A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CASITAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTIRCT PROCLAIMING A LOCAL EMERGENCY PERSISTS, RE-RATIFYING THE PROCLAMATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY BY EXECUTIVE ORDER, AND RE-AUTHORIZING REMOTE TELECONFERENCE MEETINGS OF THE LEGISLATIVE BODIES OF CASITAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT FOR THE PERIOD SEPTEMBER 14, 2022 to October 14, 2022 PURSUANT TO BROWN ACT PROVISIONS.

WHEREAS, the Casitas Municipal Water District is committed to preserving and nurturing public access and participation in meetings of the Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, all meetings of Casitas Municipal Water District's legislative bodies are open and public, as required by the Ralph M. Brown Act (Cal. Gov. Code 54950 – 54963), so that any member of the public may attend, participate, and watch the District's legislative bodies conduct their business; and

WHEREAS, the Brown Act, Government Code section 54953(e), makes provision for remote teleconferencing participation in meetings by members of a legislative body, without compliance with the requirements of Government Code section 54953(b)(3), subject to the existence of certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, a required condition is that a state of emergency is declared by the Governor pursuant to Government Code section 8625, proclaiming the existence of conditions of disaster or of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the state caused by conditions as described in Government Code section 8558; and

WHEREAS, a proclamation is made when there is an actual incident, threat of disaster, or extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the jurisdictions that are within the District's boundaries, caused by natural, technological or human-caused disasters; and

WHEREAS, it is further required that state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing, or, the legislative body meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health and safety of attendees; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors previously adopted a Resolution, Number 2021-23 on October 13, 2021, Resolution Number 2021-24 on November 10, 2021, Resolution Number 2021-26 on December 8, 2021, Resolution Number 2021-29 ON December 15, 2021, Resolution 2022-01 on January 12, 2022, Resolution Number 2022-05 on February 9, 2022, Resolution Number 2022-07 on March 9, 2022 and Resolution 2022-09 on March 23, 2022, Resolution 2022-11 on April 13, 2022, Resolution 2022-13 on May 11, 2022, Resolution 2022-16 on June 8, 2022, Resolution 2022-18 on June 22, 2022, Resolution 2022-25 on July 13, 2022, and Resolution 2022-27 on August 10, 2022 finding that the requisite conditions exist for the legislative bodies of Casitas Municipal Water District to conduct remote teleconference meetings without compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of section 54953; and

WHEREAS, as a condition of extending the use of the provisions found in section 54953(e), the Board of Directors must reconsider the circumstances of the state of emergency that exists in the District, and the Board of Directors has done so; and

WHEREAS, emergency conditions persist in the District, specifically, a state of emergency remains active; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors does hereby find that State of Emergency, and Social Distancing requirements and conditions causing imminent risk to attendees has caused, and will continue to cause, conditions of peril to the safety of persons within the District that are likely to be beyond the control of services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the District, and desires to affirm a local emergency exists and re-ratify the proclamation of state of emergency by the Governor of the State of California and local orders for social distancing; and

WHEREAS, as a consequence of the local emergency persisting, the Board of Directors does hereby find that the legislative bodies of Casitas Municipal Water District shall continue to conduct their meetings without compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Government Code section 54953, as authorized by subdivision (e) of section 54953, and that such legislative bodies shall continue to comply with the requirements to provide the public with access to the meetings as prescribed in paragraph (2) of subdivision (e) of section 54953; and

WHEREAS, Casitas Municipal Water District has taken measures to ensure meeting access for the public via the Zoom platform including electronic video and telephone access.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF CASITAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. <u>Recitals</u>. The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Resolution by this reference.

Section 2. <u>Affirmation that Local Emergency Persists</u>. The Board of Directors hereby considers the conditions of the state of emergency in the District and proclaims that a local emergency persists throughout the District, and meeting in person would present imminent risk.

Section 3. <u>Re-ratification of Governor's Proclamation of a State of Emergency</u>. The Board hereby ratifies the Governor of the State of California's Proclamation of State of Emergency, effective as of its issuance date of March 4, 2020.

Section 4. Remote Teleconference Meetings. The Staff, General Manager and legislative bodies of Casitas Municipal Water District are hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution including, continuing to conduct open and public meetings in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e) and other applicable provisions of the Brown Act.

Section 5. <u>Effective Date of Resolution</u>. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and shall be effective until the earlier of (i) October 14, 2022, or such time the Board of Directors adopts a subsequent resolution in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e)(3) to extend the time during which the legislative bodies of Casitas Municipal Water District may continue to teleconference without compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of section 54953.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

The Board receive an update on the water supply and demand status, continuing conservation efforts, and consider a Stage 4 declaration.

### **DISCUSSION:**

### Background

Casitas treats and delivers water supply from Lake Casitas as well as from groundwater supplies in the Ojai Valley. Casitas' wholesale customers include the City of Ventura and several special districts and mutual water companies. Retail customers include the communities of Upper Ojai, Ojai, Oak View, and coastal areas of eastern Ventura County. The Ojai Water System was acquired in 2017, which is supplied primarily by Ojai Basin groundwater, with backup supply from Lake Casitas.

Lake Casitas is a multi-year reservoir designed to sustain extended drought periods, and supplies are managed according with the District's Water Efficiency and Allocation Program (WEAP). The WEAP outlines 5 stages of drought management actions to increase conservation as Lake Casitas storage levels decline.

Due to severe drought conditions and lowering lake levels, the Board declared a Stage 3 Drought Condition on April 27, 2016 which remains in place. The Stage 3 drought condition reflects a 30 percent water conservation target (compared with pre-drought demands).

As of September 7, 2022, Lake Casitas storage levels reached 74,367 acre-feet (31.2% of capacity). According with the WEAP, the Board should review demand reduction policies and consider a Stage 4 declaration.

Even with the extended drought and current lake level, Casitas has sufficient water supply for the next several years. The District continues to manage existing local resources and has several projects underway to address future water security.

### Water Demands and Conservation Efforts

Recent demands on Lake Casitas (as of the 12-month period ending in June 2022) have been approximately 11,300 acre-feet per year (AFY), compared with approximately 20,000 in 2014 (pre-drought) and approximately 24,000 AFY in 1989. Table 1 summarizes the water supplied from Lake Casitas over the last 9 years.

Under the WEAP, as Lake Casitas levels decline, customer allocations are reduced according to mandatory water use reductions associated with each declared water shortage stage. Table 2 shows the recommended stages based on Lake Casitas storage levels as well as the demand reduction targets.

Water use from Lake Casitas is currently between Stage 4 and 5 levels, which means customers are collectively going beyond the conservation targets for Stage 3. The decline in water demands is attributed to long-term ongoing conservation programs and extraordinary conservation periods during drought periods.

While customers have collectively exceeded conservation goals, there are several customers that have exceeded allocations on an individual basis. Casitas staff in the Water Conservation Program are available to assist customers with evaluating water usage and allocations.

