shall maintain, and shall cause all subcontractors he may employ to maintain, adequate workers compensation insurance under the laws of the State of California for all labor employed by them, directly or indirectly, in the execution of the work. The Consultant and all subcontractors shall file with the District certification of such workers compensation insurance prior to beginning any work under this Agreement.

- e) Prior to the commencement of performance of any work under this Agreement, Consultant and its subconsultants shall furnish District with certificates of insurance in form and substance satisfactory to the District evidencing all of the insurance coverage required by paragraphs a. through c. above. All policies and certificates of insurance required under paragraphs a. through c. above shall expressly provide for no less than 30 days prior written notice to District in the event of a cancellation, non-renewal or expiration of the coverage.
- 14. INDEMNIFICATION. Consultant shall defend, indemnify and hold District and its officers, directors, and employees, harmless from all loss, liability and expense from all third party tort claims and demands or liability if and to the extent caused by negligence or willful misconduct of Consultant, its subconsultants and employees whether such claims, demands or liability are caused by Consultant, Consultant's agents or employees, or subconsultants employed by Consultant, their agents or employees, or products installed on the project by Consultant or its subconsultant, excepting such loss, liability or expense as may be caused by District's negligence or willful misconduct. Such indemnification shall extend to claims, demands or liability for injury, death or damage to property arising after completion of the project as well as during the work's progress. The foregoing indemnification shall apply, without limitation, to

bodily injury and property damage claims as well as to stop notices and monetary claims for labor, materials or equipment furnished in the performance of the professional services covered by this Agreement. In the event such liability, claims, actions, causes of action or demands are caused by the joint or concurrent negligence of more than one party, such liability shall be borne by each party in proportion to its own fault. The duty to defend shall not apply to professional liability claims.

- 15. <u>ASSIGNMENT</u>. Neither party may assign this Agreement or any payments due under this Agreement, either voluntarily or involuntarily, without the prior written consent of the other party. If and to the extent any assignment is authorized, it shall not be effective until the assignee signs a written agreement to be bound by all of the provisions of this Agreement, nor shall it relieve the assignor of its obligations under this Agreement unless the written consent to the assignment expressly states that the assignor shall be relieved.
- 16. <u>TERMINATION</u>. The District may, by written notice to Consultant, suspend or discontinue the performance of all work pursuant to this Agreement, and may terminate this Agreement, with or without cause after 15 calendar day's written notice from the date of mailing. In the event of a termination without cause, Consultant will be entitled to a reasonable portion of the lump sum fee for its services rendered prior to the effective date of the notice, but Consultant shall have no claim against District for loss of anticipated profits or other payment on account of services not yet performed and which are not thereafter performed by Consultant. In the event of a termination without cause, Consultant will submit a final invoice to District for all services rendered prior to termination within a reasonable time, not to exceed 45 days of the effective date of such notice. Any bills received after the expiration of the 45-day period need not be paid by the District.
- 17. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS. All plans, studies, sketches, reports, test data, and drawings, prepared by or for either party pursuant to this Agreement including copyright ownership shall be the property of District when Consultant has been compensated for all undisputed billings in accordance with this Agreement, whether the work for which they are prepared be executed or not. Upon completion of all work under this Agreement, or in the event this Agreement is terminated prior to completion of all such work, all documents, plans, specifications, drawings pertaining to the facility, and all other material provided to assist Consultant in performing under this Agreement shall be delivered forthwith to District. However, nothing shall prevent Consultant from using intellectual property developed under this contract in other works. All documents, including, but not limited to, drawings, specifications, and computer software prepared by Consultant pursuant to this Agreement are instruments for service specific to this project. They are not intended nor represented to be suitable for reuse by District or others on extensions of the project or on any other project. Any reuse without the prior written verification or adaptation by District for the specific purpose intended shall be at District's sole risk.
- 18. GOVERNING LAW; PLACE OF SUIT. This Agreement is to be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California. Any lawsuit arising out of this Agreement shall be filed and prosecuted exclusively in Ventura County, California Superior Court.

