



Mascot Option 2: Engineer








Who is the Engineer?

The engineer is a Bob-the-builder type who knows what it takes to keep the taps flowing. This mascot is can-do and pragmatic, educating customers about what they can do to reduce their own water usage. The engineer uses their infrastructure expertise to help customers see the bigger picture beyond conservation, and how tapping into the state grid is an important next step for the community's water security.

Mascot Option 3: Casitas Avocado





Who is Casitas Avocado?

Casitas Avocado was raised on Lake Casitas water. Casitas' background gives them a strong sense of the interconnection between the Lake and the life it supports in Western Ventura County. They're generally a happy-go-lucky nature lover but with a serious and sober streak, and Casitas' concern for the future of Lake Casitas leads them to urge for conservation and proactive future planning.

Mascot Option 4: Creek the Coyote





Who is Creek the Coyote?

Creek the Coyote is a bit of a schemer and he wants to hog all the water he can. Cynical and sour, he doesn't buy this whole "global warming" thing, but his glass-half-empty disposition means he still thinks Casitas should explore every avenue it has for water conservation and supply diversification. Like Swiper from Dora the Explorer, or Loki from Norse mythology, Creek is a trickster figure who pops up when he's least expected to play pranks, swipe water-intensive landscaping and remind the community that things can always get worse tomorrow, so we better be prepared.