# Water Supply Status

A summary of the Casitas' water supply status is provided in Table 3. The supply production represents the supply provided to serve Casitas MWD customers.

## Water Supply Outlook




FIGURE 1. HYPOTHETICAL DECLINE IN LAKE CASITAS STORAGE WITH NO RAINFALL OR RUNOFF; DRY YEAR EVAPORATION RATES; AND STARTING STORAGE OF 74,000

Water supply projections show that the District's current water demands can be met through the next 3-4 years, using a combination of water from Lake Casitas and groundwater (Figure 1). This is based on a conservative assumption of no significant inflow to Lake Casitas, recent demand trends, and dry-year evaporation rates of approximately 6,000 AFY.

### Recommendation

The Board of Directors may, at their sole discretion, declare that a Stage condition of water supply in Lake Casitas exists and implement the appropriate demand reduction goals and measures in response to current and/or predicted water availability conditions.

Staff recommends the following be considered under a Stage 4 declaration, with an effective date of January 1, 2023:

- Reduce allocations by 10 percent (40% mandatory)
- \$5/HCF conservation penalty
- 10 AFY allocation limit for growth

Alternatively, the Board could decide to postpone reductions in allocations given Stage 4 demand targets are already being achieved by customers collectively as a group. The WEAP is a demand management tool, and the Board could decide to take additional action in the event Stage 4 demand targets are not being met under current measures.

Based on Board direction, staff will return with a resolution for the Stage 4 declaration.

### RECOMMENDATION:

The Board of Directors adopt a resolution declaring a temporary ban on the irrigation of non-functional turf for CII (Commercial, Industrial & Institutional) classifications in accordance with SWRCB emergency water conservation regulations.

# **BACKGROUND:**

The State of California has been experiencing extremely dry conditions and a drought condition has been declared in all counties. The State Water Project (SWP) provides water supply to 23 million people and 750,000 acres of agricultural lands, and reservoir levels are currently low. While Casitas does not rely on imported water from the SWP, many areas in Southern California rely on the SWP for most of its water supply.

In response to low water supply and in an effort to reduce water demand, the Governor of California signed Executive Order N-7-22 on March 28, 2022 directing the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) to adopt emergency regulations defining "non-functional turf" and banning irrigation of non-functional turf in the commercial, industrial and institutional (CII) sectors except as it may be required to ensure the health of trees and other perennial non-turf plantings.

According to the SWRCB regulation adopted on May 24, 2022 and effective June 10, 2022 (Attachment 1), non-functional turf is defined as "turf that is solely ornamental and not regularly used for human recreational purposes or for civic or community events."

Under the State's regulation, the ban on watering of non-functional turf at commercial, industrial and institutional properties includes areas like the grass in front of or next to large commercial buildings and common areas managed by homeowners' associations. The ban

does <u>not</u> include watering grass used for human recreation or other community activities, watering residential grass, or watering to ensure the health of trees.

The SWRCB expects water suppliers to communicate the emergency regulations to their customers and is authorizing local water suppliers to enforce the regulation.

# **DISCUSSION:**

While Casitas does not rely on imported water from the SWP, the Ventura River watershed has experienced extended local drought conditions over the last 10 years. Given the need for local and Statewide conservation, staff recommends consistency with State conservation regulations to the maximum extent practicable.

The attached resolution (Attachment 2) is proposed for adoption by the Board of Directors with a termination date of June 10, 2023, unless further action is taken by the SWRCB to extend or terminate the State's emergency regulation.

The new regulation declaring a temporary ban on all CII non-functional turf irrigation would be enforced by Casitas through the same process as the current water waste prohibitions adopted by the Board of Directors on January 26, 2022 (Ordinance No. 2022-01 provided as Attachment 3).

Casitas currently has about 387 commercial, 14 industrial, and 86 other accounts that could be subject to the new regulations. In Fiscal Year 2022, approximately 126 accounts exceeded their allocations, although the customer class stayed within their allocations collectively as a group. Based on aerial survey information obtained from Google Earth, staff has estimated that about 101 of the commercial accounts have turf and the customer will be responsible for providing information regarding exemption criteria such as recreation activities and watering of trees.

# STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 2022-0018

# TO ADOPT AN EMERGENCY REGULATION TO REDUCE WATER DEMAND AND IMPROVE WATER CONSERVATION

### WHEREAS:

- 1. On April 21, May 10, July 8, and October 19, 2021, Governor Newsom issued proclamations that a state of emergency exists statewide due to severe drought conditions and directed state agencies to take immediate action to preserve critical water supplies and mitigate the effects of drought and ensure the protection of health, safety, and the environment.
- 2. These proclamations urge Californians to reduce their water use.
- 3. On March 28, 2022, Governor Newsom signed an Executive Order directing the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board or Board) to consider adopting emergency regulations to increase water conservation. The Executive Order includes a request that the Board require urban water suppliers to implement Level 2 of their water shortage contingency plans, establish water shortage response actions for urban water suppliers that have not submitted water shortage contingency plans, taking into consideration model actions that the Department of Water Resources, and establish a ban on the irrigation of non-functional turf by entities in the commercial, industrial, and institutional sectors.
- 4. Many Californians and urban water suppliers have taken bold steps over the years to reduce water use; nevertheless, the severity of the current drought requires additional conservation actions from urban water suppliers, residents, and the commercial, industrial, and institutional sectors.
- 5. Water conservation is the easiest, most efficient, and most cost-effective way to quickly reduce water demand and extend limited water supplies through this summer and into the next year, providing flexibility for all California communities. Water saved is water available next year, giving water suppliers added flexibility to manage their systems effectively over time. The more water that is conserved now, the less likely it is that a community will experience dire shortages that may require water rationing or other emergency actions.
- 6. Most Californians use more water outdoors than indoors. In many areas, 50 percent or more of daily water use is for irrigation of lawns and outdoor landscaping irrigation. Outdoor water use is generally discretionary, and many irrigated landscapes would not suffer greatly from receiving a decreased amount of water.