- 19. <u>SUBCONTRACTS</u>. District has entered into this Agreement in order to receive the services of Consultant. The provisions of the Agreement shall equally apply to any subcontractor of Consultant. Consultant shall include in all subcontracts a clause making the terms of this Agreement binding upon the subcontract.
- 20. MONTHLY BILLINGS. Contractor shall not bill District more often than monthly during the term of this Agreement. Invoices shall fully define the work component completed, the hours spent on each task, the budget for each person in terms of cost and hours, the pay rate for the person assigned, the percentage of the task completed in terms of actual work remaining, and costs remaining until completion of the task at the time of billing. Each invoice shall also contain a purchase order number or task order number assigned and the invoice shall state the billing period. The invoice will be paid within thirty (30) days after the approval by the District Board of Directors.
- 21. <u>ENTIRE AGREEMENT</u>. This Agreement constitutes the whole Agreement between the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof, and neither party nor any of its agents or employees has made any representation except as specifically provided herein. Neither of the parties in executing or performing this Agreement is relying upon any statement or information to whomsoever made or given directly or indirectly, verbally or in writing by any individual or corporation except as specifically provided herein. The Agreement may not be modified or altered except in writing signed by both parties.
- 22. <u>OPINIONS OF COST AND SCHEDULE</u>. Consultant's opinions on cost and schedule shall be made on the basis of available information and Consultant's expertise and qualifications as a professional. Consultant does not warrant or guarantee that its opinions on cost or schedule of current and future levels and events will not vary from Consultant's estimates or forecasts or from actual outcomes.
- 22. <u>NOTICES</u>. All communication, notices, and demands of any kind which either party hereto may be required or may desire to give to or serve upon the other party may be given or served by manual delivery to such party or an office thereof or by enclosing it in a sealed envelope and depositing it in the United State mail, postage prepaid, registered, and addressed to the respective parties as follows:

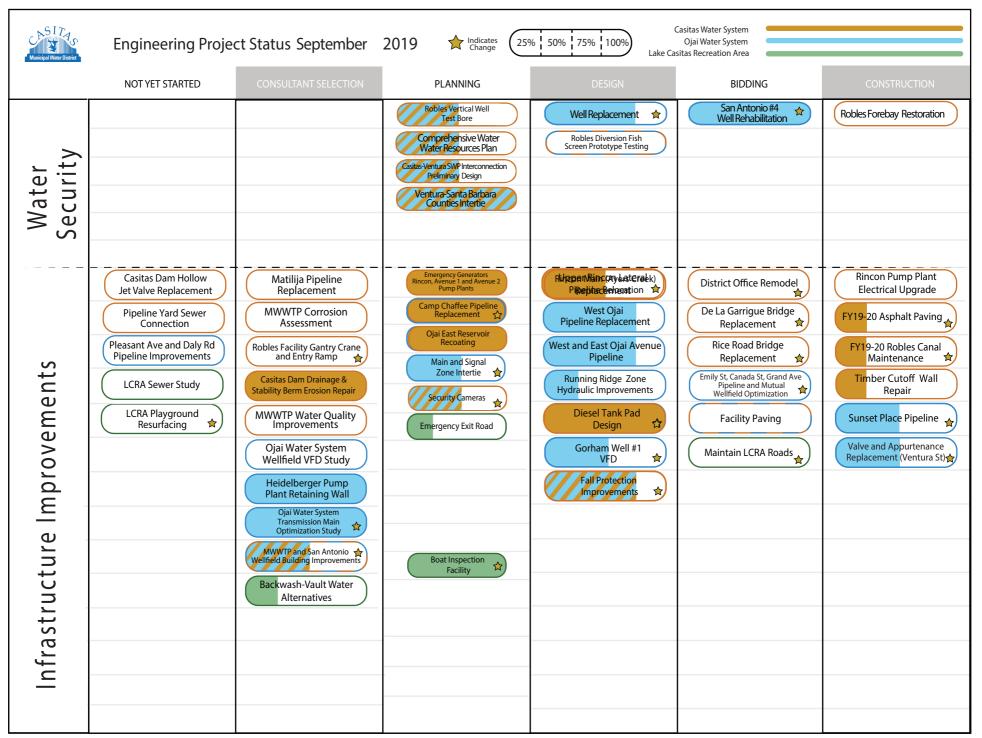

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Directors receive and file the minutes of the September 3, 2019 Recreation Committee.

BACKGROUND AND OVERVIEW:

1. Roll Call.

Director Brian Brennan
Director Angelo Spandrio
Park Services Manager, Carol Belser
Division Officer, Joe Evans
There was one member of the media in attendance
General Manager, Mike Flood arrived at 1032 hours

2. **Public Comments**. There were no public comments received.

3. **Board/Management comments.**

Park Services Manager, Carol Belser reported that the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) gave staff preliminary review comments of Casitas' September 20, 2018 Lake Casitas Invasive Mussel Rapid Response Plan last week. The report will be updated and sent back to CDFW for final approval. Ms. Belser also stated the plan to organize a Veteran's Day 5 K run in November, has been abandoned for 2019, and a new date will be selected. She also reported that the Recreation Committee's request for a Customer Appreciation Day has a tentative date of April 4, 2020 and will include Kids Fishing.