- 7. The use of potable water to irrigate turf on commercial, industrial, or institutional properties that is not regularly used for human recreational purposes or for civic or community events can be reduced in commercial, industrial, and institutional areas to protect local water resources and enhance water resiliency.
- 8. Public information and awareness are critical to achieving conservation goals, and the Save Our Water campaign (<u>SaveOurWater.com</u>), run jointly by the Department of Water Resources (DWR) and the Association of California Water Agencies, is an excellent resource for conservation information and messaging that is integral to effective drought response.
- 9. <u>SaveWater.CA.Gov</u> is an online tool designed to help save water in communities. This website lets anyone easily report water waste from their phone, tablet, or computer by simply selecting the type of water waste they see, typing in the address where the waste is occurring, and clicking send. These reports are filed directly with the State Water Board and relevant local water supplier.
- 10. Enforcement against water waste is a key tool in conservation programs. When conservation becomes a social norm in a community, the need for enforcement is reduced or eliminated.
- 11. On March 28, 2022, the Governor suspended the environmental review required by the California Environmental Quality Act to allow State Water Board-adopted drought conservation emergency regulations and other actions to take place quickly to respond to emergency conditions.
- 12. Water Code section 1058.5 grants the State Water Board the authority to adopt emergency regulations in certain drought years in order to: "prevent the waste, unreasonable use, unreasonable method of use, or unreasonable method of diversion, of water, to promote water recycling or water conservation, to require curtailment of diversions when water is not available under the diverter's priority of right, or in furtherance of any of the foregoing, to require reporting of diversion or use or the preparation of monitoring reports."
- 13. On May 13, 2022, the State Water Board issued public notice that it will consider the adoption of the regulation at the Board's regularly scheduled May 24, 2022 public meeting, in accordance with applicable State laws and regulations. The State Water Board also distributed for public review and comment a Finding of Emergency that complies with State laws and regulations.
- 14. The emergency regulation exempts suppliers from enforcing connection moratoria, if their Level 2 demand management actions call for them, because new residential connections are critical to addressing the state's housing supply shortage. However, the Board recognizes connections for other projects may not be appropriate given the shortage conditions and urges water suppliers to carefully evaluate new development projects for their water use impacts.

- 15. Disadvantaged communities may require assistance responding to Level 2 conservation requirements, including irrigation restrictions, temporary changes to rate structures, and prohibited water uses. State shortage contingency plans aimed at increasing water conservation, and state and local agencies should look for opportunities to provide assistance in promoting water conservation. This assistance should include but not be limited to translation of regulation text and dissemination of water conservation announcements into languages spoken by at least 10 percent of the people who reside in a water supplier's service area, such as in newspaper advertisements, bill inserts, website homepage, social media, and notices in public libraries.
- 16. The Board directs staff to consider the following in pursuing any enforcement of section 996, subdivision (e): before imposing monetary penalties, staff shall provide one or more warnings; monetary penalties must be based on an ability to pay determination, consider allowing a payment plan of at least 12 months, and shall not result in a tax lien; and Board enforcement shall not result in shutoff.
- 17. The Board encourages entities other than Board staff that consider any enforcement of this regulation to apply these same factors identified in resolved paragraph 16. Nothing in the regulation or in the enforcement provisions of the regulation precludes a local agency from exercising its authority to adopt more stringent conservation measures. Moreover, the Water Code does not impose a mandatory penalty for violations of the regulation adopted by this resolution, and local agencies retain their enforcement discretion in enforcing the regulation, to the extent authorized, and may develop their own progressive enforcement practices to encourage conservation.

### THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The State Water Board adopts California Code of Regulations, title 23, section 996, as appended to this resolution as an emergency regulation that applies to urban water suppliers, as defined by Water Code section 10617.
- 2. State Water Board staff shall submit the regulation to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) for final approval.
- 3. If, during the approval process, State Water Board staff, the State Water Board, or OAL determines that minor corrections to the language of the regulation or supporting documentation are needed for clarity or consistency, the State Water Board Executive Director or designee may make such changes.

- 4. This regulation shall remain in effect for one year after filing with the Secretary of State unless the State Water Board determines that it is no longer necessary due to changed conditions or unless the State Water Board renews the regulation due to continued drought conditions, as described in Water Code section 1058.5.
- 5. The State Water Board directs State Water Board staff to work with the Department of Water Resources and the Save Our Water campaign to disseminate information regarding the emergency regulation.
- 6. The State Water Board directs staff to, by January 1, 2023, survey urban water suppliers on their experience protecting trees and tree cover during drought, with attention to disadvantaged communities. The survey shall inquire about challenges encountered, strategies used, costs, and successes in protecting trees.
- 7. Nothing in the regulation or in the enforcement provisions of the regulation precludes a local agency from exercising its authority to adopt more stringent conservation measures. Local agencies are encouraged to develop their own progressive enforcement practices to promote conservation.

Version: May 24, 2022

Title 23. Waters

Division 3. State Water Resources Control Board and Regional Water Quality Control Boards

**Chapter 3.5. Urban Water Use Efficiency and Conservation** 

**Article 2. Prevention of Drought Wasteful Water Uses** 

### § 996. Urban Drought Response Actions

- (a) As used in this section:
  - (1) "Commercial, industrial and institutional" refers to commercial water users, industrial water users, and institutional water users as respectively defined in Water Code, section 10608.12, subdivisions (e), (i), and (j), and includes homeowners' associations, common interest developments, community service organizations, and other similar entities but does not include the residences of these entities' members or separate interests.
  - (2) "Common interest development" has the same meaning as in section 4100 of the Civil Code.
  - (3) "Community service organization or similar entity" has the same meaning as in section 4110 of the Civil Code.
  - (4) "Homeowners' association" means an "association" as defined in section 4080 of the Civil Code.
  - (5) "Non-functional turf" means turf that is solely ornamental and not regularly used for human recreational purposes or for civic or community events. Non-functional turf does not include sports fields and turf that is regularly used for human recreational purposes or for civic or community events.
  - (6) "Plant factor" has the same meaning as in section 491.
  - (7) "Separate interest" has the same meaning as in section 4185 of the Civil Code.
  - (8) "Turf" has the same meaning as in section 491.
  - (9) "Urban water supplier" has the same meaning as Water Code section 10617.
  - (10) "Water shortage contingency plan" means the plan required by Water Code section 10632.
- (b) Each urban water supplier shall submit to the Department of Water Resources a preliminary annual water supply and demand assessment consistent with section

- 10632.1 of the Water Code no later than June 1, 2022, and submit a final annual water supply and demand assessment to the Department of Water Resources no later than the deadline set by section 10632.1 of the Water Code.
- (c) (1) Each urban water supplier that has submitted a water shortage contingency plan to the Department of Water Resources shall implement by June 10, 2022, at a minimum, all demand reduction actions identified in the supplier's water shortage contingency plan adopted under Water Code 10632 for a shortage level of ten (10) to twenty (20) percent (Level 2).
  - (2) Notwithstanding subdivision (c)(1), urban water suppliers shall not be required to implement new residential connection moratoria pursuant to this section.
  - (3) Notwithstanding subdivision (c)(1), an urban water supplier may implement the actions identified in subdivision (d) in lieu of implementing the demand reduction actions identified in the supplier's water shortage contingency plan adopted under Water Code section 10632 for a shortage level of ten (10) to twenty (20) percent (Level 2), provided the supplier meets all of the following:
  - (i) The supplier's annual water supply and demand assessment submitted to the Department of Water Resources demonstrates an ability to maintain reliable supply until September 30, 2023.
  - (ii) The supplier does not rely on, for any part of its supply, the Colorado River, State Water Project, or Central Valley Project, and no more than ten (10) percent of its supply comes from critically overdrafted groundwater basins as designated by the Department of Water Resources.
  - (iii) The supplier's average number of gallons of water used per person per day by residential customers for the year 2020 is below 55 gallons, as reported to the Board in the Electronic Annual Report.
- Each urban water supplier that has not submitted a water shortage contingency plan to the Department of Water Resources shall, by June 10, 2022, and continuing until the supplier has implemented all demand reduction actions identified in the supplier's water shortage contingency plan adopted under Water Code 10632 for a shortage level of ten (10) to twenty (20) percent (Level 2), implement at a minimum the following actions:
  - (1) Initiate a public information and outreach campaign for water conservation and promptly and effectively reach the supplier's customers, using efforts such as email, paper mail, bill inserts, customer app notifications, news articles, websites, community events, radio and television, billboards, and social media.
  - (2) Implement and enforce a rule or ordinance limiting landscape irrigation with potable water to no more than two (2) days per week and prohibiting landscape irrigation with potable water between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.
  - (3) Implement and enforce a rule or ordinance banning, at a minimum, the water uses prohibited by section 995. Adoption of a rule or ordinance is not required if the supplier has authority to enforce, as infractions, the prohibitions in section 995 and takes enforcement against violations.

- (e) (1) To prevent the unreasonable use of water and to promote water conservation, the use of potable water is prohibited for the irrigation of non-functional turf at commercial, industrial, and institutional sites.
  - (2) Notwithstanding subdivision (e)(1), the use of water is not prohibited by this section to the extent necessary to ensure the health of trees and other perennial non-turf plantings or to the extent necessary to address an immediate health and safety need.
  - (3) Notwithstanding subdivision (e)(1), an urban water supplier may approve a request for continued irrigation of non-functional turf where the user certifies that the turf is a low water use plant with a plant factor of 0.3 or less, and demonstrates the actual use is less than 40% of reference evapotranspiration.
- (f) The taking of any action prohibited in subdivision (e) is an infraction punishable by a fine of up to five hundred dollars (\$500) for each day in which the violation occurs. The fine for the infraction is in addition to, and does not supersede or limit, any other remedies, civil or criminal.
- (g) A decision or order issued under this section by the Board, or an officer or employee of the Board, is subject to reconsideration under article 2 (commencing with section 1122) of chapter 4 of part 1 of division 2 of the Water Code.

# RESOLUTION DECLARING A BAN ON IRRIGATION OF NON-FUNCTIONAL TURF FOR ALL COMMERCIAL, INDUSTRIAL & INSTITUTIONAL CUSTOMERS

WHEREAS, on April 26, 2016 the Board of Directors of the Casitas Municipal Water District (Casitas) adopted Resolution 16-09 declaring that a Stage 3 water supply condition at Lake Casitas, and

WHEREAS, Casitas is currently enforcing water waste prohibitions under Ordinance 2022-01 adopted on January 26, 2022 by the Casitas Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, on April 21, May 10, July 8, and October 19, 2021, Governor Newsom issued proclamations that a state of emergency exists statewide due to severe drought conditions and directed state agencies to take immediate action to preserve critical water supplies and mitigate the effects of drought and ensure the protection of health, safety, and the environment; and

WHEREAS, on March 28, 2022, Governor Newsom signed an Executive Order directing the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) to consider adopting emergency regulations to increase water conservation. The Executive Order includes a request that the SWRCB require urban water suppliers to implement Level 2 of their water shortage contingency plans, and establish a ban on the irrigation of non-functional turf by entities in the commercial, industrial, and institutional sectors; and

WHEREAS, on May 24, 2022, the SWRCB adopted Resolution No. 2022-0018 as an emergency water regulation amending California Code of Regulations, Title 23, Section 996, and the Office of Administrative Law gave it final approval on June 10, 2022; and

WHEREAS, SWRCB expects water suppliers to communicate the emergency regulations to their customers and the SWRCB is authorizing local water supplies to enforce the regulation; and

WHEREAS, Article X, Section 2 of the California Constitution and Section 100 of the California Water Code declare that the general welfare requires water resources be put to beneficial use, therefore, waste or unreasonable use or unreasonable method of use of water be prevented, and conservation of water be fully exercised with a view to the reasonable and beneficial use thereof; and

WHEREAS, Casitas has the power to perform all acts necessary to fully carry out the provisions this resolution consistent with Section 71640 and Sections 10608 through 10656 of the California Water Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Casitas Municipal Water District as follows:

- 1) The District has made a finding that the Governor of California has declared an emergency exists caused by drought, or other threatened or existing water shortage.
- 2) All terms and water use prohibitions herein shall be consistent with definitions under California Code of Regulations, Title 23, Sections 491 and 996.
- 3) To prevent the unreasonable use of water and to promote water conservation, the use of potable water is prohibited for the irrigation of non-functional turf at commercial, industrial, and institutional sites. The following exceptions apply:
  - a. The use of water is not prohibited necessary to ensure the health of trees and other perennial non-turf plantings or to the extent necessary to address an immediate health and safety need.
  - b. A request for continued irrigation of non-functional turf may be approved where the turf is a low water use plant with plant factor of 0.3 or less, and actual use is less than 40% of reference evapotranspiration.
- 4) Enforcement of violations, penalties and appeals relating to Section 2 shall be consistent with existing Ordinance 2022-01 adopted by the Casitas Board of Directors on January 26, 2022 establishing water waste prohibitions.
- 5) The Casitas Board of Directors hereby directs staff to:
  - a. Communicate the emergency water conservation regulation of a ban on all non-functional turf to all Commercial, Industrial and Institutional account customers.
  - b. Continue to offer water conservation programs and support to all Casitas customers, including on-site assessments for water leaks and feedback on increasing water use efficiency.
- 6) This resolution shall remain in effect until June 10, 2023 unless the SWRCB determines that it is no longer necessary due to changed conditions or unless the SWRCB renews the regulation due to continued drought conditions.

### ORDINANCE NO. 2022-01

# AN ORDINANCE OF THE CASITAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT ESTABLISHING WATER WASTE PROHIBITIONS

THIS ORDINANCE is adopted in light of the following facts and circumstances, which are hereby found and declared by the Casitas Municipal Water District (Casitas) Board of Directors:

WHEREAS, Article X, Section 2 of the California Constitution and Section 100 of the California Water Code declare that the general welfare requires water resources be put to beneficial use, therefore, waste or unreasonable use or unreasonable method of use of water be prevented, and conservation of water be fully exercised with a view to the reasonable and beneficial use thereof.

WHEREAS, the adoption and enforcement of this Ordinance is necessary to help manage Casitas' potable water supply and to avoid or minimize the effects of drought within the Casitas service area.

WHEREAS, Casitas has the power to perform all acts necessary to fully carry out the provisions of this Ordinance consistent with Section 71640 and Sections 10608 through 10656 of the California Water Code.