4. Review Monthly Recreation Report for July 2019.

Park Manager, Carol Belser presented the July, 2019 report to the Committee. Director Brennan pointed out the lower attendance numbers from July 2018, and asked if there was a specific reason for the lower attendance. Ms. Belser said there had not been a specific cause identified, but that camping numbers had actually increased from 2018.

5. <u>Discussion of Recreation Administrative Overhead.</u>

Review and comments were made on the memorandum provided by the Mike Flood, General Manager that was included in the agenda packet, as to the list of services the District provides Recreation, and the list of services Recreation provides that are not related to the Recreation Area. The General Manager stated that cost estimates will be brought to the Recreation Committee in a near future meeting, October or November. Park Ranger open space patrol on North Santa Ana Road was discussed. North Santa Ana Road's public access status in regards to closure involving the County of Ventura, the Bureau of Reclamation, the property owners and the District was discussed. Mike Flood, General Manager stated he has spoken with County of Ventura officials recently on that topic, and Recreation staff have discussed the topic for several years with the Bureau of

Reclamation and the County of Ventura. It was reported by the Park Manager that the Bureau of Reclamation recently stated they are not interested in taking the lead in the closure, but said they are supportive of the efforts of the District and the County.

6. <u>Discussion regarding additional methods to increase revenue at Lake Casitas</u> Recreation Area such as special events.

The Committee discussed the Lake Casitas Event Area venue and the types of events that can be held there such as music events and weddings. Discussion included staff reporting on the possibility of a third party to organize music events. Director Spandrio asked if staff knew why the Topa Topa Folk Fest music festival that was approved by Committee in February 2019 was subsequently canceled by the event organizer. Division Officer Joe Evans said it was due to the revenue share the District requires and the insurance requirements. Director Brennan said that the Committee doesn't want to change the requirements. Park Manager Belser reported that commercial filming is welcomed, and the Recreation Area and the Bureau of Reclamation work together to turn around approved use authorizations. Enhancing the Recreation Area's exposure as a commercial filming location was suggested by Director Brennan, and he mentioned inclusion in the Ventura County Film Commission. Enhancing and adding: fishing tournaments, canoe events, bicycle events and disc golf tournaments were also discussed, as well as new amenities that may attract customers and bring in revenue such as a dog park. The Recreation Committee would consider future plans to enhance the Event Area to attract more events by adding additional facilities such as an amphitheater, kitchen and restrooms.

7. Review of Incidents and Comments.

Division Officer, Joe Evans addressed the Committee and reported the incident statistics for the month of August 2019. He also outlined several incidents including, a near drowning at the Casitas Water Adventure (lifeguards who responded will be recognized in a Board meeting in September), a verbal domestic, a dog bite, a statutory rape incident resulting in an arrest, and transport due to chest pains. Division Officer Joe Evans reported that the summer went very smoothly from an enforcement vantage point.

9. The meeting was adjourned at 1125 hours.

Operations, Boating, Incidents



Customers attended several free programs, including our Junior Ranger program, movie at the Casitas Water Adventure, a Park Ranger campfire program and Park Ranger tailgates (pop up activities presented by Park Rangers, shown in photo).

There were 243 recreational vessels tagged for re-entry into Lake Casitas, 16 passed new invasive mussel inspections, and 4 failed first inspection. In July, there were 150 patrol observations where park staff made customer contact. Park Rangers responded to 77 calls for service and 70 customer service issues. There were 5 medical responses and 3 required transport, 31 disturbances with 2 requiring support from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office. There were 16 unattended fires, 17 traffic violations with 1 resulting

in a citation, 21 parking violations, 0 restricted area violations, 8 boating violations, 1 fishing violations, 0 restricted area violations, and 3 leash law violations. There were 8 body contact with water.

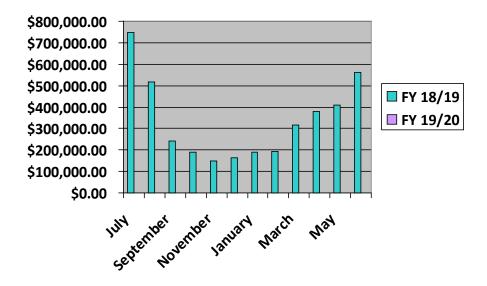