WHEREAS, this Ordinance rescinds and replaces Casitas Municipal Water District Ordinance No. 15-02, Ordinance Establishing Water Waste Prohibitions.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Directors of the Casitas Municipal Water District as follows:

### 1. TITLE.

This Ordinance shall be known as the Casitas MWD Water Waste Prohibition Ordinance.

### 2. APPLICABILITY.

The provisions of this Ordinance shall apply to all persons, corporations, public or private entities, governmental agencies or institutions, or any other direct water customers of the Casitas Municipal Water District. The water customers of other water purveyors shall be governed by the prohibitions that are adopted by the other water purveyors.

### 3. PROHIBITED USES.

- A. The following uses of water are permanently prohibited and are in effect year round:
  - a. **General Waste:** Indiscriminate running of water or washing with water which is wasteful and without reason or purpose.
  - b. **Washing of Exterior Surfaces:** The washing of hard or paved surfaces, including but not limited to sidewalks, walkways, driveways, parking areas, tennis courts, patios or alleys, except when necessary to alleviate safety or sanitary hazards or when broom or other waterless device will not suffice. If necessary, washing may only be done with a bucket or similar container, a hose equipped with a positive shut-off

- nozzle, a pressure washer, a low-volume high pressure water efficient water broom, or a cleaning machine equipped to recycle the water used.
- c. Cleaning of Structures and Vehicles: The washing of building exteriors, mobile homes, cars, boats or recreational vehicles without the use of a positive shut-off nozzle on either the hose or pressure washer.
- d. Watering/Irrigation Runoff Control: The watering of grass, lawn, groundcover, shrubbery, open ground, crops and trees, including agricultural irrigation, in a manner or to an extent which allows water to run off the area being watered. Every water user is deemed to have under their control, at all times, their water distribution lines and facilities, and to know the manner and extent of their water use and run off.
- e. **Limits on Watering Hours:** The watering or irrigating of outdoor ornamental landscapes and turf areas between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Pacific Standard Time on any day. (Does not apply to irrigation systems that use drip-irrigation and weather-based controllers or stream rotor sprinklers that meet a 70% efficiency standard. Exceptions may be authorized by the General Manager where there is no ability to not water between 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.).
- f. Watering During and within 48 hours after Measureable Rainfall: The watering of grass, lawn, groundcover, shrubbery, open ground, crops and trees, including agricultural irrigation, at any time during and within 48 hours after measureable rainfall of at least one fourth of one inch of rain. In determining whether measureable rainfall of at least one fourth of an inch of rain occurred in a given area, enforcement may be based on records of the National Weather Service, the closest CIMIS station to the parcel, or any other reliable source of rainfall data available to CMWD.
- g. **Drought Restrictions:** Watering/irrigating during publicly declared curtailment period in a manner that is not compliant with drought restrictions.
- h. **Plumbing Leaks:** The escape of water through leaks, breaks, or malfunctions within the water user's plumbing or distribution system, for a substantial period of time within which such break or leak should reasonably have been discovered and corrected.
- i. Fountains and Decorative Water Features: The operation of any ornamental fountain using water from the District's domestic water system unless water for such use is re-circulated.
- j. **Cooling:** The use of water in mechanical equipment purchased and installed after the adoption of this Ordinance that utilizes a single pass cooling system. Water used for all cooling purposes shall be re-circulated.
- k. Drinking Water Served Upon Request Only: Eating and drinking establishments, including but not limited to restaurants, hotels, cafes, cafeterias, bars, clubs or other public places where food or drinks are sold or served, are prohibited from providing drinking water to customers unless expressly requested. Affected establishments must prominently display notice informing their customers of this requirement using clear and easily understood language.
- l. **Restaurant Non-water Conserving Dish Wash Spray Valves**: Food preparation establishments, such as restaurants or cafes, are prohibited from using non-water conserving dish wash spray valves.
- m. Providing Option to Not Launder Linen and Towels Daily: Hotels, motels, vacation rentals and other commercial lodging establishments must provide customers the option of not having towels and linen laundered daily. Commercial

- lodging establishments must prominently display notice of this option in each bathroom using clear and easily understood language.
- n. **Commercial Car Wash Systems:** Installation of non-recirculating water systems is prohibited in new or renovations of commercial conveyor car washes systems.
- o. **Turf Irrigation Restrictions:** Irrigating turf or ornamental landscapes during and within 48 hours following measurable precipitation of at least one fourth of one inch of rain.
- p. **Public Street Medians:** The use of potable water for irrigation of ornamental turf on public street medians.
- q. **Street Cleaning & Construction Sites**: The use of potable water for street cleaning or construction site preparation purposes, unless no other method can be used or as needed to protect the health and safety of the public.
- r. **Homeowners Association or Community Service Organization**: To prevent the unreasonable use of water and to promote water conservation, any homeowners' association or community service organization or similar entity is prohibited from:
  - i. Taking or threatening to take any action to enforce any provision of the governing documents or architectural or landscaping guidelines or policies of a common interest development where that provision is void or unenforceable under section 4735, subdivisions (a) and (b) of the Civil Code;
  - ii. Imposing or threatening to impose a fine, assessment, or other monetary penalty against any owner of a separate interest for reducing or eliminating the watering of vegetation or lawns during a declared drought emergency, as described in section 4735, subdivision (c) of the Civil Code; or
  - iii. Requiring an owner of a separate interest upon which water-efficient landscaping measures have been installed in response to a declared drought emergency, as described in section 4735, subdivisions (c) and (d) of the Civil Code, to reverse or remove the water-efficient landscaping measures upon the conclusion of the state of emergency.

### 4. EXEMPTED WATER USES.

- A. All water use associated with the operation and maintenance of fire suppression equipment or employed by the District for water quality flushing and sanitation purposes shall be exempt from the provisions of this Ordinance.
- B. Use of water supplied by gray water or rainwater collection system is also exempt; however, use of water from these systems is not exempt from the applicable regulations of the State and local jurisdictions governing the use of such water.
- C. Supervised testing, adjusting, or repairing of irrigation systems is allowed any time for no more than five (5) minutes per station.

# 5. VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES.

- A. Any person, who uses, causes to be used, or permits the use of water in violation of this Ordinance is guilty of an offense punishable as provided herein.
- B. **Enforcement of Violation**. Complaints of water waste will be investigated and enforced by the District in the form of a notice of violation. The following officers and employees of the Casitas Municipal Water district are hereby designated and authorized to issue citations for enforcement of this Ordinance:

Operations and Maintenance Manager

Public Affairs/Resource Manager Water Conservation Coordinator Utility Workers Water employees designated by the General Manager

- C. **Notice of Violation.** The notice to the District water customer of a violation of this Ordinance will be issued by either a telephone call, mail, hand-delivery, or posting at the entrance of the violator's premises. The District will issue a written notice that state the time, place, and general description of the violation or repeat of violation, as well as a time frame in which the violation must be corrected. District staff may use discretion when determining the correction time.
- D. Consequence of Violation. Administrative fines and water service actions may be levied and applied for each violation of a provision of this Ordinance as follows:
  - 1. **Penalties:** Penalties for failure to comply with any provision of the ordinance are as follows:
    - a. **First Violation:** The District will issue a written notice to the water customer and attach a copy of this Ordinance.
    - b. **Second Violation:** If the first violation is not corrected within the time frame specified by the District, or if a second violation occurs within the following twelve (12) months after the first violation notice, a second notice of violation will be issued and an administrative fine of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) shall be levied for the second violation of this Ordinance.
    - c. **Third Violation:** A third violation within the following twelve (12) months after the date of issuance of the second notice of violation is punishable by an administrative fine of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00).
    - d. **Fourth and Subsequent Violations:** Each day that a violation of this Ordinance occurs beyond the remedy allowance provided in the third notice of violation is a separate offense, subject to any or all of the following penalties:
      - 1. Water service may be turned off or flow may be restricted. Where water service is turned off or flow restricted, it shall be turned on or unrestricted upon correction of the violation and the payment of the reestablishment charges, staff time, and District material purchases per the District's Rates and Regulations for Water Service in effect at the time.
      - 2. A fine of not more than \$600 or imprisonment in the county jail for not more than 30 days, or both the fine and imprisonment, may be imposed upon conviction under Section 71644 of the California Water Code, or fines/ penalties as defined and allowable under Section 53069.4 of the Government Code may be imposed.
    - e. **Payment of Administrative Fines:** The water customer is responsible for the full payment of administrative fines. Each administrative fine shall be applied in the customer's regular water billing. Payment of the administrative fine will be the final responsibility of the individual named on the water account. Non-payment of fines will

be subject to the same remedies as non-payment of basic water rates, in accordance with the Casitas Rates and Regulations for Water Service.

- 3. **Appeal:** Any customer against whom a penalty is levied pursuant to this Ordinance shall have the right to appeal as follows:
  - a. The customer request for an appeal consideration must be in writing, legible, and received by the General Manager within ten (10) calendar days of the issuance of the notice of violation to the customer. Any determination not timely appealed shall be deemed final. The written request for appeal consideration shall include:
    - i. A description of the issue,
    - ii. Evidence supporting the appeal, and
    - iii. A request for resolution of the dispute.
  - b. The General Manager will review the material submitted and make an independent determination of the issue, which shall be mailed to the customer within fifteen (15) calendar days of receipt of the request for appeal.
  - c. The General Manager's determination may be appealed in writing within ten (10) calendar days of the mailing of the notice of determination. The appeal of the General Manager's determination shall be heard and considered by the Board of Directors at an upcoming regular meeting of the Board. Notice of the hearing shall be mailed to the customer at least ten (10) calendar days prior to the date of the appeal hearing. The Board may, in its discretion affirm, reverse, or modify the determination. The Board's determination is final.
- 6. **SEVERABILITY.** If any competent court shall find any portion of this Ordinance unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of any other portion thereof.
- 7. **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Ordinance becomes effective this 26<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2022.

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Approve the Memorandum of Understanding with Calleguas MWD as presented.

### **BACKGROUND:**

Casitas MWD (Casitas) and Calleguas MWD (Calleguas) were two of the partners involved in the completed preliminary design of the ongoing State Water Project Interconnect project.

As a result of this partnership, the General Managers and Staff of both Calleguas MWD and Casitas MWD have been discussing various water supply issues over the past few years.

Recently, Calleguas completed review of several on their proposed water supply projects wherein collaboration with Casitas is included in some of those projects.

Calleguas recently presented Casitas staff with a proposed MOU for consideration by staff and the Board of Directors.

### **DISCUSSION:**

The intention of this MOU is to recognize common water supply issues between the two agencies and open regular lines of communication between Casitas and Calleguas on these issues.

Neither agency is bound to any specific action as a result of this MOU however, MOUs such as this can assist in delivering future projects, especially in the area of the funding of these projects.

### **BUDGETARY IMPACT:**

No direct budgetary impact is anticipated as a result of the approval of this MOU.

# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR WATER RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT COLLABORATION BETWEEN CALLEGUAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT AND CASITAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is entered into as of \_\_\_\_\_\_\_, 2022 (the "Effective Date") by and between CALLEGUAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT ("CALLEGUAS") and CASITAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT ("CASITAS"). CALLEGUAS and CASITAS may each be referred to herein individually as "Party" and collectively as "Parties"

### **RECITALS**

## **AGENCY DESCRIPTIONS**

WHEREAS, CALLEGUAS is a Municipal Water District that provides wholesale potable water service to eastern Ventura County, including the cities of Camarillo, Moorpark, Oxnard, Port Hueneme, Simi Valley, and Thousand Oaks and surrounding unincorporated areas; and

**WHEREAS**, CASITAS is a Municipal Water District that provides wholesale and retail potable water service to western Ventura County, including the City of Ojai; the portion of the City of Ventura west of Mills Road; the beach communities of Solimar, La Conchita, and Rincon; and surrounding unincorporated areas.

# **SUPPLY**

WHEREAS, CALLEGUAS, as a Metropolitan Water District of Southern California ("Metropolitan") member agency, distributes imported water, primarily from the State Water Project ("SWP"), on a wholesale basis to its member purveyors; and

WHEREAS, CASITAS provides water from three sources: 1) Surface water stored in Lake Casitas from the surrounding watershed, including Coyote Creek and Santa Ana Creek; 2) Surface water from the Ventura River stored in Lake Casitas via Robles Diversion and Robles Canal; 3) Groundwater wells in the Ojai Valley Groundwater Basin and Upper Ventura River Basin.

# **CHALLENGES**

**WHEREAS,** imported water supplies are vulnerable to shortages due to drought, natural disasters such as earthquakes, and the long-term effects of climate change, as illustrated by 5% allocations from the SWP to SWP contractors for 2021 and 2022; and

**WHEREAS**, prolonged drought has resulted in storage in Lake Casitas being reduced to approximately 30% of its capacity and storage in the Ojai Valley Groundwater Basin being reduced to approximately 60% of its capacity.

## **OPPORTUNITIES**

WHEREAS, CALLEGUAS, CASITAS, United Water Conservation District ("UWCD"), and the City of Ventura ("Ventura") are planning to construct an interconnection between the CALLEGUAS and City of Ventura potable water systems that will enable CALLEGUAS to wheel CASITAS', UWCD's, and Ventura's SWP allocation to them and for Ventura to deliver water to CALLEGUAS under certain circumstances; and

**WHEREAS**, CALLEGUAS has prepared a Water Supply Alternatives Study that evaluates more than 100 potential projects to meet demands during imported water outages, many of which also offer benefits during drought or normal operation and could benefit from participation by regional partners such as CASITAS; and

**WHEREAS**, CASITAS has prepared a Draft Comprehensive Water Resources Plan that evaluates 40 potential projects to meet the needs of CASITAS customers, many of which could benefit from participation by regional partners such as CALLEGUAS; and

**WHEREAS**, this is not intended to be a complete list of all relevant documents, opportunities, or potential projects, and additional opportunities are anticipated to be identified in the future.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** in consideration of the mutual benefits and representations made herein, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

## **Section 1: Purposes and Goals**

- A. CALLEGUAS and CASITAS jointly desire to further their collaborative relationship to diversify their water supply portfolios; improve the reliability of water service to their respective customers; develop additional available water resources; minimize or eliminate the need for duplicative infrastructure investments; and reduce the overall cost of service to their respective ratepayers.
- B. The Parties desire to coordinate and share information concerning water resource management planning programs, projects, and other information; and desire to improve and maintain overall communication among themselves. It is anticipated that coordination and information sharing among the Parties will assist the agencies in achieving their respective goals in a cost-effective and environmentally responsive manner and contribute to the overall well-being of the region.
- C. The Parties also desire to express their willingness to enter into collaborative relationships with entities that are not initial signatories to this MOU. The Parties agree that such other entities, once identified and assented to by the original Parties, may be added as a Party to this MOU upon the execution of

an amendment hereto by those entities. Each amendment will identify the entity to be added, state the nature of that entity's current and future involvement in water resource planning, and affirm their intent to abide by the terms of this MOU. The Parties to this MOU agree that their signatories to this MOU, and or designees of same, are authorized to provide their assent to the addition of a new party without further action by their respective governing bodies.

**IN WITNESS WHEREOF**, the parties have executed this MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING by their duly authorized representatives as of the EFFECTIVE DATE.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

#### **BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:**

The current Memorandum of Understandings (MOUs) between the District and the Service Employees International Union Local 721 (SEIU) representing the General Unit, Recreation Unit and Supervisory and Professional Unit states Casitas will enroll into the State Disability Insurance elective coverage program.

Casitas employees belonging to the SEIU units were previously enrolled in the State Disability Insurance program. The program provides short-term Disability Insurance (DI) and Paid Family Leave (PFL) wage replacement benefits to eligible workers who need time off. The DI is designed to partially replace wages due to a non-work related disability. The PFL may be the used to care for a seriously ill family member or bond with a new child.

SEIU members voted to withdraw from the SDI program in 2006. Based on the current negotiated MOUs the members voted (letter attached) to begin the process of returning to the SDI program. The application and Resolution is included and requires at least one Board Member's signature.

Contributions are paid by the employee and may vary year to year. The 2022 contribution rate is 1.1 percent. The taxable wage limit is \$145,600 for each employee per calendar year.

Casitas must remain enrolled in the program for two full calendar years.

## **BUDGET IMPACT:**

There is no budget impact.

# **RECOMMENDATION:**

The District received notice from the County of Ventura of the 2022 Local Agency Biennial Review of the Conflict of Interest Code. It is recommended that the Board adopt a resolution adopting the District's Conflict of Interest Code.

# **BACKGROUND:**

All public agencies are required by the Political Reform Act to adopt a Conflict of Interest Code designating individuals who are subject to the annual filing requirements.

The County of Ventura is conducting a biennial review of the Conflict of Interest Codes for all agencies in the County and has requested that the District modify as necessary and readopt the Conflict of Interest Code. In reviewing the District's Conflict of Interest Code it was determined that the title of Administrative Manager/Treasurer needs to be changed to Chief Financial Officer/Treasurer on Exhibit B and the code be adopted via resolution.

#### RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE DISTRICT'S CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

The Political Reform Act, Government Code section 8100 et seq., requires local government agencies to adopt and promulgate Conflict of Interest Codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 CAL. Code Regs., §18730) which contains the terms of a standard Conflict of Interest Code, which may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act after public notice and hearing.

The terms of California Code of Regulations, Title 2, Section 18730, and any amendment to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, are hereby incorporated by reference as the Conflict of Interest Code for the Casitas Municipal Water District, and along with the attached Exhibit A, which designates positions requiring disclosure and Exhibit B, which sets forth disclosure categories for each designated position, constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of the Casitas Municipal Water District. Persons holding positions designated in Exhibit A shall file Form 700 Statements of Economic Interests with the Filing Officer specified for that position in Exhibit A.

IN PREPARING THE FORM 700, DESIGNATED FILERS NEED ONLY DISCLOSE THOSE FINANCIAL INTERESTS FALLING WITHIN THE DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES DESIGNATED FOR THAT FILER'S POSITION AS STATED IN EXHIBITS A AND B.

#### Category 1-BROADEST DISCLOSURE

See Form 700 Schedules A-1, A-2, B, C, D, and E

- 1. All sources of income, gifts, loans and travel payments;
- 2. All interests in real property; and
- 3. All investments and business positions in business entities.

## Category 2 - REAL PROPERTY

See Form 700 Schedule B

All *interests in real property*, including *interests in real property* held by *business entities* and trusts in which the public official holds a business position or has an investment or other financial interest.

## Category 3-LAND DEVELOPMENT, CONSTRUCTION AND TRANSACTION

See Form 700 Schedules A-1, A-2, C, D and E

All *investments, business positions* and sources of *income, gifts, loans* and *travel payments,* from sources which engage in land development, construction, or real property acquisition or sale.

#### Category 4-PROCUREMENT

See Form 700 Schedules A-1, A-2, C, D, and E

All *investments, business positions* and sources of *income, gifts, loans and travel payments,* from sources which provide services, supplies, materials, machinery or equipment which the designated position procures or assists in procuring on behalf of their agency or department.

# Category 5 - REGULATION AND PERMITTING

See Form 700 Schedules A-1, A-2, C, D, and E

All *investments, business positions* and sources of *income, gifts, loans* and *travel payments,* from sources which are subject to the regulatory, permitting or licensing authority of, or have an application or license pending before, the designated position's agency or department.

## Category 6-FUNDING

See Form 700 Schedules A-1, A-2, C, D, and E

All *investments, business positions* and sources of *income, gifts, loans* and *travel payments,* from sources which receive grants or other funding from or through the designated position's agency or department.

#### ADDENDUM DESIGNATING OFFICIALS WHO MANAGE PUBLIC INVESTMENTS

Pursuant to Government Code Section 87200 Et Seq., certain city and county officials, as well as all "other officials who manage public investment." are required to disclose their economic interests in accordance with the Political Reform Act. This Addendum provides the relevant definitions for determining which public officials quality as "other officials who manage public investments," designates the agency's positions which qualify as such, and states the Filing Officer for each designated position.

# **APPLICABLE DEFINITIONS**

As set forth in 2 California Code of Regulations section 18701, the following definitions apply for the purposes of Government Code Section 87200:

- (1) "Other public officials who manage public investment" means:
  - a. Members of boards and commissions, including pension and retirement boards or commissions, or of committees thereof, who exercise responsibility for the management of public investments;
  - b. High-level officers and employees of public agencies who exercise primary responsibility for the management of public investments, such as chief or principal investment officers or chief financial managers. This category shall not include officers and employees who work under the supervision of the chief or principal investment officers or the chief financial managers; and
  - c. Individuals who, pursuant to a contract with a state or local government agency, perform the same or substantially all the same functions that would otherwise be performed by the public officials described in subdivision (1) b above.
- (2) "Public investments" means the investment of public moneys in real estate, securities, or other economic interests for the production of revenue or other financial return.
- "Public moneys" means all moneys belonging to, received by, or held by, the state, or any city, county, town, district, or public agency therein, or by an officer thereof acting in his or her official capacity, and includes the proceeds of all bonds and other evidences of indebtedness, trust funds held by public pension and retirement system, deferred compensation funds held for investment by public agencies, and public moneys held by a financial institution under a trust indenture to which a public agency is a party.
- (4) "Management of public investment" means the following nonministerial functions: directing the investment of public moneys; formulating or approving investment policies; approving or establishing guidelines for asset allocations; or approving investment transactions.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Casitas received a verbal request for the consideration of a reduced entry fee for members of the Casitas Rowing Club.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

The Lake Casitas Recreation Area (LCRA) does not currently offer special discounts for any specific group, such veterans, seniors, or local residents.

Additionally, the LCRA do not offer discounts for any of the regular clubs at Lake Casitas such as the Coyote Disk Golfer's, the Ventura County Comets, and Cross Country Club. These clubs are not considered for-profit businesses and only require membership dues.

The Casitas Rowers are a non-profit club that conduct a business on Lake Casitas property and charge a monthly fee to participate. All club members, coaches, and board members do not currently receive a discounted entrance fee.

To help alleviate the cost of frequent visits to the LCRA, Casitas offers a Frequent Visitor Decal (FVD) that is available to everyone and allows entry into the park seven days a week during daylight hours. The current price for a FVD is \$150 for 12 months and many club members take advantage of this in order to gain entrance for club activities.

The \$150 FVD breaks down to a cost \$12.50 a month and can be used seven days a week.

As a comparison, the LCRA daily entrance fee is \$10 during the week and weekends during the off-season time (Oct to March), and \$10 during the week and \$20 on weekends during the onseason time (April to Sept).

Budgeted expenses at the LCRA are intended to be paid through user fees thus the LCRA depends on regular entry fees and FVDs as an important sources of revenue for its operations.

Casitas Municipal Water District (Casitas) appreciates the opportunity to provide data and comments regarding the candidate listing and status review of Southern California steelhead under the California Endangered Species Act (CESA). CDFW, in its Notice of Status Review (Notice) dated July 15, 2022, requested submission of "data or comments on the petitioned action, including Southern California steelhead ecology, genetics, life history, distribution, abundance, habitat, the degree and immediacy of threats to its reproduction or survival, the adequacy of existing management, or recommendations for management of the species." This letter, and attachments/appendices thereto, are hereby submitted in response to the Notice, and Casitas asked that these materials be considered by the Commission on any future action to list steelhead as endangered or threatened under CESA.

Casitas, as well as the United States Bureau of Reclamation (Bureau), have been active participants in the recovery of steelhead in the Ventura River since the federal listing in 1997, through the design, construction, and operation of a state-of-the-art fish passage facility and fish passage lifecycle monitoring station. Casitas has developed meaningful instream flows for steelhead in coordination with the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) and CDFW.

For consideration during the status review, Casitas is submitting a subset of its annual progress reports for the Robles Fish Passage Facility (Robles Facility), which are prepared as required under the Robles Facility's Biological Opinion issued by NMFS (Appendix A). Additional progress reports are available upon request. However, the attached are submitted because they include pertinent information demonstrating numerous *O. mykiss* life history features and responses to environmental conditions in the Ventura River Watershed that may not have been previously considered by the Commission in the Commission's process of listing steelhead as a candidate species. Notable information submitted herein includes:

- sandbar passage potential;
- in-channel passage conditions;
- natural surface water connections;

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- river discharges when adult steelhead have migrated upstream, seasonal and diel migration behavior;
- the successful reestablishment of adult steelhead to historic spawning and rearing habitat through passage at the Robles Fish Passage Facility;
- the cyclic nature of O. mykiss abundance and precipitation in the Ventura River Watershed, and
- distribution throughout the Ventura River Watershed.

In addition, Casitas is submitting a report, attached hereto as Appendix B, that was prepared for the Ventura River Steelhead/Rainbow Trout Spawning Survey which was funded, in part, though a CDFW grant. This report includes information and data that specifically focuses on *O. mykiss* spawn timing, distribution, habitat, and abundance which should be considered by the Commission as part of any future listing decision.

Casitas previously submitted several comment letters regarding concerns with the proposed listing of steelhead under CESA (during the Commission's consideration of whether listing "may be warranted"). These prior comments contain information responsive to the type of information sought by the Commission in the Notice and are accordingly submitted and included as Appendix C to this letter for consideration by the Commission in further listing proceedings. Letters attached hereto as Appendix C include:

- August 20, 2021, Casitas comment letter to CDFW outlining initial concerns regarding the CalTrout petition to list Southern California steelhead under CESA.
- December 9, 2021 Casitas comment letter to the Commission regarding the CDFW Petition Evaluation Report (CDFW Evaluation Report) that was made available to the public in November 2021. In this letter to the Commission, Casitas outlined concerns that the comments and issues raised by Casitas in its initial comment letter to CDFW were not addressed in the Evaluation Report—as by law, they should have been.
- April 7, 2022, Casitas comment letter to CDFW following Casitas' thorough review of the CDFW Evaluation Report and other presentation and comments regarding the CalTrout petition. The April 7, 2022 letter raised concerns regarding 1) insufficient data on resident *O. mykiss* population abundance and trends, 2) effects of drought on steelhead recovery, 3) the proper scope of the CESA incidental take provision during the candidacy period, 4) other State actions that are already supporting steelhead recovery outside of CESA.

The success of the Robles Fish Passage Facility has been a collaborative effort among USBR, NMFS and CDFW. The monitoring data provided herein demonstrates passage through the facility and the current federal recovery process can result in increases in the steelhead numbers, which are naturally cyclical depending on hydrologic conditions in the Ventura River Watershed.

Recovery actions are complex and take considerable time and funding to plan, design, permit, build, and study outcomes. It is Casitas' opinion and experience that adding an additional regulatory obligation under CESA will not help move projects forward in a reasonable manner but will more likely cause substantial delays. Casitas believes that there is no need to list this species under CESA, as the current Southern California steelhead recovery plan developed by NMFS (in consultation with CDFW and other

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key stakeholders) is already being implemented with CDFW working as a partner to NMFS. Maintaining this current collaborative process would avoid conflicts in conservation and recovery programs that might arise if an additional CESA listing were put into effect.

Casitas will continue to collaborate with local, state, and federal agencies in the effort towards steelhead recovery. We appreciate your review of this comment letter and appendices, and please feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns regarding the materials submitted herein.
